MOTION BY SUPERVISOR MARK RIDLEY-THOMAS, SEPTEMBER 16, 2014: ENCOURAGING EMPLOYEE PARTICIPATION IN THE PULSEPOINT APPLICATION TO SAVE LIVES

In accordance with your Honorable Board's September 16, 2014, motion, the Los Angeles County Fire Department (Fire Department) is collaborating with the Chief Executive Office (CEO) and the Department of Health Services (DHS) to encourage Los Angeles County (County) employees to learn hands-only cardiopulmonary resuscitation technique (hands-only CPR) and utilize the PulsePoint Application (PulsePoint). As requested, following is a plan to train all County employees, methods to encourage their use of PulsePoint, and a plan to inventory all automatic external defibrillators (AED) in County-owned and/or managed buildings.

PLAN TO TRAIN ALL COUNTY EMPLOYEES

The Fire Department is the lead agency in the creation and implementation of the Hands-Only CPR Training Program for employees. The Fire Department will deliver the program through the "Train-the-Trainer" method wherein each County department will be asked to designate departmental subject matter experts (SMEs). The SMEs will be trained by the Fire Department to become instructors; and as instructors, the SMEs will be responsible for training their respective department personnel.

The Fire Department will maintain a master roster of departmental SMEs and conduct refresher "Train-the-Trainer" sessions every three years. In the event the need arises for additional SMEs, the Fire Department will conduct additional "Train-the-Trainer" sessions.

Outline of Employee Hands-Only CPR Training Program

- Employee will register for one of their departmental training sessions through the Learning Net System (LNS).
- The training session will consist of:
 - Attendance at a 30-minute, instructor lead training session.
 - Viewing of a 15-minute instructional video through LNS.
 - Successful completion of a 10-question posttest through LNS.
- Upon successful completion of the post-test, the employee will be asked to download PulsePoint to their mobile device.
- Completion of the course will appear on the employee's profile in LNS.

Hands-Only CPR Training Program Timeline

January 2015

- Obtain approval from your Board of the Hands-Only CPR Training Program.
- Finalize curriculum.
- Official launch of employee Hands-Only CPR Training Program.
- Establish and train the Fire Department's "Train-the-Trainer" team.
- Request identification of departmental SMEs.
- Open LNS registration for departmental SMEs to attend a "Train-the-Trainer" session. (Attachment A)
- Begin to identify and document AED locations throughout all County-owned and/or managed buildings to be completed by April 2015 in conjunction with the annual County audit (Attachment B).

February 2015

- Conduct "Train-the-Trainer" sessions for departmental SMEs.
- SMEs to prepare training schedule for their respective department.

March 2015

- Open LNS registration for employee Hands-Only CPR Training sessions. Expected completion by December 2016.

April 2015

- Begin conducting Countywide employee hands-only CPR training.
- Complete upload of AED locations to PulsePoint.

Cost Estimate

The Fire Department anticipates the costs as follows:

- The “Train-the-Trainer” sessions will be conducted by assigned on-duty personnel. In the event overtime is necessary, the costs will be minimal.
- Each department will be responsible for ordering/purchasing at least one hands-only CPR kit.
 - Each kit is approximately \$600 and contains 10 manikins and accessories (Attachment C).
 - Vendor information will be provided to the SMEs during the “Train-the-Trainer” sessions.
 - One kit can train up to 30 participants at a time.

Documentation of the Number of Times an Employee has Been Notified Via PulsePoint to Respond to a Person Requiring CPR

PulsePoint has the capability to send a notice to the Fire Department designee each time an employee receives a notice to respond to a person requiring CPR. A quarterly report will be compiled and will be provided upon request.

ENCOURAGE EMPLOYEES WHO ARE TRAINED IN CPR TO DOWNLOAD AND REGISTER WITH PULSEPOINT

During the “Train-the Trainer” sessions, the SMEs will be provided with options to customize their training for those employees who are CPR-certified. They will be encouraged to register with PulsePoint.

INCLUDE INFORMATION ON PULSEPOINT IN ALL RELEVANT PRESENTATIONS TO THE PUBLIC

The Fire Department regularly encourages the community to become trained in hands-only CPR, download PulsePoint, and save a life. During the “Train-the-Trainer” sessions, the SMEs will be provided with a script for their department heads and/or staff to utilize during public presentations wherein PulsePoint may be relevant.

AED LOCATIONS IN COUNTY BUILDINGS

An inventory of AEDs located in the County, including County-owned or managed buildings, will be handled by the CEO’s office. This will occur annually during the Countywide security audit. The survey of AED locations is on track to be finished by April 1, 2015. Instruction for the Department-designated SME on how to upload the locations of AEDs into PulsePoint will occur at “Train-the-Trainer” sessions.
