Commission to negotiate, execute, and if necessary, amend, reduce or terminate a HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) agreement, and all related documents, with Olson Land Opportunities II, LLC, in the amount of up to \$3,017,000 for the purpose of providing commitment of home buyer financing to qualified lower-income home buyers for the purchase of single-family homes (Project); negotiate, execute, and if necessary, amend, reduce, or terminate the HOME Program agreements with each of the 11 qualified lower-income home buyers, and all related documents, including but not limited to promissory notes, deeds of trust, and documents to subordinate the loans to the first mortgage, for the sole purpose of providing down payment assistance to each qualified lower-income home buyer; incorporate, as needed, up to \$3,017,000 in HOME funds into the Community Development Commission's Fiscal Year 2017-18 budget; and reallocate funds set aside for affordable housing development at the time of project funding to better align project funds with available resources, within the project's approved HOME funding limit, in line with project needs, and within the requirements for each funding source. 1-H. Recommendation: Acting as a responsible agency pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act, certify that the Housing Authority has considered the Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) for the development of 94 single-family homes, located at 13024 Salinas Avenue in unincorporated Willowbrook (Property) (2), which was prepared by the Department of Regional Planning as lead agency, and find that this project will not cause a significant impact on the environment; authorize the Executive Director of the Housing Authority to execute and, if necessary, amend or terminate a Disposition and Development agreement with Olson Land Opportunities II, LLC (Developer), for the conveyance of a 9.5-acre Housing Authority-owned site; approve the sale of the Property to the Developer in the amount of \$3,000,000 and authorize the Executive Director to execute a seller carryback loan agreement, including deed of trust, promissory note and all related documents, and negotiate, execute and, if necessary, amend, reduce, or terminate the loan agreements with each of the 19 qualified moderate-income home buyers, and all related documents to subordinate the loans to the first mortgage, for the sole purpose of providing down payment assistance to each moderate-income home buyer. ### III. PUBLIC HEARINGS 1-7

1. Hearing on the annexation of 23 parcels into the Consolidated Sewer Maintenance District (Parcel Nos. 101-16 through 108-16 and 213-16 through 227-16) within unincorporated territories of Athens, Rolling Hills (Westfield), Rowland Heights, South Whittier, West Carson, and Willowbrook and the Cities of Artesia, Carson, Glendora, La Mirada, Paramount, Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills Estates, San Dimas, Santa Fe Springs, and Walnut (1, 2, 4, and 5); levy annual sewer service charges within the annexed parcels for the operation and maintenance of sewer facilities for Fiscal Year 2018-19; adopt a resolution approving and accepting negotiations that there will be no exchange of property tax revenues as a result of the annexation; and find that the annexations and levying of sewer service charges are to meet operational expenses to maintain service within the proposed annexation areas and are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. - 5. Instructed the Director of Public Works to file the necessary statement of boundary change with the State Board of Equalization and the County's Assessor's Office; and
- 6. Instructed the Director of Public Works to report back to the Board with a review of the entire list of impacted parcels to determine whether they are incorrectly listed as being within the annexed area and/or are eligible for a fee waiver.
