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

Gentlemen:

In compliance with the provisions of Article III, Section 77 of the Administrative Code, the office of the Coroner of the County of Los Angeles, presents herewith its Annual Report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1945.

This report contains a statistical record and financial report of the year's activities, a survey of which shows a total increase of 926 cases, or 13 per cent. over the previous fiscal year. This includes an increase of 150 traffic deaths, 48 suicides, 11 homicides and 31 airplane deaths, while industrial and miscellaneous accidental deaths show very little increase.

Deaths due to alcoholism have almost tripled. Death by natural causes represents 68 per cent. of all cases handled.

The location of the increases in business is primarily in the suburban districts, indicating that the population increase in Los Angeles County has been distributed accordingly.

Not only has the case load increased, but demands for better and more extensive scientific search into the causes of death have been presented to this office by individuals and law enforcement agencies, especially in the laboratory field, which seem to be well founded due to many new poisons being continually discovered, and the rapid advance of science in the medico-legal field as applied to law enforcement and determination of criminal deaths.

The County was fortunate in having experienced no great disaster or epidemic of disease during the fiscal year.
