Access (Toiletries, Appropriate Combs/Brushes)	U	Toiletries/Toothbrushes etc are not provided for people in the IRC. This is very unsatisfactory given how long people languish there.

Access (Legal Counsel)	U	Several people said they had missed court dates or wanted to talk to their defense attorney/public defender but were not able to access a telephone or letter writing materials.

Privacy/Dignity (showers, bathrooms)		People have to use the toilet in open spaces and there is no privacy but for a short wall. There appeared to be two for nearly 200 people. There are limited toilets for large numbers of people. People are forced to sleep on the floor and they do not have access to toothbrushes (at least two people asked for them).		

Special needs populations (pregnant, non-ambulatory, hearing impaired, mentally ill, medical conditions, developmental disability)	U	People with severe mental illness were handcuffed to benches in the medical clinic and throughout booking front and in the classification area. One man was standing completely naked in the middle of the classification area. Other severely ill people were walking around the clinic, several were yelling out obscenities.

2. Nutrition Quality/concerns	U	It does not appear as though people receive any kind of regular meals while processing into housing. Several people told us they were hungry and asked for help getting sandwiches. A couple of individuals in a special population cell said they were allergic to peanut butter and were only provided peanut butter and jelly sandwiches.

Inspection Detail for # 1
The IRC continues to be very overcrowded, and people are living in deeply problematic conditions. SBC was there during an evening on June 16th (see previous inspection report) and things today - mid-day on a Thursday - continue to be as bad, if not worse. We saw 20+ people sleeping on the floor throughout the clinic, very mentally ill individuals who had not yet received their mental health assessment were walking throughout the clinic and screaming out. Many people reported to us that they had been there for days and begged us to help them. Most of these people are going without psych meds and other medications, all are going without toothbrushes and hot meals, and some were detoxing off drugs or alcohol. There were people handcuffed to benches throughout 'booking front' and we witnessed a mentally ill man who was completely naked standing in the middle of the classification area awaiting his mental health assessment. We also reviewed the computer and saw many people who had been in the clinic and assigned housing but were just waiting to be moved.
As of this report, we have not received a response as to what LASD and CHS are doing to increase the availability of mental health housing and care, for all levels (HOH, MOH, etc). It has been two months since we were last there and it did not appear as though conditions have improved and in fact were worse.
SBC notified LASD command staff of these issues via email on 9/1 and as of noon on 9/7 have yet to receive a response.
