Gentlemen:

I submit herewith a statistical report of the operation of the Coroner's Office for the fiscal year 1937-38.

The case load for this fiscal period was 5783, or 287 less than during the fiscal year 1936-37, which was largely due to the fact that this community generally enjoyed a much lower death rate than usual during the past year, causing a reduction in the number of deaths from disease while unattended by physicians, and to a marked decrease in the number of motor vehicle fatalities. It is noteworthy that there were 99 or 9.2% fewer automobile deaths during the past year than in the preceding year, and this is the first year since 1924-25 in which any decrease in this type of fatality has been experienced.
