	date, out of 47 total units, only 13 units were being used to house inmates. Approximately 25 units were empty. 8 were trustees who were not under a quarantine order, this was simply where they were being housed. Only 5 people were in a quarantine. 9 units were out of service due to unmet needs for maintenance. There is no apparent signage with messaging that distinguishes quarantine from disciplinary measures.  Individuals who were under quarantine order here were generally unhappy and confused about it. They had no symptoms of COVID. It's difficult to distinguish this form of individualized quarantine from solitary confinement. Even though inmates have access to personal possessions, they do not have access to phones. According to the C/A on duty, the T121 unit was "slow" during the Omicron wave.  Spoke to one gentleman in "quarantine" housing. This man was on a list to transfer to another facility (he was arrested a couple of weeks ago because of an open warrant in Austin, TX; tested negative at IRC). He was
	initially sent to a dorm at NCCF (518). A different inmate there discovered he was positive so that entire dorm went into quarantine lockdown. Because this individual was to be transferred, LASD brought him down to TTCF to quarantine there instead. He has no symptoms and has not been tested again. He did not understand why he was moved into this isolation cell.

In this quarantine / medical isolation unit, individuals do not get access to the phones on most days. Phones are only made available to them every other day, on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. One inmate says he begs for hours to have access to the phone.

19. COVID-19: _COC Request	T241 contains a covid ward used for people who test positive for covid. C,D,E are used for asymptomatic cases; A,B are used for PUI. Despite being a covid ward, guards did not wear their masks that covered their noses.  Several individuals are housed with another person. One inmate said he was asymptomatic and wanted to be re-tested because he believes his test was a false positive, but he was not given the opportunity to be retested. Even though he was asymptomatic, he was being housed with a person who was symptomatic.
