INNOVATIVE HOUSING CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS (ITEM NO. S-1, AGENDA OF DECEMBER 10, 2019)

On November 26, 2019, the Board of Supervisors (Board) adopted a motion to establish an urgent housing initiative for individuals experiencing homelessness and directed the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to report back on December 10, 2019.
