VISTA DEL MAR CHILD AND FAMILY SERVICES PROGRAM CONTRACT COMPLIANCE MONITORING REVIEW

In accordance with your Board's April 14, 2009 motion, we are informing your Board of the results of a group home compliance review.

Vista Del Mar Child and Family Services (Vista Del Mar) is located in the 2nd Supervisorial District and provides services to Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services' (DCFS) foster youth and Probation Department youth. According to Vista Del Mar's program statement, its stated goal is "to reunite families and children as quickly as possible or, where indicated, to provide for a successful emancipation process." The agency is licensed to serve a capacity of 24 children, ages 12 through 18.

The Out-of-Home Care Management Division (OHCMD) conducted a review of Vista Del Mar in February 2010 at which time, it had one 24-bed site and 12 placed DCFS children. Six of the children were male and six were female. For the purpose of this review, six placed children were interviewed and their case files were reviewed. The other six children were discharged prior to being interviewed; therefore their files were not reviewed. For the sampled children, the overall average length of placement was eight months and the average age was 15. Five staff files were reviewed for compliance with Title 22 regulations and contract requirements.

Five children were on psychotropic medication. We reviewed their case files to assess timeliness of psychotropic medication authorizations and to confirm that medication logs documented that correct dosages were being administered as prescribed.

SCOPE OF REVIEW

The purpose of this review was to assess Vista Del Mar's compliance with the contract and State regulations. The visit included a review of Vista Del Mar's program statement, administrative internal policies and procedures, six children's case files and a random sampling of personnel files. A visit was made to the facility to assess the quality of care and supervision provided to children, and we conducted interviews with children to assess the care and services they were receiving.

A copy of this report has been sent to the Auditor-Controller (A-C) and Community Care Licensing (CCL).

SUMMARY

Vista Del Mar was providing very good quality care to DCFS placed children, and the services were provided as outlined in the agency's program statement. The interviewed children stated that they wanted to continue residing at the placement and that the staff was genuinely concerned about them.

At the time of the review, the Group Home was in full compliance with all nine sections of our Contract Compliance review.

NOTABLE FINDINGS

There were no compliance deficiencies noted during our review.

The detailed report of our findings is attached.
