REPORT DIGEST

CORONER DEPARTMENT - ANNUAL REPORT 1952-53

Date of Report: Sept. 18, 1953.

The Coroner's Department had a caseload of 8534 cases for the fiscal year 1952-53, which shows an increase of 400 over the previous year. A breakdown of this total is as follows:

Deaths due to natural causes	5327
Due to traffic	887
Due to suicides	715
Due to homicides	152
Due to industrial accidents	116
Due to miscellaneous accidents	1254

Of the 887 traffic fatalities, 331 were pedestrian, 130 of which were over 65 years of age. 181 of these pedestrian deaths occurred at an intersection.

There were 556 collision and non-collision accidental deaths in motor vehicles, 484 of which were over 20 years of age.

10 persons lost their lives through electric railway accidents and 10 through steam railway accidents.

Of the 152 homicides, 89 were in the age group of 20 to 45 years of age. 62 of the homicide deaths were the result of altercations.

Of the 715 suicides, 196 were the result of despondency and 231 due to ill health.

Of the miscellaneous accidental fatalities, 672 persons were 65 years of age and over, and falls of various types accounted for 610 deaths.

3682 autopsies were performed of the 8534 cases handled by the Coroner during the year. 8920 tests were made in the toxicological laboratory and 2181 microscopic examinations in the pathological laboratory.

424 inquests were held during the year.

The Department's total expenditure during 1952-53 was \$316,110.99, comprised as follows: Salaries and Wages, \$272,159.15; Maintenance and Operation, \$42,910.50; and Capital Outlay \$1,021.34.

Revenues collected for the fiscal year 1952-53 were \$75,148.75.
