Gentlemen:

In submitting herewith a statistical report of the operations of the Coroner's office for the fiscal year 1940-41 I respectfully direct your attention to the fact that during this fiscal period we inquired into the deaths of 6606 persons, which is the largest case load ever experienced by this office, and which was an increase of 324 cases, or 5% more than the work load of the preceding fiscal year.

This case load was handled without increased personnel, at the average net cost per case of only \$13.11, as compared with a unit cost of \$13.88 during the preceding year, and without sacrificing efficiency in our efforts to properly serve the public.

Our community experienced no great disaster or epidemic of disease during this year, therefore, this increase must be attributed to the growth of the population in Los Angeles County. Defense preparations will doubtless continue to add to our normal growth to such an extent that the Coroner's work will be further augmented during the ensuing fiscal year.
