Cleanliness/Graffiti	U	There is a massive black splotch of dirt/dust/black mold along the wall in front of the cells on 3100A. The men living there have asked for it to be cleaned because it gets into the air that they breathe. They reported that the deputies told them they are "not paid to clean." It is unsanitary and should be cleaned. The vents inside the cells near this area (towards the front of the module) were dirty as well. People in 3100 A/C reported problems accessing cleaning supplies. They must rely on inmate workers to provide them cleaning materials. Several people were concerned about their inability to maintain a clean-living environment inside their cells especially considering how old the facility is its susceptibility to rodents. They eat and use the bathroom in these cells, as well as live inside there almost 24 hours/day so it is imperative that they be able to keep it clean.

Common Areas	U	There was a large leak in the hallway at the end of the 6000 area, near 6050. It appeared that it is worse because of recent rain. The floor was wet and the paint on the wall was peeling off due to the moisture leaking in through the ceiling. The unsanitary conditions appeared problematic for inmates and staff.
