# 2-D. Authority to Enter into Lease, with Option to Purchase, of the West Los Angeles Courthouse and Adoption of Resolution for Solicitation of Development Proposals

Recommendation as submitted by Supervisor Kuehl: Authorize the Executive Director of the Los Angeles County Development Authority (LACDA) acting on behalf of the County, to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) and execute and, if necessary, amend a memorandum of understanding with LACDA to state forth the duties and responsibilities of each entity in managing the West Los Angeles Courthouse located at 1633 Purdue Avenue in the City of Los Angeles (Property); authorize the use of the County's Catalytic Development Fund (CDF) in an amount up to \$800,000 to pay for predevelopment costs during the predevelopment period for the Property; authorize rental revenue generated from the Property during the 24-month option period to be reinvested in the CDF; authorize the Executive Director to amend the existing contracts to be effective upon execution by all parties with Alliance Land Care, Inc. to increase the annual compensation amount by \$63,000 for the fourth year of the contract, to a total of \$313,000, and \$64,500 for the fifth year of the contract, to a total of \$314,500, for landscaping services, and Absolute International Security and General Security Service to increase the aggregate annual compensation amount by \$109,500 for the fourth year of the contract, to a total of \$359,500 and \$113,000 for the fifth year of the contract, to a total of \$363,000, for security guard services; and find that the lease of the property is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. ## 3-D. Multifamily Affordable Rental Housing Developments Funding and Environmental Documentation

Recommendation: Acting as a responsible agency pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act, certify that the Los Angeles County Development Authority (LACDA) has considered the exemption determination for the Lake House, 619 Westlake Apartments, Washington LA Apartments, HiFi Collective, Chesterfield, Amani Apartments, Mariposa Lily and the Sylmar II Projects (1, 2 and 3), which were prepared by the City of Los Angeles as lead agency, and find that these projects will not cause a significant impact on the environment; approve loans to various developers using up to a total of \$44,770,000 in No Place Like Home (NPLH) Funds, contingent upon the transfer of NPLH Funds from the State Department of Housing and Community Development to LACDA; and authorize the Executive Director of the Los Angeles County Development Authority to take the following related actions:

In consultation with the Director of Mental Health, execute, and if necessary, amend or reduce the loan agreements with the developers, or their LACDA-approved designees, and all related documents including, but not limited to, documents to subordinate the loans to construction and permanent financing, and any intergovernmental, interagency or inter-creditor agreements necessary for the implementation of each development;

Accept and incorporate, as needed, up to \$44,770,000 in NPLH Funds into LACDA's approved Fiscal Year 2019-20 budget, and future fiscal year budgets, as needed for the purposes described herein; and

Reallocate LACDA funding set aside for affordable housing at the time of project funding, as needed, and within each project's approved funding limit, in line with each project's needs and within the requirements for each funding source. (19-6984)

# 2. Authority to Enter into Lease, with Option to Purchase, of the West Los Angeles Courthouse and Adoption of Resolution for Solicitation of Development Proposals

## 12. Protecting Los Angeles County Residents from Seasonal Outbreaks of Influenza
