Invitation for Bids (IFB) – 2014 Concession Services at County Owned and Operated Beaches Will Rogers (Chautauqua) Questions and Answers Released March 31, 2014

- 1. Q: Are mobile carts allowed in front of the concession building?
 - A: Authorized Activity is limited to the serving food and beverage from the concession building. Mobile carts are not permitted.
- 2. Q: Does the Licensee have to provide all three Authorized Activities?
 - A: Yes. Concession services must include sales and rentals of beach related recreational equipment, selling food and beverage from a concession building, and rentals of bikes and skates.
- 3. Q: Are there external storage for my bikes at this location? If not, can I provide one in the parking lot?
 - A: No external storage is provided or permitted. The parking lot cannot be used for any purpose by the concessionaire.
- 4. Q: In the Authorized Activities it states that sales and rentals of beach merchandise are allowed. Do boogie boards, paddles boards, and chairs fall under the beach merchandise definition?

A: IFB 2014 Appendix A, Section 3.0 "Authorized Activity" allows for the sale or rental of miscellaneous items of beach merchandise, such as (without limitation) sun block lotion, suntan lotion, towels and umbrellas; and/or granting permits for the promotion of products and services through sampling. Moreover, Section 9.0 "Concession Premises", Subparagraph 9.1.3, allows for use of the premises for the purpose of engaging in Authorized Activities, and for no other purpose.

Boogie boards, paddle boards, and chairs are considered beach merchandise and are allowed for sale or rent at the concession. However, the sale and rental of any other goods, wares, and merchandise, not considered by the Director to fall under the definition of miscellaneous items of beach merchandise, requires the express written consent of the Director.
