REPORT DIGEST

DEPARTMENT OF CORONER - ANNUAL REPORT 1953-54

DATE OF REPORT: Sept. 1, 1954.

The Coroner's Department had a caseload of 8539 cases for the fiscal year 1953-54, which shows an increase of 5 over the previous year. A breakdown of this total is as follows:

Deaths due to natural causes	5521
Due to traffic	777
Due to suicides	723
Due to homicides	193
Due to industrial accidents	119
Due to miscellaneous accidents	1108

Of the 777 traffic fatalities, 276 were pedestrian, 91 of which were over 65 years of age. 147 of these pedestrian deaths occurred at an intersection.

There were 501 collision and non-collision accidental deaths in motor vehicles, 394 of which were over 20 years of age.

18 persons lost their lives through electric railway accidents and 11 through steam railway accidents.

Of the 193 homicides, 113 were in the age group of 20 to 45 years of age. 54 of the homicide deaths were the result of altercations.

Of the 723 suicides, 135 were the result of despondency and 276 due to ill health.

Of the miscellaneous accidental fatalities, 601 persons were 65 years of age and over, and falls of various types accounted for 594 deaths.

3563 autopsies were performed of the 8539 cases handled by the Coroner during the year. 9353 tests were made in the toxicological laboratory and 2160 microscopic examinations in the pathological laboratory.

431 inquests were held during the year.

The Department's total expenditure during 1953-54 was \$332,069.67, comprised as follows: Salaries and Wages, \$282,799.47; Maintenance and Operation, \$48,510.09 and Capital Outlay \$760.11.

Revenues collected for the fiscal year 1953-54 were \$78,075.01
