**SUBJECT: SOLE SOURCE CONTRACTS ANNUAL SURVEY**

Board Policy 5.100 on Sole Source Contracts requires that departments advise your Board in advance of commencing negotiations for sole source contracts in excess of \$250,000. The policy also requires departments to track their sole source contracts below the threshold of \$250,000 and to provide such information on an annual basis to this department.

As indicated on the attached summary document, the number of sole source contracts reported by departments for FY 2013-14 increased as compared to FY 2012-13, with the grand total amount decreasing as shown below.

- For FY 2013-14, five of 35 departments reported sole source contracts below the threshold of \$250,000, compared to six departments in FY 2012-13.
- For FY 2013-14, departments reported 80 sole source contracts totaling approximately \$8.9 million, compared with 71 sole source contracts totaling \$9.3 million in FY 2012-13.

Contracts for consulting services executed under the CEO's delegated authority are not included in this report as they are already reported separately by the CEO.

ISD will continue to report to your Board on an annual basis for sole source contracts meeting the established criteria. If you have any questions, please contact me at (323) 267-2101.
