Dear Supervisors:

AUTHORIZE THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY TO ACCEPT 15<sup>th</sup> YEAR GRANT FUNDS FROM THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE (SCDI) FOR THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE FRAUD (WCIF) PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2007-08 (ALL DISTRICTS) (4-VOTES)

#### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- Adopt the enclosed Resolution authorizing the District Attorney to accept grant funds for the WCIF Program from the SCDI. Funds in the amount of \$4,899,000 have been awarded for the period of July 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008. There is no required County match for this grant.
- Authorize the District Attorney to execute the Grant Award Agreement (GAA) on behalf of the County of Los Angeles.
- Authorize the District Attorney or his designee, on behalf of the County of Los Angeles, to serve as project director and to sign and approve any revisions to the GAA that do not increase the net County cost of the agreement.
- Approve the attached budget adjustment in the amount of \$283,000 to allocate spending authority to salary and employee benefits for the WCIF Program. This amount represents the difference between the grant award and the amount budgeted for FY 2007-08.

#### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The SCDI has awarded funding for the WCIF Program for the past fourteen years. On April 27, 2007 the District Attorney's Office (DA) submitted an application to the SCDI to continue funding for this Program in FY 2007-08.

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The DA was awarded \$4,899,000 for this program to be used solely for the investigation and prosecution of workers' compensation fraud cases, and cases relating to the willful failure of employers to remit payments into workers' compensation programs designed to protect employees.

The objective of the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Workers' Compensation Insurance Fraud Program is the prevention, deterrence and prosecution of those who abuse the workers' compensation system by criminal methods.

Since 2004-05, the WCIF Program has reported the following:

The reported number of defendants convicted includes felony and misdemeanor charges. There were a total of 172 cases in progress during FY 2006-07 which included 188 defendants and total chargeable fraud of \$19,414,786.

Board approval is required to accept grant funds and the SCDI requires an approved resolution by the County Board of Supervisors as part of the GAA. Adoption of the enclosed resolution has been approved as to form by County Counsel and will satisfy County and State requirements.

#### Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

Acceptance of the grant funds supports the County's Strategic Plan Goal No. 4, Fiscal Responsibility, by securing available revenue to offset program costs. This program directly supports the District Attorney's core mission of prevention, deterrence and prosecution of felony crime throughout the County.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The amount of \$4,899,000 has been awarded to the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office for the WCIF Program for the period of July 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008.

The attached budget adjustment in the amount of \$283,000 represents the difference between the actual grant award and the amount included in the 2007-08 department budget for the WCIF Program. Salary and employee benefit increases will be funded by the \$283,000 difference. There is no net County cost associated with this program.

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If funding for this program were terminated, an evaluation would be conducted to determine whether the program would either be continued with costs absorbed by the department, or discontinued with the reallocation of staff to vacant budgeted positions.

#### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1872.83 of the California Insurance Code, the State Department of Insurance is authorized to award and distribute funds to district attorneys submitting plans approved by the Bureau of Fraudulent Claims for the increased investigation and prosecution of fraudulent workers' compensation claims. The District Attorney's Office has been awarded funding for this Program for the last fourteen years.

#### IMPACT ON CURRECT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

This program does not propose attorney staff augmentation. Therefore, the District Attorney's Office is not subject to the Board Motion of December 15, 1998, requiring clearance with the Alternate Public Defender, Probation, Public Defender, and Sheriff's Departments.

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 1872.8 of the California Insurance Code authorize the State Department of Insurance to award and distribute certain funds to district attorneys submitting plans approved by the Bureau of Fraudulent Claims for the increased investigation and prosecution of fraudulent workers' compensation claims; and the District Attorney is charged with providing prosecution of all felony offenses committed within this County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County recognizes that fraudulent claims are costing our citizens millions of dollars annually, with thousands of jobs being lost due to local business closures precipitated by escalating workers' compensation costs caused by fraud; and

WHEREAS, the County of Los Angeles, acting through its Board of Supervisors, desires to combat workers' compensation insurance fraud by undertaking a certain project designated the "Workers' Compensation Insurance Fraud Program" by the District Attorney to be funded through funds made available by the Insurance Fraud Prevention Act as provided for pursuant to California Insurance Code 1872.83, administered by the California Department of Insurance; and

WHEREAS, the State of California Department of Insurance approved the fraud reduction plan submitted by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's

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for Fiscal Year 2007-2008, for the Workers' Compensation Insurance Fraud Program for this specific task.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles hereby authorizes and approves acceptance of grant funds from the State of California, Department of Insurance, to be used exclusively for the program designated the "Workers' Compensation Insurance Fraud Program" for the period covering July 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008;
