Gentlemen:

In compliance with the provisions of Article III, Section 77 of the Administrative Code, the office of the Coroner of the County of Los Angeles presents herewith its Annual Report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1946.

This report contains a statistical record and financial report of the year's activities. When compared to the work load of the fiscal year 1939-40, the report shows an increase of 1580 cases or 24.6%. This includes an increase of 141 traffic deaths or 14%; 68 homicides or 5%; 29 industrial accidents or 33½% and 227 miscellaneous accidents, or 35%. However, there was a decrease in suicides of 48, or 6%.

It will be noted that there has been a tremendous increase in the number of scientific tests, especially in the toxicological laboratory and microscopic examinations. Such an increase gives the department a more thorough scientific coverage into the cause of death.
