Gentlemen:

In presenting herewith a report of the operations of the Coroner's Office for the fiscal year 1938-39, I wish to direct your attention to the fact that during this period we handled a case load of 6190, the largest in our history and second in volume only to that of the Coroner of Cook County, Illinois.

This number is 22 percent of all the deaths that occurred in Los Angeles County and it was an increase of 7 percent over the preceding year. No additional assistants were employed in the discharge of this added responsibility. I also desire to advise that while the average cost of this work in Coroners' offices throughout the United States is about \$25.00 per case, our net cost was only \$14.50 per case, which shows an economy of approximately \$65,000.00 in the operation of this office.

Since we experienced no large disasters or epidemics of disease during this period, it is evident that our increase in load was wholly due to increase in the population of the county, which will doubtless continue to add to the responsibilities of the Coroner each succeeding year.
