

SUBJECT: BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MOTION: L.A. COUNTY FOOD STAMP ERROR RATE PROGRESS REPORT

This is to provide your Board with the departmental progress report on the Los Angeles County Food Stamp error rate. Representatives from the Office of the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) have reviewed and concur with the information in this report.

ERROR RATE

I'm pleased to let you know that we're doing an excellent job of reducing our Food Stamp error rate. As indicated in the chart below, our error rate for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2001 was **22.9%**, the highest of any large county in the nation. While we improved to **19%** for FFY 2002, it was well above our target of under 10%. Federal audits have been completed for the first eight months of the current FFY, and so far our error rate stands at **7.9%**.

DPSS has made the Food Stamp error rate a top priority and we've worked hard to achieve these results. As indicated in Attachment I, we identified problem areas and made many operational changes to improve our performance. We conduct extensive internal error rate audits of approximately 3,500 Food Stamp cases each month to statistically measure performance in each of our offices.

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The performance of every office is ranked (see Attachment II) and discussed in monthly review meetings. Every one of our staff knows where their district ranks, and the importance of improving overall county performance. Our district managers are also held accountable for their error rates and appraisals are linked to the performance of their offices. The results of their efforts have far exceeded our expectations, and we hope to continue this downward trend in our error rate.

FOOD STAMP SANCTION UPDATE FOR FFY 2002

As mentioned in past reports, the most damaging consequences of a high error rate is the corresponding financial penalties imposed by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). Our 22.9% error rate from FFY 2001 carries an estimated sanction of \$87 million on Los Angeles County. The 19% error rate of FFY 2002 carries an estimated sanction of \$49 million for Los Angeles.

We are working with the California Department of Social Services and their outside counsel to appeal these sanctions. We feel it simply makes no sense to sanction us for money we don't have, especially when our performance has dramatically improved. We hope our improved performance can have a positive impact on the outcome of our appeals.


I will continue to provide your Board with regular progress reports on our Department's Food Stamp error rate.
