Gentlemen:-

I present herewith a statistical report of the operations of the Coroner's Office, for the fiscal year 1936-37.

The volume of work handled during this fiscal period was 13 percent greater than during the preceding year, reaching a total of 6070 cases. This is the largest case load in the history of this office, exceeding the high record of the preceding fiscal year by 693 cases. The prevalence of influenza during the winter months contributed largely to this increase, and the growth in population of the county was also a contributing factor.
