Statement of Superior Court Judge David Horowitz supporting effectiveness of Probation Department's 14-Day Probation Report Program in reducing jail time served and jail overcrowding.

Statement of Betty Rosenstein, President of the Probation Commission, supporting funding needs of the Probation Department.

Statement of Ilona Lewis, Chief Deputy, Chief Medical Examiner-Coroner, regarding the Department's unmet needs and requesting \$902,466 additional funding for various programs.

Statement of Captain William Gartland, Chief of the Robbery/Homicide Division, Los Angeles Police Department, supporting needs of the Chief Medical Examiner-Coroner's Department.

Statement of Richard Callahan, Los Angeles County Funeral Directors Association, requesting Board to provide funding to implement recommendations in the audit of the Chief Medical Examiner-Coroner's Department.

Statement of Leon Spaughy, Agricultural Commissioner/Weights and Measures, regarding the Department's unmet needs for Public Awareness/Education Programs relating to fruit flies and Inspector II positions.

Statement of Steve Valdivia, Community Youth Gang Services, regarding benefits of Community Youth Gang Services Program and requesting increased funding of Program.

Statement of Peter Baxter, private citizen, regarding overall County budget and in particular, the Grand Jury.

Statement of Sue Crumpton, House of Ruth in Pomona, regarding decreasing marriage license fees and resulting decrease in funds allocated for domestic violence shelters (Presley Bill) and requesting the Board's assistance to identify alternate funding sources; also statements of Ruth Abisher, YWCA Wings in West Covina and Blanca Malparida, Rainbow Services Shelter in San Pedro.

Statement of Ruth Schwartz, Executive Director, Shelter Partnership, requesting \$100,000 grant.

Statement of Art Jones, Supervisor, Jesse Owens Park, regarding the Parks and Recreation Department's budget and the benefits of recreation in the prevention of drugs and crime.

Statement of Kay Allen, Eligibility Worker, Department of Public Social Services, regarding Department of Public Social Services' Eligibility Worker caseloads and staffing deficiencies. Also written statement of Janice Netterville, Local 660/Department of Public Social Services.

Statement of Diana Fortune, President of the Los Angeles County Commission on Aging, supporting transfer of Adult Protective Services from the Department of Public Social Services to the Department of Community and Senior Citizens Services; also statement of Sandra King, Executive Director of Jewish Family Services.
