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


**APRIL 28, 2009 AMENDMENT TO ITEM NO. 24: KATIE A. STRATEGIC PLAN,  
TRI-ANNUAL REPORT ON THE MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING PROCESS**

On April 28, 2009, the Board ordered the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) and the Department of Mental Health (DMH) to prepare a monthly report on the mental health screening process. On January 19, 2010, the Board ordered the CEO, DCFS and DMH to report on how to reduce the time between mental health screenings and the start of mental health services. In response, DCFS and DMH reviewed a sample of children's cases and on March 16, 2010, provided the Board with a plan that resulted in a redesign of the Coordinated Services Action Team (CSAT) and Referral Tracking System (RTS). On April 17, 2012, the Board Deputies approved the current format of the report and agreed that the report, dated April 30, 2012, would be the last monthly report and, going forward, the report would be submitted every four months starting on

August 31, 2012. Subsequent reports would be submitted on December 31, April 30 and August 31 for each respective year.

This is the eighth Tri-annual Report updating your Board on the redesign of the CSAT implemented on October 1, 2010, and providing progress of all Service Planning Areas (SPAs) for the first four months of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2014–2015, (July 1, 2014 through October 31, 2014), as of December 9, 2014.

### **CSAT Process**

The CSAT process requires expedited screening and response times based upon the acuity of a child's need for mental health services. Additionally, the CSAT process provides for the annual screening of children in existing cases with previous negative screens. Three tracks establish the process by which all DCFS children in new and currently open cases are screened and referred for mental health services.

<b>Track</b>	<b>Screening Process</b>
Track 1	Children in newly opened cases who are detained and placed in out-of-home care receive a mental health screening at case opening.
Track 2	Children in newly opened cases under Voluntary Family Maintenance, Voluntary Family Reunification or Court-supervised Family Maintenance case plans are screened at case opening.
Track 3	Children in existing cases, opened before CSAT implementation, are screened at the next case plan update.

### **Referral Tracking System (RTS)**

The RTS Summary Data Report (Attachment 1) includes 22 data elements providing the rate, number, timeliness, and acuity of mental health screenings, referral, and service response times to DCFS children in new and existing cases on a point-in-time basis.


The RTS Summary Data Report as of December 9, 2014 provides the progress of all SPAs for the first four months of FY 2014–2015, from July 1, 2014 through October 31, 2014. This report reflects CSAT performance completed through December 9, 2014 and is a snapshot of work in progress. The following two charts

depict the results to date for all three tracks associated with the screening and referral process activity from July 1, 2014 through October 31, 2014.

**Chart I shows that of 7,862 children, 7,685 children required screens. (7,862 minus those currently receiving mental health services [<sup>1</sup>], in closed cases [133], who ran away or were abducted [36]):**


**Of the 7,685 children who required screens:**

- 6,458 (83.98%) children screened positive of all children requiring screens (7,685);
- 883 (11.49%) children screened negative of all children requiring screens (7,685);
- 348 (4.53%) children have screens pending of all children requiring screens (7,685).



**Chart II shows that of the 6,458 children who screened positive:**

- 3 (0.05%) children were determined to have acute needs;
- 62 (0.96%) children were determined to have urgent needs;
- 5,982 (92.69%) children were determined to have routine needs;
- 407 (6.30%) children's acuity level was pending determination and/or data entry.



<sup>1</sup> The total number of children in all tracks currently receiving mental health services is 58. However, only children in existing cases (track 3 [8]) are subtracted from the total number of children requiring screens because all children in new cases (track 1 [9] and track 2 [41]) must be screened whether or not they are already receiving mental health services.

**Acuity Referral Standards**

Acute	Children presenting with acute needs are referred for mental health services on the same day as screening.
Urgent	Children presenting with urgent needs are referred for mental health services within one day of screening.
Routine	Children presenting with routine needs are referred for mental health services within 10 days of screening.

The average number of days between screening and referral to DMH for mental health services according to acuity for FY 2014-2015 as of December 9, 2014:

- Children with acute needs were referred to DMH on same day on average.
- Children with urgent needs were referred to DMH in 2 days on average.
- Children with routine needs were referred to DMH in 5 days on average.

**Mental Health Service Activity Standards**

Acute	Children presenting with acute needs begin receiving mental health service activities on the same day as the referral.
Urgent	Children presenting with urgent needs begin receiving mental health service activities within no more than three days of the referral.
Routine	Children presenting with routine needs begin receiving mental health service activities within no more than thirty days of the referral.

The average number of days between referral to and receipt of a mental health activity according to acuity in the first four months of FY 2014-2015 as of December 9, 2014:

- Children with acute needs received a mental health service activity within the same day of the referral, on average. (Attachment 2, line 19a);
- Children with urgent needs received a mental health service activity within 1 day of the referral, on average (Attachment 2, line 19b); and
- Children with routine needs received a mental health service activity within 2 days of the referral, on average (Attachment 2, line 19c).

The rate of children that received a mental health activity with required timeframes according to acuity FY 2014-2015 as of December 9, 2014:

- 100 percent of children with acute needs received DMH services on the same day as the referral (Attachment 2, line 20a);
- 88.71 percent of children with urgent needs received DMH services within 3 days of the referral (Attachment 2, line 20b); and
- 97.79 percent of children with routine needs received DMH services within 30 days of the referral (Attachment 2, line 20c).

### **CSAT MH Screening Achievements**

As of December 9, 2014 for children served in the first four months of FY 2014-2015, the average timeline from case opening/case plan update to the start of mental health service activities is 17 days.

- DCFS and DMH continue to collaborate in order to sustain improvements made in mental health screening, assessment and service delivery:
  - 95.47 percent of children who were eligible for screening were screened for mental health needs;
  - 96.45 percent of children who screened positive were referred to mental health services; and
  - 94.86 percent of children referred for services received mental health service activities within the required timelines.

During this review period MAT Assessors in the remaining 2 of the 8 SPAs have received Strengths and Needs trainings in-order to improve the development of a common language around the underlying needs and strengths of children and families that are served by our community providers.

### **Quality Service Review**

The Quality Service Review (QSR) process is the central strategy adopted by Los Angeles County, in collaboration with the Katie A. Advisory Panel and plaintiff attorneys, to assess the quality of the services delivered to members of the Katie A. class. The QSR is an action-oriented learning process used to improve practice and service delivery for children and families. The QSR is also a measure of how well DCFS and DMH are implementing the Core Practice Model, the primary framework for practice expectations. Findings from case reviews are used to guide next steps to support practice and enhancing efforts that will lead to better outcomes for the families served.

The QSR measures both systems performance and outcomes for children and families. It reflects the quality of services in such areas as family engagement,

teaming among service providers, and children and families, as well as the ability to assess the needs that bring families to DCFS' attention, and provide timely and adequate services and supports. The QSR evaluates outcomes such as safety, permanency, well-being, school performance, and the ability to form appropriate social relationships.

Eighteen DCFS offices have completed a second QSR (sixteen of which have finalized scores; Santa Clarita and West San Fernando Valley Office Scores are combined).<sup>\*</sup> The following provides a sample of historical and the most recent QSR data results and narrative findings. The focus is on those indicators that are most essential to improving the work. As a point of reference, the higher the scores achieved, the better the practice and outcomes. Benchmarks targeted for systems performance and child status are noted in the table below. Definitions of these indicators are found at the end of the following section.

**Countywide Practice Indicators:**

The overall practice score for the countywide baseline cycle was 47% acceptable; in the sixteen offices scored during the second round, the cumulative overall practice score improved by 6 percentage points to 53% acceptable. The two practice indicators that have improved the most during the second cycle continue to be "Engagement" and "Long-Term View". This reflects that staff within the system of care is developing positive rapport and effective working relationships with children/youth and families and their informal supports to bring them in as full participants in case planning and goal accomplishment. It also means that staff within the system of care are creating better "shared and understood" safety, well-being, and permanency outcomes and functional life goals for the child and family that specify required protective capacities, desired behavioral changes, sustainable supports, and other accomplishments necessary for safe case closure.

The lagging practice indicator in both the baseline and second cycles continues to be “Teamwork”; the score for the countywide baseline cycle was 18% acceptable; in the sixteen offices during the second round, the cumulative “Teamwork” score modestly improved to 26% acceptable. “Teamwork” improves the formation and function of the total support system (including the right informal as well as formal supports) around the family: to unite, communicate, and coordinate actions toward the case plan goals and following case closure.

**Definition of Indicators:**

INDICATOR	DEFINITION
<b>Overall Child/Youth Status</b>	The QSR Protocol provides ten qualitative indicators for measuring the status of a focus child.
<b>Overall Practice Performance</b>	This measure is based on nine qualitative indicators measuring certain core practice functions being provided with and for the focus child and the child's parents and/or caregivers.
<b>Engagement</b>	Degree to which those working with the focus child and family are: Relating with the child/youth, biological family, extended family, primary caregiver, and other team members for the purpose of building a genuine, trusting and collaborative working relationship. Identifying a support system and/or finding family members who can assist with support and permanency for the focus child. Developing and maintaining a mutually beneficial trust-base working relationship with the child and family that involve having unconditional positive regard, respect for diversity, an inclusive planning process, and the ability to understand and work through resistance to participating in services. Focusing on the child and family's strengths and needs. Being receptive, dynamic, and willing to make adjustments in scheduling and meeting locations to accommodate family participation. Offering transportation and child care supports, where necessary, to increase family participation in planning and support efforts.
<b>Teaming</b>	Degree to which: (1) the “right people” for this child and family have formed a working Child and Family Team that meets, talks, and plans together. (2) The CFT has the skills, family knowledge, and abilities necessary to define the strengths and needs of this child and family and to organize effective service for this child and family, given the level of complexity of circumstances and cultural background of the child and family. (3) Members of the child and family's team collectively function as a unified team in planning services and evaluating results. (4) The decisions and actions of the team reflect a coherent pattern of effective teamwork and collaborative problem solving that builds upon child and family strengths and needs to benefit the child and family.
<b>Long-term View</b>	Degree to which: There are stated, shared, and understood safety, well-being, and permanency outcomes and functional life goals for the child and family that specify required protective capacities, desired behavior changes, sustainable supports, and other accomplishments necessary for the child and family to achieve and sustain adequate daily functioning and greater self-sufficiency.
<b>Assessment</b>	Degree to which those involved with the child and family understand: (1) Their strengths, needs, preferences, and underlying issues. (2) What must change for the child to function effectively in daily settings and activities and for the family to support and protect the child effectively. (3) What must change for the child/family to have better overall well-being and improved family functioning. (4) The “big picture” situation and dynamic factors impacting the child and family sufficiently to guide intervention. (5) The outcomes desired by the child and family from their involvement with the system. (6) The path and pace by which permanency will be achieved for a child who is not living with nor returning to the family of origin.
<b>Intervention Services and Supports</b>	Degree to which the strategies, supports, and services planned for the child, parent or caregiver, and family are available on a timely and adequate basis to meet near-term child and family needs and to achieve the outcomes planned.
<b>Adequacy of Services and Supports</b>	Degree to which planned interventions, services, and supports being provided to the child and family have <i>sufficient power</i> (precision, intensity, duration, fidelity, and consistency) and <i>beneficial effect</i> to produce results necessary to meet near-term needs and achieve outcomes that fulfill the long-term view.

(^) Overall Assessment previously measured as an average score vs a weighted score (of assessment of child, parent and caregiver).

**Most Recent Office QSR Results:**

The most recent QSR (with finalized scores available) was conducted during August 2014 within the West Los Angeles (WLA) DCFS Regional Office, Service Area 5. The key results are provided below:

In August 2014 ten (10) randomly selected WLA office cases were reviewed. With respect to overall child/youth status a 3 percentage point decline is noted when compared to their baseline score. The WLA case QSRs revealed that of the overall practice performance 50 percent scored in the acceptable range. This score is 3 percentage points higher than the countywide baseline and 15 percentage points lower than the WLA office’s relatively high score during the first cycle.

Scores on five out of eight of the practice indicators were higher in WLA during the second cycle when compared to the countywide baseline scores. With respect to Countywide baseline comparisons on “Engagement”, 70 percent of WLA case scored favorably (compared to 60% in the countywide baseline); on “Teamwork”, 20% scored favorably (compared to 18% in the baseline); on “Long-Term View”, 50% scored favorably (compared to 39% in the baseline); on “Intervention Adequacy”, 60% scored in the favorable range (compared to 52% in the countywide baseline).

In addition, the WLA Office improved their practice scores within their office during the second cycle when compared to their own high baseline cycle scores on the indicators of Teamwork and Long-Term View.

**QSR Story**

This six-year-old girl and her family came to the attention of the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) over two years ago when her paternal grandparents reported that they were caring for the child for extended periods of time and needed legal documentation in order to obtain appropriate medical care for the child who was exhibiting signs of hyperactivity, inattention, impulsivity, and was

throwing multiple temper tantrums daily. During the DCFS investigation, there was an incident where the mother of the child was robbed and shot in her home. The child was not present in her mother's home at the time of the robbery and remained in the home of her paternal grandparents upon the official detention. The allegations of general neglect and caretaker absence were substantiated due to significant risks posed to the child in the home of her mother.

When the child initially entered into treatment, she was diagnosed with Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder due to the exhibited symptoms described above. Through ongoing participation in psychotherapy and psychotropic medication management, the child has made gains in her ability to cope with frustration, have appropriate social interactions with both adults and peers, to excel in a classroom environment, and to form strong attachments with her caregivers and mental health providers. It was shared that her tantrums occur no more than once daily and it has been observed that the child is now able to self-soothe more than ever before.

The six month prognosis in this case is good, since it appears that formal supports have found the right intensity of intervention and services while still allowing the caregivers to integrate their own strategies of intervention effectively to assist the focus child. Due in part to this effective support system, this child has been able to resiliently make gains in her emotional and behavioral functioning, which are expected to continue in the future.

### **Summary**

This is the eighth Tri-annual Report provided to your Board tracking mental Health acuity and response rates since the redesign. CSAT processes, RTS business rules and programming, and the associated Summary Data Report are modified as lessons are learned. Similarly, our practice and service delivery system continues to be refined through the QSR process. The next Tri-annual Report to your Board dated April 30, 2015 will include the cumulative first two-thirds of FY 2014- 2015 Summary Data Report and updated QSR results.

**Track #1: Newly Detained**

All newly detained children eligible for the Multidisciplinary Assessment Team (MAT) program will receive a comprehensive assessment (including mental health) and mental health service linkage. All newly detained children not eligible for MAT, or in a SPA with insufficient capacity, will receive a mental health screening by the CSW using the Child Welfare Mental Health Screening Tool (MHST). Based on a positive mental health screening, children will be referred for mental health services through the co-located DMH staff and/or Service Linkage Specialist (SLS).

**Track #2: Newly Open Non-Detained**

All newly opened non-detained children (family maintenance or voluntary family reunification) will receive a mental health screening by the CSW using the MHST and, based on a positive mental health screening, referred for mental health services through the co-located DMH staff and/or SLS.

**Track #3: Existing Open Cases**

All existing open cases will receive a mental health screening by the CSW using the MHST when the next case plan update is due or a behavioral indicator is present (unless the child is already receiving mental health services) and, based on a positive mental health screening, referred for mental health services through the co-located DMH staff and/or SLS.

**Total Initial Screens, Referrals & Activities**

All children in tracks # 1, 2 and 3 will receive an initial MHST upon case opening and, based on a positive mental health screening, will be referred for mental health services through the co-located DMH staff and/or SLS.

**Footnotes**

(1) Number of children is defined as the total number of children receiving DCFS services within each screening track.

(2) Number of children currently receiving mental health services is the number of children in an existing DCFS case who are currently receiving mental health services, defined as having received a billable mental health service activity within the previous 60 calendar days. The number of children currently receiving mental health services in track one and two is provided for information purposes only. The number of children currently receiving mental health services in track three is provided to show the number of children who are not required to be screened.

(3) Number of children requiring screens is defined as a) the number of newly detained children with a case opening in the month; b) the number of newly open non-detained children with a case opening in the month; c) the number of children in an existing open case, not currently receiving mental health services, with a case plan update due or a behavioral indicator identified requiring the completion of a MHST within the month. Additionally, the number of children requiring screens may be reduced by the number of children in cases that were closed or by the number of runaway/abducted children in the 30 day period.

(a) Number of children in cases that were closed within 30 days of case opening is the number of children whose cases were closed during the timeframe that screening should occur.  
(b) Number of children that ran away or were abducted within 30 days of case opening is the number of children that ran away or were abducted during the timeframe that screening should occur.

(4) Number of children screened is defined as the total number of DCFS children for whom a MHST completed.

(5) Number of children pending screens is defined as the number of children for whom a MHST is required and have not received a screen.

(6) Rate of screening is defined as the percent of children screened out of the total number required to be screened using a MHST.

(7) Number of days between case opening/case plan due date and screen is defined as the average number of calendar days between the DCFS case opening date or case plan due date and the completion of a MHST.

(8) Number of children with negative screens is defined as the number of children with negative screens out of total children screened.

(9) Number of children with positive screens is defined as the total number of children with positive screens out of total children screened.

(a) Number of children screened acute is defined as the total number of children with positive screens and acute mental health needs.

(b) Number of children screened urgent is defined as the total number of children with positive screens and urgent mental health needs.

(c) Number of children screened routine is defined as the total number of children with positive screens and routine mental health needs.

(10) Rate of children with positive screens is defined as the percent of children with positive screens out of the total number of children screened.
