
In compliance with the provision of Article III, Section 77 of the Administrative Code, the office of the Coroner of the County of Los Angeles presents herewith its annual report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1950.

This report contains a statistical record and financial report of the year's activities which shows a total increase of 231 cases, or 3 percent over the previous fiscal year. This includes an increase of 20 suicides, 4 homicides, 26 industrial and 66 miscellaneous accidents. Traffic fatalities numbered 724, which shows a decrease of 54 over the previous year which is an encouraging trend but is still far too great.

Through the use of additional scientific equipment accorded us by the Board of Supervisors and the Chief Administrative Officer, and their clear understanding of our problems, we have advanced in our methods of crime detection.

We are pleased to report no major disasters or epidemics during the fiscal year.
