MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF JANUARY 11, 2010

The regular meeting of the Los Angles County Commission for Women was held on Monday, January 11, 2010 in the Sybil Brand Conference Room 372, Kenneth Hahn Hall of Administration, 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles, California.

President Duba called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF DECEMBER 14, 2009

On motion of Commissioner Rodriguez, seconded by Vice President Tanberg, and unanimously carried, the minutes of December 14, 2009 were approved.

President Duba reported the following:

- Extended deepest condolences to staff member Emma De Jesus and her family for the loss of her mother on December 24, 2009.
- Ex-Commissioner Peggy Freeman's husband suffered an accident while riding a horse. President Duba requested staff to send a get well card on behalf of the Commission.

- The annual Domestic Violence Shelter Donation Presentation and luncheon was held December 14, 2009. Five shelters and service providers received \$500 donation. Fourth District Deputy Gail Tierney and Springsong Cooper from the First District attended the lunch presentation.
- A thank you letter from the *Women Shelter of Long Beach* was circulated to the Commission.
- On December 21, 2009, President Duba and staff member Rhonda Rangel met with Springsong Cooper from the First Supervisorial District to talk about the annual 5K Run. Supervisor Molina will be the Honorary Chair for this year's event. The 5K Run is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, September 11, 2010, at Dockweiler Beach, Play del Rey.
- A letter was received from Sachi A. Hamai, Board of Supervisors Executive Officer on December 23, 2009 stating that \$31,576.92 will be transferred to the Commission for Women Trust fund based on the current Fiscal Services reconciliation findings.

- The Third District is due to host the annual community meeting in May. Therefore, it is necessary Commissioners meet with staff to discuss the details.
- Los Angeles County Commissions on Aging is being restructured and new committees, bylaws and ordinances are currently being created. They are expected to be in operation by July 2010. The new name will be Commission for Older Adults.

STAFF REPORT

Rhonda Rangel, Commission Service Staff, reported the following:

- The Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors is going *green*. In an effort of going green, the Executive Office is trying to reduce the amount of paper used in the office. Agendas and minutes will be distributed electronically. However, Commissioners who do not have e-mail access, a hard copy will be sent by mail.
- Recommended the Commission to consider alternate meeting locations since is increasingly difficult acquiring meeting rooms to hold Commission special events.
- Requested approval from the Commission to purchase name badges and name plates for newly appointed Commissioners. It was recommended to continue the item for February for approval.

APPROVAL OF 30 \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE 2009 GIRLS-AT-RISK SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS – COMMISSIONER BECERRA-JONES

Commissioner Becerra-Jones reported a total of 30 scholarship recipients for 2009. The following is the breakdown: A total of twenty recipients were recommended by the Department of Children Family Services (DCFS), Department of Public Social Services (DPSS), Boys and Girls Club, and Big Brother & Big Sister; Five nursing recipients were selected; and five recipients were selected and approved by Camp Scott without the committee's evaluation.

Following discussion, on motion of Vice President Tanberg, seconded by Commissioner Lesser, the Commission approved the 30 \$1,000 scholarship for the 2009 Girls-at-Risk scholarship recipients.

Following discussion, on motion of Commissioner Lesser, seconded by Commissioner Rodriguez, the Commission approved to support the American Heart Association's "Go Red Campaign" for the month of February 2010 at no cost to the Commission.

<u>UPDATE ON THE WOMEN OF THE YEAR AWARDS LUNCHEON – COMMISSIONER</u> WARD

Vice President Tanberg reported that the Committee met this morning and discussed the following:
