## Myoporum Thrips (Klambothrips myopori)

<u>Distribution</u>: Originated in Australia or New Zealand. Accidentally introduced and now widespread in Southern California. Described as a new species (and under a new genus name) from specimens collected in California.

**<u>Hosts</u>**: Attacks various species of *Myoporum*.

<u>Damage</u>: Feeds on foliage, causing distortion and inducing leaf-galls (where adults lay eggs and larvae develop) on host plants. *Myoporum* generally tolerates the leaf damage, but heavy infestations can retard the growth, and lead to defoliation and plant death.

<u>Field ID</u>: Adults (about 2-2.5mm) shiny brown to dark brown, with wings and long posterior tube. Larvae from white to orange color, wingless.
