RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE AMENDMENT NUMBER SIX TO AGREEMENT NUMBER 71710 WITH CERNER CORPORATION TO ADD REMOTE HOSTING PREPARATION AND READINESS SERVICES OF THE JAIL HEALTH INFORMATION SYSTEM (ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

CIO RECOMMENDATION: APPROVE (X) APPROVE WITH MODIFICATION () DISAPPROVE()

SUBJECT

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (Department) is seeking your Board's approval and execution of Amendment Number Six (Amendment) to Agreement Number 71710 (Agreement) with Cerner Corporation (Cerner) for a Jail Health Information System (JHIS) that will add remote hosting preparation and readiness services, continue to provide maintenance services, and add an extension period which will increase the maximum contract sum by \$1,526,000.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

1. Approve and instruct the Mayor of the Board to sign the attached Amendment to the Agreement (as amended Agreement) with Cerner to add remote hosting preparation and readiness services, continue providing maintenance services, and extend the Agreement for a six-month period with an option to thereafter extend for up to an additional six months.

2. Delegate authority to the Sheriff or his designee to execute the extension option if it is in the best interest of Los Angeles County (County).

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended actions will allow the Department to engage Cerner to perform work necessary in order to transition JHIS from being locally hosted at the Department's Data Center to being remotely hosted by Cerner at its data centers to support an upgraded JHIS application and meet the evolving business needs of the Department. JHIS is a mission-critical application that is currently at risk for failure in the Department's Data Center's outdated hardware and software environment. Additionally, this outdated environment is not capable of handling implementation of several JHIS software releases, which the County pays for and is entitled under the Agreement, and the additional functionality necessary to meet the evolving business needs of the Department.

The proposed Amendment will engage Cerner to provide services needed to prepare for an eventual transition of JHIS to being remotely hosted by Cerner. Concurrently with Cerner's performance of these services, the Department will prepare a replacement agreement for submission to your Board once JHIS is ready to be transitioned to the remote hosting environment. In addition, the proposed Amendment will allow Cerner to continue providing maintenance services on its proprietary JHIS software.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The services provided under this Amendment support the County's Strategic Plan, Goal 1, Operational Effectiveness; and Goal 5, Public Safety, by enabling the Department to provide an improved level of inmate medical services.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Cerner has agreed to provide all work under the Amendment for a maximum amount of \$2,455,000, which is allocated as follows: \$1,750,000 for Deliverables Under Amendment and \$750,000 for Maintenance Services for the six-month term. Since \$929,000 of this amount is funded by amounts originally allocated to work that has been completed or is no longer needed and will be reallocated to the Amendment, the net increase in the contract sum of the Agreement is \$1,526,000, for a total contract sum of \$39,687,098. The Department has identified sufficient funding within the Inmate Welfare Fund for the proposed Amendment. The Department will continue to allocate the funds required to continue the services throughout the duration of the Agreement as extended by the proposed Amendment.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

On August 11, 1998, your Board approved the Agreement with Cerner to develop, implement, and maintain JHIS for the Department for a five-year time period and a maximum total contract sum of \$20,141,006. JHIS addressed the concerns and mandates of the Department of Justice for improved efficiencies and effectiveness within the inmate health care delivery system.

There have been five prior amendments to this Agreement. Amendment Number 1 was approved on July 15, 2003, reflecting changes to system components and extending maintenance services and increasing the maximum contract sum by \$5,933,299 to \$26,074,305. Amendment Number 2 was approved on March 21, 2006, providing expanded functionality, extending maintenance services,

and increasing the maximum contract sum from \$26,074,305 to \$37,211,098. Amendment Number 3 was approved on March 18, 2008, providing for an assessment of the JHIS application's ability to support the needs of the County's Probation Department, an upgrade of JHIS at the Department, and increasing the maximum contract sum by \$950,000 to \$38,161,098.

Amendment Number 4, effective as of February 17, 2010, incorporated revisions to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) by the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act (HITECH). Amendment Number 5 was approved on June 1, 2010, and transferred 800 licenses to the Probation Department's Probation Electronic Medical Records System (PEMRS). There was no increase to the maximum contract sum for either Amendment Number 4 or Amendment Number 5.

The proposed Amendment will engage Cerner to provide services needed to prepare for an eventual transition of JHIS to being remotely hosted by Cerner. Currently, Cerner provides remote hosting services to over 250 of their worldwide clients representing 65 percent of the client base. The Probation Department's PEMRS, approved by your Board on June 1, 2010, is a remote-hosted Cerner system. Remote hosting provides the Department with a number of advantages among which are a more predictable level of annual expenditures and avoidance of periodic capital investments to upgrade the Department's Data Center to accommodate new releases, additional application modules and operating platform obsolescence, improved disaster recovery capability from what is currently available in the Department's Data Center with a highly available system and less planned downtime, avoidance of ongoing operational costs associated with staff training and technical support of this complex health care system, the ability of the Department to more readily take advantage of new software upgrades and additional application modules, and better scalability to support more users.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

In October 1997, the Department issued a Request For Proposals for a JHIS, under which Cerner was the selected vendor. On August 11, 1998, your Board approved the Agreement with Cerner. JHIS was subsequently implemented in three phases and has been successfully operating for over ten years.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Amendment as to form. Additionally, in accordance with the Board's policy, outside counsel, Hanson Bridgett, LLP, assisted in the review of the Amendment.

The Chief Information Officer has reviewed the Amendment and recommends approval (CIO Analysis attached).

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

If the Amendment is not approved, the JHIS software will not have maintenance services beyond August 11, 2011.

AMENDMENT NUMBER SIX TO **AGREEMENT NO. 71710**

This Amendment Number Six (hereinafter "Amendment No. 6") is entered into by and between the County of Los Angeles (hereinafter "COUNTY") and Cerner Corporation (hereinafter "CONTRACTOR"), effective as of . 20 (as further defined in Section 6 below, "Amendment No. 6 Effective Date"), based on the following recitals:

1. COUNTY and CONTRACTOR have entered into that certain Agreement No. 71710, dated as of August 11, 1998 (as amended prior to the date hereof and together with all Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, hereinafter "Agreement"), amended by Amendment Number One, dated as of August 11, 2003 (together with the Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, "Amendment No. 1"), Amendment Number Two, dated as of March 21, 2006 (together with the Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, "Amendment No. 2"), Amendment Number Three, dated as of March 18, 2008 (together with the Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, "Amendment No. 3"), Amendment Number Four, effective as of February 17, 2010 (together with all Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, "Amendment No. 4"), and Amendment Number Five, effective as of June 1, 2010, for a Turnkey Jail Health Information System (as further defined in the Agreement, as amended by this Amendment No. 6, the "System" or "JHIS") for the benefit of COUNTY and, more specifically, its Sheriff's Department.

CONTRACTOR has, among other things, been providing, maintaining, and 2. supporting the JHIS, all pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

COUNTY and CONTRACTOR are additionally parties to that certain Agreement 3. No. 77285, dated as of June 1, 2010 (as amended from time to time, together with all Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, the "PEMRS Agreement"), for a Probation Electronic Medical Records System (as further defined in the PEMRS Agreement, "PEMRS") for the benefit of COUNTY and, more specifically, its Probation Department.

CONTRACTOR has been implementing, maintaining, supporting, and hosting the 4. PEMRS, all pursuant to the terms and conditions of the PEMRS Agreement.

5. COUNTY is currently hosting JHIS at data centers maintained by the Sheriff's Department.

6. COUNTY desires to engage CONTRACTOR, and CONTRACTOR desires to be so engaged, to perform hosting services with respect to JHIS, subject to preparation, negotiation, and approval and execution by COUNTY's Board of Supervisors and execution by an authorized representative of CONTRACTOR, of a replacement agreement, together with related agreement documentation such as a statement of work, service level requirements document, and payment Amendment No. 6 to County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department JHIS Agreement

schedule.

7. COUNTY and CONTRACTOR desire that, to the maximum extent applicable, such replacement agreement and related agreement documentation shall be based upon the PEMRS Agreement and corresponding related agreement documentation, with such changes as described in Section 5(b) of this Amendment No. 6.

8. COUNTY and CONTRACTOR additionally desire that CONTRACTOR's provision of hosting services under such replacement agreement and related agreement documentation shall be at no greater than the pricing set forth on Attachment J4-A (Remote Hosting Services Pricing).

9. In preparation for engaging CONTRACTOR to perform hosting services with respect to JHIS pursuant to such replacement agreement and related documentation, COUNTY and CONTRACTOR are entering into this Amendment No. 6, among other things, to engage CONTRACTOR to perform the work with respect to such hosting services described in Attachment J-4 (JHIS Remote Hosting Services Preparation and Readiness) to this Amendment No. 6, and to make other amendments to the Agreement with respect thereto.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, all of which are incorporated as part of this Amendment No. 6, COUNTY and CONTRACTOR hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Definitions: Paragraph References</u>. Capitalized terms used herein without definition (including, without limitation, in the recitals hereto), have the meanings given to such terms in the Agreement, as amended by this Amendment No. 6. Unless otherwise noted, Paragraph references in this Amendment No. 6 shall refer to the body of the Agreement.
- 2. <u>General Amendments</u>. As of the Amendment No. 6 Effective Date, the body of the Agreement and all Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, all as last amended prior to this Amendment No. 6, are amended to replace all references therein to "Jail Hospital Information System" with references to "Jail Health Information System." Without limiting the foregoing, after giving effect to such amendment, all references in the body of the Agreement and all Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto to "JHIS" shall mean and shall be references to the acronym for "Jail Health Information System."
- 3. <u>Amendments to the Body of the Agreement</u>. As of the Amendment No. 6 Effective Date, the body of the Agreement is amended as follows:
 - (a) Subparagraph 1.1 (Interpretation) to Paragraph 1 (Applicable Documents), as last amended by Amendment No. 4, is amended and restated in its entirety as follows:

1.1 Interpretation

County shall have the option to thereafter extend the term of this Agreement for up to an additional six (6) months, which option shall be exercised as set forth in Paragraph 6 (Change Notices and Amendments).

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Sheriff is delegated authority to execute on behalf of County, Amendments that exercise an option to extend the term of this Agreement as provided in Paragraph 5 (Term). - (b) From and after the Amendment No. 6 Effective Date, COUNTY and CONTRACTOR shall prepare and negotiate in good faith a replacement agreement for CONTRACTOR to perform, among other things, hosting services with respect to JHIS, together with all related agreement documentation, including, but not limited to, a statement of work, service level requirements document and payment schedule, which replacement agreement and related agreement documentation shall be, to the maximum extent possible, based upon the PEMRS Agreement and corresponding related agreement documentation, with such changes as are: (a) identified in Attachment J4-B (PEMRS SLA (Exhibit D) Items for Review and Modification to Meet JHIS SLA Requirements) to this Amendment No. 6; (b) otherwise necessitated by differences between (i) JHIS and PEMRS and (ii) the business needs and operations of the Sherriff's Department and the Probation Department; (c) required by law, policy, and/or COUNTY's Board of Supervisors; and/or (d) any other changes mutually agreed to by the parties, subject in all respects to approval and execution by COUNTY's Board of Supervisors and execution by an authorized representative of CONTRACTOR.
- (c) COUNTY and CONTRACTOR agree that CONTRACTOR's provision of hosting services under the replacement agreement and related agreement documentation shall be at no greater than the pricing set forth on Attachment J4-A (Remote Hosting Services Pricing).
- (d) COUNTY and CONTRACTOR expect that work on the replacement agreement and related agreement documentation and work described in Attachment J-4 (JHIS Remote Services Preparation and Readiness) to this Amendment No. 6 shall be done concurrently. Both parties agree to exercise commercially reasonable efforts to present the replacement agreement before the COUNTY's Board of Supervisors by the date set forth in Exhibit C (Project Schedule) to the Agreement, as amended by this Amendment No. 6 or, if that date is not met, as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter.
- (e) CONTRACTOR and COUNTY acknowledge and agree that CONTRACTOR has received all amounts set forth in Exhibit B (Schedule of Payments), as amended by this Amendment No. 6, under the row identified as "Actual Aggregate Price Payments for Deliverables and Out-of Pocket Expenses Under Amendment Number Two Telemedicine," and that such amounts constitute payment in full for all Work to be performed by CONTRACTOR under Attachment J-3 (Telemedicine) to Exhibit J (Supplemental Statements of Work).
- (f) CONTRACTOR and COUNTY acknowledge and agree that CONTRACTOR has completed all contractual obligations and received payment in full for all Work to be performed by CONTRACTOR under all Change Notices that have been entered into under the Agreement as of the date of this Amendment No. 6, with the exception of Change Notice No. 139, dated February 11, 2011, and Change Notice No. 140, dated

- (g) CONTRACTOR acknowledges that the covenants set forth in this Section 5 are crucial to COUNTY's determination to enter into this Amendment No. 6.
- 6. <u>Effectiveness of Amendment No. 6</u>. This Amendment No. 6 is effective as of the date identified in the recitals of this Amendment No. 6, which is the date on which all of the following have occurred (such date, the "<u>Amendment No. 6 Effective Date</u>"):
 - (a) COUNTY's Project Director shall have received an original counterpart to this Amendment No. 6, duly executed by an authorized officer of CONTRACTOR;
 - (b) County Counsel shall have approved this Amendment No. 6 as to form, as indicated by County Counsel's or County Counsel's designee's original counterpart to this Amendment No. 6; and
 - (c) COUNTY's Board of Supervisors shall have approved this Amendment No. 6.
- 7. <u>No Other Amendments</u>. Except as expressly provided in this Amendment No. 6, all other provisions, and conditions of the Agreement shall remain the same and in full force and effect.
- 8. <u>Authority</u>. CONTRACTOR and the person executing this Amendment No. 6 on behalf of CONTRACTOR hereby represent and warrant that the person executing this Amendment No. 6 for CONTRACTOR is an authorized agent who has actual authority to bind CONTRACTOR to each and every item, condition, and obligation of the Agreement and that all requirements of CONTRACTOR have been fulfilled to provide such actual authority.

Capitalized terms used without definition have the meanings given to such terms in Agreement No. 71710, dated as of August 11, 1998 (as amended and together with all Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, hereinafter "Agreement"), between the County of Los Angeles (COUNTY) and Cerner Corporation (CONTRACTOR) for the Jail Health Information System (as further defined in the Agreement, "JHIS" or "System").

This Attachment J-4 to Exhibit J is the Supplemental Statement of Work to prepare for and ensure operational readiness for implementation of Contractor's provision of remote hosting services with respect to JHIS, roughly as defined in Exhibit D (Service Level Agreement) to Agreement No. 77285, dated as of June 1, 2010 (as amended and together with all Exhibits, Schedules, Attachments and Annexes thereto, the "PEMRS Agreement"), for a Probation Electronic Medical Records System (as further defined in the PEMRS Agreement, "PEMRS") for the benefit of COUNTY and, more specifically, its Probation Department, with such changes to such Exhibit D to the PEMRS Agreement as are contemplated in Amendment Number Six to the Agreement (Amendment No. 6) and in this Attachment J-4 (collectively, "Remote Hosting Services") and defines the scope of work to be performed under this Amendment No. 6.

Without limiting the foregoing, Remote Hosting Services include the facility management, network management, system management, database management, and interface management services to operate JHIS continuously 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, every day of each year hosted at the CONTRACTOR's high availability, Tier 4 Data Center. As used in this Attachment J-4, "Networking Equipment" and "Communications Infrastructure" shall consists of all the CONTRACTOR network equipment, software, and console systems, Local Area Network (LAN) and Wide Area Network (WAN) circuits required for Remote Hosting Services.

The scope of work incorporates all of the Tasks, Deliverables, and services necessary to prepare the Remote Hosting Services environment for transition from the current client-hosted JHIS at Sheriff's Data Center to remote-hosted JHIS at CONTRACTOR's Data Center. CONTRACTOR shall prepare a project plan, conduct a technical assessment, order, install, and configure hardware, system software, and networking equipment and communications infrastructure required for the Remote Hosting Services environment, prepare the Remote Hosting Services environment for testing, conduct regression testing, full system testing, and failover testing in conjunction with COUNTY. Upon successful completion of testing, CONTRACTOR shall prepare a Remote Hosting Services system management training to COUNTY staff. Upon successful completion of the Tasks and Deliverables as defined in this Attachment J-4 and approval by COUNTY in accordance with the Agreement, CONTRACTOR and COUNTY shall be ready for conversion and cutover of JHIS from Sheriff's Data Center to CONTRACTOR'S Data Center.

CONTRACTOR shall conduct weekly status reporting and project management meetings with COUNTY's project staff in accordance with schedules and agendas established collaboratively by COUNTY's Project Manager and CONTRACTOR's Project Manager. These meetings shall be conducted in a communications format agreed upon by COUNTY's and CONTRACTOR's Project Managers.

TASK 1: PROJECT PLANNING AND ADMINISTRATION

CONTRACTOR shall develop a Project Control Document (hereafter "PCD") that shall include, without limitation, a detailed work plan, work breakdown structure, milestone chart, Gantt chart, communication plan, the CONTRACTOR's project organization and staffing. CONTRACTOR shall develop and maintain a critical path analysis for the project. COUNTY will provide logistical support for work and events required by this TASK 1 when conducted in Los Angeles County. CONTRACTOR shall manage project activities and its resources and track project status. Project Status Reports shall be prepared on a monthly basis by CONTRACTOR reporting plans, progress, and issues tracked against the PCD.

Subtask 1.1: Prepare Project Control Document (PCD)

CONTRACTOR shall review, document, clarify and refine all project goals and the assignment of goals to project resources. This process shall ensure that all involved parties have clearly understood and agreed upon all project goals and COUNTY responsibilities for governance and participation in the project effort. In collaboration with the Sheriff, CONTRACTOR shall develop a PCD that addresses, without limitation, the following:

- 1. The scope and objectives.
- 2. The expected roles and responsibilities of CONTRACTOR and COUNTY project organizations and a communication strategy for sharing the context and vision of the project to the project team members at large.
- 3. The composition of the project team and how the project team shall communicate with and collaborate with components of project governance.
- 4. The project organization and the roles and responsibilities of the project team members.
- 5. The technology strategy, including Domains and hosting strategy.
- 6. The project communication plan.

- 7. The security strategy and requirements, including physical, administrative and technical elements and the divisions of security roles and responsibilities between CONTRACTOR and COUNTY.
- 8. The detailed project plan including, without limitation, start and end dates for all Tasks and Subtasks specified in this Statement of Work, the work breakdown structure, Task dependencies, and assignments by Task and Subtask.

CONTRACTOR shall develop this PCD consistent with this Statement of Work. CONTRACTOR shall specifically address each Task and Subtask to be performed, the order in which CONTRACTOR shall perform the Tasks and Subtasks and the order in which CONTRACTOR shall produce the Deliverables specified in this Statement of Work. For each Task and Subtask, CONTRACTOR shall define and describe in detail the recommended involvement of COUNTY's staff that is necessary for successful completion of such Task or Subtask. CONTRACTOR shall formally present the PCD to the Sheriff.

Deliverable 1.1: Project Control Document (PCD)

The Project Control Document shall document the components listed in Items 1 – 8 of Subtask 1.1 described above together with any other items identified for inclusion by agreement of COUNTY's Project Director and CONTRACTOR's Project Director. Upon approval by COUNTY in accordance with Subparagraph 2.4 of the body of the Agreement, the Project Control Document shall automatically supplement Exhibit C (Project Schedule), as amended by Amendment No. 6.

Subtask 1.2: Perform Project Administration

CONTRACTOR shall manage project activities and its resources and track project status. This Subtask shall include, without limitation, reporting the results with COUNTY participants as designated in the PCD, and managing and tracking all progress and issues against the PCD. It shall also include, without limitation, the management of project and software change control processes. CONTRACTOR shall report project status on a regular basis. CONTRACTOR shall include, without limitation, updates to the PCD in the project status reporting. CONTRACTOR shall participate in regular project status meetings, including, without limitation, meetings with Sheriff that shall take place no less frequently than monthly.

CONTRACTOR shall manage the communication process which shall include, without limitation, monthly project status reports. These monthly project status reports shall include, as a minimum, identification and comparison of the project plan to the project sta-

tus, including without limitation any updates in the critical path or projected delivery schedules.

Through an on-going quality assurance process, CONTRACTOR shall assess COUNTY's satisfaction and report any project risks or problems identified as part of the quality assurance process, as well as when relevant risk mitigation, risk emergence, and recommended COUNTY and CONTRACTOR risk mitigation actions. The project status reports prepared by CONTRACTOR shall be used to document the results of this ongoing quality assurance process.

CONTRACTOR shall update the applicable sections of the PCD monthly as part of the project status reports (Deliverable 1.2 Project Status Reports).

Deliverable 1.2: Project Status Reports

As described in Subtask 1.2, CONTRACTOR shall prepare and present to the Sheriff a project status report to report project progress, plans, and outstanding issues, no less frequently than monthly.

The project status report shall include, without limitation, the following:

- 1. Project Progress and Plans, with actual status of schedule and budget
- 2. Updates to the PCD and critical path analysis
- 3. Issue Tracking and Change Control Process
- 4. Project Schedule
- 5. Readiness Assessments
- 6. Project risks identified through the quality assurance process.

TASK 2: TECHNICAL ASSESSMENT

Under this Task, CONTRACTOR shall produce a Technical Assessment Report that documents the current technical state and environment of JHIS, the results of a network survey identifying communications hardware requirements with Remote Hosting Services, and the impact of an analysis of current utilization statistics and capacity of the current JHIS infrastructure. CONTRACTOR shall assess and document the Wide Area Network (WAN) design and the technical and system software architecture to the extent necessary to enable CONTRACTOR to provide the Remote Hosting Services for JHIS. As part of this Task, CONTRACTOR shall identify impact points that address System capabilities to be provided by COUNTY that may affect the timely and successful migration of JHIS, including without limitation any issues associated with COUNTY's hardware and software to be used to connect with and use JHIS with Remote Hosting Services implementation such as without limitation LAN/WAN, available bandwidth, and the help desk, whether supplied by COUNTY or CONTRACTOR.

Subtask 2.1: Conduct Technical Assessment for Remote Hosting Services

With participation by COUNTY as provided in the PCD, CONTRACTOR shall conduct a technical assessment of the current JHIS technical environment and requirements to support Remote Hosting Services implementation including, but not limited to, a network survey, COUNTY JHIS infrastructure requirements, and Remote Hosting Services hardware and operating system software requirements based upon current and projected utilization statistics and capacity needs. CONTRACTOR shall prepare an assessment inventory survey instrument and assist COUNTY in completion of the assessment survey. The technical assessment inventory survey shall include without limitation the following:

- (a) An assessment of the Application Software including all custom processes, operations jobs, and scripts as well as issues with performance and outages,
- (b) A back-end assessment including domain, host, storage information, and performance data. The assessment shall also provide an inventory of all inbound foreign system interfaces, outbound foreign system interfaces, and MDI interfaces.

(c) A database assessment including a database inventory, database management processes, and external connections to the database.

CONTRACTOR shall analyze, document, and review findings of the assessment. Upon approval of Deliverable 2.1, Technical Assessment Report, CONTRACTOR shall proceed with Task 3.

Deliverable 2.1: Technical Assessment Report

CONTRACTOR shall deliver and present to COUNTY a Technical Assessment Report identifying the findings and impact of the survey and assessment activities conducted in Subtask 2.1. All the technical assessments required for the implementation of Remote Hosting Services shall be incorporated in the Technical Assessment Report.

TASK 3: PROCUREMENT, INSTALLATION, AND CONFIGURATION OF NETWORKING EQUIPMENT AND COMMUNICATIONS INFRASTRUCTURE AND DATA CENTER HARDWARE AND OPERATING SOFTWARE

Under this Task, CONTRACTOR shall procure, install, and configure the Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure required to support JHIS Remote Hosting Services at the CONTRACTOR's Data Center. CONTRACTOR shall also procure, install, and configure the required server hardware, operating software, and other components required to support Remote Hosting Services implementation of JHIS at the CONTRACTOR's Data Center. CONTRACTOR shall procure and pre-configure all hardware to be installed at COUNTY sites before delivery. COUNTY shall install hardware at COUNTY sites with assistance from CONTRACTOR. The sizing of the Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure, hardware, and other components installed as part of this Task shall be based upon the findings of the Technical Assessment Report, Deliverable 2.1. All the activities required to configure the Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure, hardware, and operating software required for Remote Hosting Services implementation shall be performed as part of this Task.

Subtask 3.1: Procure Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure

CONTRACTOR shall procure primary and secondary Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure for the Wide Area Network (WAN) connectivity based upon the Technical Assessment Report identifying network requirements in support of the Remote Hosting Services migration. All related Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure components shall also be procured and delivered at COUNTY and CONTRACTOR sites. The configuration shall include all Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure required at COUNTY site to ensure redundancy and continuity of operations with a Telco Circuit failure.

Deliverable 3.1: Confirmation of Procured Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure

As described in Subtask 3.1, CONTRACTOR shall order primary and secondary Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure components for CONTRACTOR and COUNTY sites providing a network infrastructure ready for installation and configuration in support of JHIS Remote Hosting Services. CONTRACTOR shall provide writ-

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ten confirmation to COUNTY that the procurements have been placed consistent with the technical assessment findings.

Subtask 3.2: Install and Configure Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure

CONTRACTOR shall install and configure primary and secondary Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure for the Wide Area Network (WAN) connectivity based upon the Technical Assessment Report identifying network requirements in support of the Remote Hosting Services migration at CONTRACTOR sites. All related Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure components shall also be installed and configured at CONTRACTOR sites. CONTRACTOR shall pre-configure all Hardware for COUNTY sites and deliver to COUNTY for installation by COUNTY. CONTRACTOR shall provide any assistance required by COUNTY in support of installation. The configuration shall ensure redundancy and continuity of operations with a Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure failure. Upon completion of this Subtask, the WAN and associated communications infrastructure in support of Remote Hosting Services shall be operationally ready to support testing Subtasks as defined in Task 4.

Deliverable 3.2: Installed and Configured Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure

As described in Subtask 3.2, CONTRACTOR shall install and configure primary and secondary Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure and related components at CONTRACTOR sites. CONTRACTOR shall pre-configure, deliver to COUNTY all hardware required at COUNTY sites, and provide installation assistance to COUNTY. Upon completion of the TASK, the network infrastructure shall be ready for JHIS Remote Hosting Services testing and implementation.

Subtask 3.3: Procure Remote Hosting Services Data Center Hardware and Operating Software

CONTRACTOR shall procure server hardware, Storage Area Network (SAN), operating software, and other infrastructure components required for preparation of the Remote Hosting Services environment for testing and implementation based upon the Technical Assessment Report identifying infrastructure requirements in support of the Remote Hosting Services migration. CONTRACTOR shall procure all required components for

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CONTRACTOR and COUNTY sites. Upon completion of this Subtask, the hardware and operating software environment for Remote Hosting Services shall be ready for delivery, installation, and configuration as defined in Subtask 3.4.

Deliverable 3.3: Confirmation of Procured Remote Hosting Services Data Center Hardware and Operating Software

As described in Subtask 3.3, CONTRACTOR shall procure server hardware, SAN environment, operating software, and associated infrastructure components in support of JHIS Remote Hosting Services. CONTRACTOR shall provide written confirmation to COUNTY that the procurements have been placed consistent with the technical assessment findings.

Subtask 3.4: Install and Configure Remote Hosting Services Data Center Hardware and Operating Software

CONTRACTOR shall install and configure the hardware, operating software, and other infrastructure components required for preparation of the Remote Hosting Services environment. CONTRACTOR shall rack and install the server hardware. CONTRACTOR shall install the base operating software (OpenVMS) on the server hardware. CONTRACTOR shall also install and configure file systems, Storage Area Network (SAN), Oracle database, and other operating software components required for JHIS. For hardware and operating software required at COUNTY sites, CONTRACTOR shall pre-configure and deliver to COUNTY and assist COUNTY with installation. Upon completion of this Subtask, the Hardware and Operating Software environment for Remote Hosting Services shall be fully prepared and ready for installation of the Application Software and related JHIS application environmental software in support of Remote Hosting Services.

Deliverable 3.4: Installed and Configured Remote Hosting Services Data Center Hardware and Operating Software

As described in Subtask 3.4, CONTRACTOR shall deliver a fully configured server hardware, SAN environment, and associated infrastructure components in support of JHIS Remote Hosting Services testing and implementation. All operating software, including but not limited to OpenVMS and the Oracle database, shall be fully configured and ready for installation of the Application Software and related JHIS application environment software as identified in Task 4.

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TASK 4: REMOTE HOSTING SERVICES ENVIRONMENT PREPARATION AND TESTING

Under this Task, CONTRACTOR shall take all the steps required to create the mock domain environment on the Remote Hosting Services environment inclusive of all components of the JHIS application. Subsequent to the successful completion of the environment preparation Subtask, the Remote Hosting Services environment will be ready for testing. Several testing phases will be conducted by CONTRACTOR in conjunction with COUNTY. Testing stages consist of regression testing, full system testing, and failover testing. Upon successful completion of all Subtasks, the Remote Hosting Services environment will be ready for conversion and cutover to Full Production Use. CONTRACTOR will maintain a system in complete sync with current COUNTY system. This sync includes archive logs and schema changes. An upgrade will be performed by CONTRACTOR to the COUNTY database from its present Oracle 8i version to a minimal Oracle 9i version. This Oracle upgrade must be performed before any mock domain establishment can occur.

Subtask 4.1: Prepare Environment for Testing

CONTRACTOR shall prepare the Remote Hosting Services environment for testing. All JHIS application environmental items will be copied by COUNTY to a portable storage device provided by CONTRACTOR. These items include, but are not limited to, the database, Application Software, Interfaces, and other JHIS environmental items required for a fully functional JHIS system. CONTRACTOR shall provide COUNTY detailed instructions and assist in the copy of all JHIS application environmental items.

CONTRACTOR shall create the JHIS mock domain environment on the Remote Hosting Services hardware at CONTRACTOR's Data Center. CONTRACTOR shall utilize the portable storage device to unload and create the initial testing domain. CONTRACTOR shall build out the file system and configure the mock domain. CONTRACTOR shall also create a standby database and install the CONTRACTOR's Disaster Recovery Toolkit to keep the database synchronized with JHIS current production system using archive logs synchronized with the current production system periodically based upon transaction volumes. All activities required to prepare the mock domain for testing will be completed as part of this Subtask.

Deliverable 4.1: Remote Hosting Services Environment Ready for Testing

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CONTRACTOR shall certify in writing that the Remote Hosting Services mock domain is fully configured with all JHIS application environmental items and ready for testing, as described in Subtask 4.1. CONTRACTOR shall prepare the certification and deliver to COUNTY.

Subtask 4.2: Support Regression Testing

CONTRACTOR shall support COUNTY by providing technical assistance and resolving problems identified during the regression testing of the JHIS Remote Hosting Services system to ensure that the copy of JHIS Application Software and other application environmental items function properly in the Remote Hosting Services system. The regression testing shall provide an initial test of all components of the application including Application Software modules, printers, Interfaces, operations jobs, custom code and reports, and all other components of JHIS.

Deliverable 4.2: Regression Tested Remote Hosting Services Environment

CONTRACTOR shall certify in writing that the Remote Hosting Services regression testing of all JHIS components has been successfully completed as described in Subtask 4.2. CONTRACTOR shall prepare and deliver to COUNTY the certification for completion of the regression testing.

Subtask 4.3: Support Full System Testing

CONTRACTOR shall assist COUNTY in conducting full system testing of the JHIS Remote Hosting Services system to ensure that all components of JHIS are fully functional in the this environment. The system test will fully test all components of the Application Software modules, printers, Interfaces, operations jobs, custom code and reports, and all other components of JHIS. Any problems encountered will be logged with CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR shall resolve the issues, modify the environment, and support COUNTY in re-testing.

Deliverable 4.3: System Tested Remote Hosting Services Environment

CONTRACTOR shall certify in writing that the Remote Hosting Services system testing of all JHIS components has been successfully completed as described in Subtask 4.3. CONTRACTOR shall prepare the certification and deliver to COUNTY.

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Subtask 4.4: Conduct Failover Testing

CONTRACTOR, in conjunction with COUNTY, shall conduct a failover test to test failure of both Remote Hosting Services hardware and the Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure network. The failover testing shall create simulated events of database, Application Software, and network failures to ensure that all components are configured appropriately to support failover. All Remote Hosting Services hardware and the Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure shall have redundant components including, but not limited to, servers, network circuits, and network equipment. Failover testing shall be conducted to ensure that none of these components are a single point of failure and all components failover without system downtime. Upon completion of this Subtask, CONTRACTOR shall have demonstrated that failover functions as designed and that end users have the least amount of impact should a failover event occur in JHIS upon Production Use with Remote Hosting Services implementation.

Deliverable 4.4: Failover Tested Remote Hosting Services Environment

CONTRACTOR shall certify in writing that the Remote Hosting Services failover testing of server hardware and the Networking Equipment and Communications Infrastructure has been successfully completed as described in Subtask 4.4. CONTRACTOR shall prepare and deliver to COUNTY the certification for the Remote Hosting failover testing.

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TASK 5: CUTOVER TRANSITION PLANNING

TASK 5 of this Statement of Work describes the Subtasks and Deliverables necessary to plan the actual cutover to Remote Hosting Services and train COUNTY staff in Remote Hosting Services system management. This Task completes all the preparatory tasks prior to actual cutover to JHIS Remote Hosting Services Production Use.

Subtask 5.1: Prepare Remote Hosting Services System Cutover Plan

CONTRACTOR shall prepare a detailed plan for JHIS conversion and cutover to Remote Hosting Services at CONTRACTOR's Data Center. CONTRACTOR shall document in the cutover plan all the specific activities required to make the final transition to Production Use of JHIS at CONTRACTOR's Data Center. Both CONTRACTOR and COUNTY responsibilities shall be delineated in the System Cutover Plan. The duration of each task shall be specified. The cutover plan shall include, but not limited to, the steps required for a graceful shutdown of JHIS at COUNTY's Data Center, the switch of all desktop devices and intranet links to connect to the new Remote Hosting production domain, the application of all database archive logs to the Remote Hosting standby database, connection of all Interfaces to the new Remote Hosting production domain, and turnover of the new Remote Hosting system to end users for Production Use. The cutover plan shall also identify all outstanding issues that must be resolved and corrective action required prior to Remote Hosting cutover to Production Use.

Deliverable 5.1: Remote Hosting Services System Cutover Plan

As described in Subtask 5.1, CONTRACTOR shall document, deliver and present a comprehensive Remote Hosting Services System Cutover Plan to COUNTY for review and approval.

Subtask 5.2: Conduct Remote Hosting Services System Management Training

CONTRACTOR shall prepare training materials and train COUNTY staff in JHIS system management in a Remote Hosting Services production environment. The roles and responsibilities of COUNTY staff in managing JHIS under the new Remote Hosting Services environment will be delivered by CONTRACTOR in the on-site training. CONTRACTOR shall identify and document Remote Hosting Services system man-

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agement practices in the training materials. Specific topics shall include, but not limited to, technical support, network, support tools, Citrix overview, security, printing, and conversion preparation.

Deliverable 5.2: Delivery of Remote Hosting Services System Management Training

As described in Subtask 5.2, CONTRACTOR shall deliver training materials and two onsite training sessions to COUNTY for JHIS system management in the Remote Hosting Services environment.

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TASK 6: PREPARATION OF REPLACEMENT AGREEMENT DOCUMENTS FOR JHIS

Task 6 of this Statement of Work describes the Subtasks and Deliverables necessary to prepare a replacement agreement for JHIS based upon the Remote Hosting Services model. The cost components of the replacement agreement for Remote Hosting Services shall not exceed the pricing set forth in Attachment J-4A. The replacement agreement documents and, in particular but without limitation the Service Level Agreement (SLA), developed by CONTRACTOR and COUNTY shall be consistent with the PEMRS Agreement to the maximum extent possible subject to resolution and agreement of the terms and conditions identified in Attachment J-4B related to service levels for Remote Hosting Services and as otherwise set forth in Section 5 (Incorporation of Recitals; Amendment No. 6 Covenants) to Amendment No. 6. The preparation of the JHIS replacement agreement documents shall be completed consistent with Section 5 (Incorporation of Recitals; Amendment No. 6 Covenants) to Amendment No. 6. Upon completion of this Task, the replacement agreement for JHIS shall be ready for review and approval by the COUNTY Board of Supervisors.

Subtask 6.1: Prepare an SLA Exhibit for JHIS Remote Hosting Services

COUNTY and CONTRACTOR shall prepare and negotiate in good faith an SLA for Remote Hosting Services consistent with Section 5 (Incorporation of Recitals; Amendment No. 6 Covenants) to Amendment No. 6. Exhibit D (Service Level Requirements) to the PEMRS Agreement shall be used as a baseline SLA with modifications to address and resolve the terms and conditions identified in Attachment J-4B, subject to the pricing and pricing assumptions defined in Attachment J-4A and as otherwise set forth in Section 5 (Incorporation of Recitals; Amendment No. 6 Covenants) to Amendment No. 6. Upon completion of this Subtask, an agreed-upon SLA shall have been prepared for the JHIS replacement agreement.

Deliverable 6.1: SLA for JHIS Remote Hosting Services

As described in Subtask 6.1, an SLA document shall be prepared in concert with COUNTY and delivered for the JHIS replacement agreement with Remote Hosting Services.

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Subtask 6.2: Prepare a Replacement Agreement for JHIS

Upon completion of Subtask 6.1, COUNTY and CONTRACTOR shall prepare and negotiate in good faith the replacement agreement for JHIS, and all other related agreement documentation, including but not limited to a statement of work, project schedule, payment schedule, and maintenance and support exhibit, consistent with Section 5 (Incorporation of Recitals; Amendment No. 6 Covenants) to Amendment No. 6. All existing Application Software and Interfaces as well as all new mandatory and optional Application Software and Interfaces shall be within scope of the replacement Agreement for JHIS. Upon completion of this Subtask, the JHIS replacement agreement, together with all related agreement documentation, shall be ready for review and approval by the COUNTY Board of Supervisors.

Deliverable 6.2: Replacement Agreement for JHIS

As described in Subtask 6.2, a replacement agreement, inclusive of all related agreement documentation, shall be prepared and delivered for JHIS in concert with COUNTY ready for review and approval by the COUNTY Board of Supervisors.

If the term of the replacement agreement is extended beyond the initial five year term, Remote Hosting Services will be renewed at the last monthly rate charged plus a no greater than 3% annual increase. PACS is a current JHIS Application Software module excluded from Remote Hosting Services with short-term cache and application hardware hosted by COUNTY. CONTRACTOR will host the long-term PACS archive for COUNTY.

Based on the assumptions in the attached budgetary quote, Attachment J4-C (Cerner Budgetary Quote Technology-RHO (new add-ons) for Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department), for additional new and optional Application Software identified in the quote, Contractor agrees that related recurring Remote Hosting Fee increase will not exceed 11%. CONTRACTOR will honor the maximum 11% fee increase for a period of 18 months from execution of this Amendment No. 6. If any of the new and optional Application Software listed below are added after this period, CONTRACTOR will review and determine if additional fees are applicable. New and optional Application Software includes CareAware iBus, Adv Care Doc, ECG Imaging, ImageAware, PowerChart Maternity, PPOC (CareAdmin), Billing & A/R, XR Reporting, and 724 Downtime Viewer.



Project/Contract Description:

The Sheriff's Department is seeking Board approval of Amendment Number Six to the Agreement 71710 with Cerner Corporation (Cerner) for services to prepare for remote hosting of the Jail Hospital Information System (JHIS) at a cost of \$2,455,000, which includes maintenance services for six months. The Sheriff is proposing to offset the Amendment cost by reallocating \$929,000 remaining from the existing Agreement, thereby reducing the net amount to \$1,526,000.

Background:

JHIS is used to support the delivery of inmate health care services by the Sheriff's Medical Services Bureau. The Board approved the base Agreement with Cerner to implement JHIS on August 11, 1998. While the Sheriff has been operating JHIS for over the past ten years, it has not been able to keep current with the system operating environment. Additionally, it has been unable to implement additional modules providing new functionality without implementing significant hardware and database upgrades.

Project Justification/Benefits:

The proposed Amendment will provide professional services that will enable the Sheriff to prepare for remote hosting of JHIS by Cerner, similar to the Probation Department's Probation Electronic Medical Records System (PEMRS). Specifically, the Amendment will upgrade JHIS to current application and database software versions and replicate JHIS data in an environment hosted at Cerner's data center. The system upgrade and data replication is expected to take approximately four months and also includes maintenance services for an additional six months to allow the Sheriff time for system testing and to prepare a separate agreement with Cerner for hosting and application management services.

Project Metrics:

The Amendment Statement of Work (SOW) includes defined deliverables for a Technical Assessment, secured network connectivity, as well as an upgraded JHIS application operating on a currently supported Oracle database version that will be used for testing by the Sheriff in preparation for the transition to Cerner's remote hosting services.

Impact on Service Delivery or Department Operations, if Proposal is Not Approved:

If this Amendment is not approved, it will severely hamper the Sheriff's ability to remain current on system hardware and software, as well as to implement additional JHIS modules to meet their evolving business needs.

Alternatives Considered:

The only viable alternative to remote hosting services is the continued support and operation of JHIS internally by the Sheriff. This would require a significant capital investment to migrate to a new hardware platform, as well as additional staff resources and consultant services to implement and support new application modules. The CIO has recommended that an assessment be performed at the conclusion of this Amendment to fully understand the costs and requirements to transition JHIS to remote hosting services by Cerner.

Project Risks:

There are minimal risks in Cerner performing the work described in the Amendment because Cerner has performed similar upgrades of their baseline commercial off-the-shelf application for many of their clients. Additionally, the Amendment SOW clearly describes the tasks and deliverables to be performed. These deliverables are fixed price with a ten percent holdback until the remote hosting agreement is successfully negotiated. The Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) has reviewed the Amendment and did not identify any security risks or issues.

Risk Mitigation Measures:

Adequate mitigation measures that have been established in the Agreement will remain unchanged for this Amendment. Additionally, the Amendment's SOW identifies additional service level requirements that the Sheriff plans to negotiate before finalizing an agreement for remote hosting and application management services.

Financial Analysis:

The proposed Amendment has a maximum contract amount of \$2,455,000. The Sheriff is proposing to offset the Amendment cost by reallocating \$929,000 remaining from the existing Agreement, thereby reducing the net amount to \$1,526,000. A breakout of the Amendment costs is provided below:
