Gentlemen:

Pursuant to Section 77 of the Administrative Code of the County of Los Angeles I submit herewith a statistical report covering the operation of the Coroner's Department for the fiscal year 1942-43.

The case load for this fiscal period shows 6831 deaths investigated as compared with 6760 during the preceding fiscal year, and the operating cost of \$13.83 per case is but 11 cents more than the unit net cost during the preceding year, in spite of the fact that the cost of materials used was considerably higher. Our high standard of accuracy in determining the causes of death by autopsy was maintained although we had the services of but three autopsy surgeons instead of four, as heretofore.

The chemical laboratory, placed in operation during this period, has already proven an invaluable aid to the speed and accuracy of our findings in cases where toxicological examinations are indicated.

This office has suffered, as all other departments of county government, in loss of personnel due to the manpower shortage caused by the war. It has been impossible to secure replacements for two autopsy surgeons who have joined the armed forces, one of which has been filled only temporarily. In other divisions of the office satisfactory replacements have been made and an earnest effort is being made to maintain the efficiency of the office at the highest possible level.
