Gentlemen:

In compliance with the provisions of Article III, Sec. 77, of the Administrative Code I submit the following financial and statistical report for the fiscal year 1943-44.

You will please note that the total number of cases handled by the Coroner's office was 6889, which is only 58 more cases than were handled in the preceding fiscal period. A larger case load was anticipated but an unforeseen decrease in automobile fatalities during this period, as well as a considerable decrease in the number of suicides usually experienced account for the fact that our expectations were not fully realized. The decrease in automobile fatalities must be attributed largely to the efforts of peace officers and courts, and the decrease in suicides is doubtless due to the decrease in financial distress during this period.

The number of natural deaths inquired into was 62 per cent of the whole case load, which is normal. This type of cases will increase as the population increases and automobile fatalities will doubtless increase after the removal of gasoline restrictions which will permit pre-war use of automobiles with results similar to those we experienced before gasoline restrictions were put into effect.

The net cos t of operations per case was \$14.65 as compared with \$13.33 for the preceding fiscal year. This increase of 82 cents per case is attributable to the increased cost of materials and increases in salaries and wages. There was no increase of the Coroner's staff during this period. This county was fortunate in having experienced no great disaster in which many lives were lost at one time, and no epidemic of disease, which would have increased the Coroner's respons ibilities. Such ideal conditions cannot be expected to prevail at all times, however, but the Coroner's department is well organized and prepared for any emergency whenever it may occur.
