Dear Supervisors:

AUTHORIZE THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY TO ACCEPT 13th YEAR GRANT FUNDS FROM THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE (SCDI) FOR THE AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE FRAUD (AIF) PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2005-06 (ALL DISTRICTS) (4-VOTES)

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- 1. Adopt the enclosed Resolution authorizing the District Attorney to accept grant funds for the AIF Program from SCDI in the amount of \$3,999,602 for the period of July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006.
- 2. Authorize the District Attorney to execute the Grant Award Agreement on behalf of the County of Los Angeles.
- 3. Authorize the District Attorney or his designee, on behalf of the County of Los Angeles, to serve as project director and to sign and approve any revisions to the Grant Award Agreement that do not increase the net County cost of the Agreement.
- 4. Approve the attached Budget Adjustment in the amount of \$1,618,789 for FY 2005-06, to allocate spending authority necessary to operate the program.
- 5. Authorize the District Attorney's Office, pursuant to County Code Section 6.06.020, to hire the following grant funded/permanent positions: one Deputy District Attorney IV, one Investigative Auditor, one Paralegal, two Senior Investigators, one Legal Office Support Assistant II, and one Supervising Investigator, pending allocation by the Department of Human Resources.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

On July 15, 2005, the District Attorney submitted an application to SCDI to continue funding for the AIF Program in FY 2005-06. A Grant Award Letter was received on September 16, 2005 in the amount of \$3,999,602. The SCDI has awarded funding for the AIF Program for the past twelve years. The grant will allow the District Attorney to continue enhanced prosecutorial efforts and criminal investigations of automobile insurance fraud activity in Los Angeles County.

As part of the Grant Award Agreement, SCDI requires the adoption of the enclosed resolution, which has been approved as to form by County Counsel.

<u>Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals</u>

Acceptance of the grant funds supports the County's Strategic Plan Goal No. 4, Fiscal Responsibility, by securing an available revenue source at the State level. This program directly supports the District Attorney's core mission of vigorously prosecuting felony crime, such as automobile insurance fraud, throughout the County.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The amount of \$3,999,602 has been awarded to the District Attorney's Office for the AIF Program from SCDI. In addition, authorized 2004-05 carryover funds in amount of \$1,834,187 will be used to fully offset program cost estimated at \$5,833,789 for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

The department's 2005-06 budget includes \$4,215,000 for the AIF Program. The difference from the estimated cost is \$1,618,789 which will fund the seven (7) additional positions requested. AIF Program staff includes a total of 33.5 positions.

If funding for this program were terminated, an evaluation would be conducted to determine whether the program would either be continued with costs absorbed by the department, or discontinued with the reallocation of staff to vacant budgeted positions.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1872.8 of the California Insurance Code, the State Department of Insurance is authorized to award and distribute certain funds to district attorneys submitting plans approved by the Bureau of Fraudulent Claims for the increased investigation and prosecution of fraudulent automobile insurance claims.

The objective of the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Automobile Insurance Fraud Program is to enhance its efforts in the identification, investigation, and prosecution of major auto insurance fraud rings, syndicates, gangs, and organizations in the Los Angeles County.

In FY 2004-05, there were 46 investigations initiated, involving 104 suspects. This is a slight decrease from 49 in FY 2003-04. There was an 11% increase in the number of defendants charged from 81 to 90, 103 arrests were made which is a 37% increase from 75, and the number of defendants convicted decreased from 91 to 75.

AIF Program goals for FY 2005-06 include the initiation of 20-40 new investigations and 50-90 new prosecutions.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

Pursuant to your Board Motion of December 15, 1998, the Alternate Public Defender, Public Defender, Probation and Sheriff departments have been notified of this request.

The Probation and Sheriff Departments determined that this action would not impact their current operations. The Public Defender stated there would be a minimal impact on their workload, and the Alternate Public Defender stated any impact on their workload would be managed with existing resources.

Authorization to Accept a Grant Award from the
State of California, Department of Insurance
Pursuant to California Insurance Code
Chapter 12 commencing with Section 1871, et seq.

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 1872.8 of the California
Insurance Code authorize the State Department of Insurance to award and
distribute certain funds to district attorneys submitting plans approved by the
Bureau of Fraudulent Claims for the increased investigation and prosecution of
fraudulent automobile claims; and the District Attorney is charged with providing
prosecution of all felony offenses committed within this County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County recognizes that between 25-50 percent of every automobile insurance dollar collected from County citizens is spent for the payment of fraudulent claims, annually amounting to hundreds of millions of dollars; and

WHEREAS, the County of Los Angeles, acting through its Board of Supervisors, desires to combat automobile insurance fraud by undertaking a certain project designated the "Automobile Insurance Fraud Program" by the District Attorney to be funded through funds made available by the Insurance Fraud Prevention Act as provided for pursuant to California Insurance Code 1872.8, administered by the California Department of Insurance; and

WHEREAS, the State of California Department of Insurance approved the fraud reduction plan submitted by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office for Fiscal Year 2005-2006 for the Automobile Insurance Fraud Program for this specific task;
