SUBJECT: **PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD BEGINS FOR THE KIWA APARTMENTS HOUSING PROJECT UNDER THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT HOUSING PROGRAM**

This is to inform you that the Department of Mental Health (DMH), as required under the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA), has opened a public review and comment period for the KIWA Apartments Housing Project proposed to be funded through the MHSA Housing Program. The public review and comment period will run from December 23, 2009 through January 21, 2010. The document under review is posted on the DMH web site (<http://dmh.lacounty.gov>).

On June 10, 2008 the Board approved the DMH MHSA Housing Program Plan and authorized the Department to participate in the statewide MHSA Housing Program jointly administered by the California Department of Mental Health (CDMH) and the California Housing and Finance Agency (CalHFA) for the development of permanent supportive housing for individuals with mental illness and their families. CDMH subsequently allocated Los Angeles County \$115,571,200 and transferred the funds to CalHFA to administer the funds and underwrite the loans. DMH has a non-competitive process for soliciting projects for consideration.

The KIWA Apartments Housing Project is the twenty-fourth MHSA Housing Program project to be posted for public comment in Los Angeles. The Project Sponsor is Little Tokyo Service Center Community Development Corporation (CDC). The project is located in Service Planning Area 4 in Supervisorial District 2 and will target homeless Transition Age Youth that are MHSA eligible. Little Tokyo Service Center-CDC is requesting a MHSA funded capital development loan of \$1,048,300 for this project, with 10 units (of a total of 52 units) funded by MHSA and dedicated to Transition Age Youth with psychiatric disabilities.

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Following the public comment period, DMH will summarize the comments, analyze any substantive recommendations and revise the project, as appropriate. DMH will then send the MESA Housing Program application to CDMH and CalHFA for review, approval and underwriting.
