### I. SET MATTER 10:30 A.M.

#### S-1. Public Health Order

Discussion of the Public Health Order related to COVID-19, as requested by the Chair of the Board. (20-4861)

Dr. Genevieve Clavreul addressed the Board. Interested person(s) also submitted written testimony.

Dr. Barbara Ferrer, Director of Public Health, and Lawrence Hafetz, Chief Deputy, County Counsel, addressed the Board and responded to questions.

Supervisors Barger and Hahn made a joint motion to instruct the Director of Public Health to:

1. Implement the school waiver program for grades TK-2, starting at 30 schools per week, prioritizing issuance of waivers to schools with higher percentages of students qualified for free/reduced meals equally divided among the five Supervisorial Districts and any unclaimed waivers for any given week to be redistributed to schools with higher percentage of students qualified for free or reduced meals to reach the cap 30 schools per week irrespective of the Supervisorial District;

- Report back to the Board bi-weekly with updates on the waiver application process and compliance at reopened schools as well as any changes that ought to be made to the contact tracing workflow in order to improve the quality and quantity of data recorded with regard to school exposures; and
- 3. Work with County Counsel to determine if additional measures should be taken to certify that all protocols have been properly implemented prior to school reopenings and include any compliance updates in the bi-weekly report backs to the Board.

After discussion, on motion of Supervisor Barger, seconded by Supervisor Hahn, said motion was duly carried by the following vote:

Supervisor Solis made a motion to amend Supervisors Hahn and Barger's joint motion to adopt the Director of Public Health's recommendation to allow cardrooms to operate outdoors with safety measures prepared by the Department of Public Health, including appropriate physical distancing, mandated masks, and no provision of food or drink. Supervisors Hahn and Barger accepted Supervisor Solis' amendment.

# 8. Addressing the Needs of Unaccompanied Women Experiencing Homelessness

Recommendation as submitted by Supervisors Solis and Barger: Recognize unaccompanied women experiencing homelessness as a unique population with specific needs that requires targeted strategies and resources and designate unaccompanied women as a recognized homeless subpopulation in Los Angeles County; instruct the Executive Director of the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority to incorporate data on unaccompanied women into its pre-existing public-facing dashboards indicating race, gender, age, geography, sexual orientation, Domestic Violence/Intimate Partner Violence status, etc., in the Annual Point-in-Time Count and additional Homeless Management Information System data analysis; and take the following actions:

Instruct the Director of the Homeless Initiative and the Executive Director of the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority, to report back to the Board within 60 days with a plan to conduct a Countywide Women's Needs Assessment, documenting the experiences, as well as the housing and service needs of women experiencing homelessness in the County, including a focus on unaccompanied women, this Needs Assessment would include policy recommendations and be a collaboration with the Downtown Women's Center, academic institutions, the Departments of Health Services, Mental Health and Public Health, the Los Angeles County Development Authority, Office of Immigrant Affairs in the Department of Consumer and Business Affairs, and other relevant County Departments and Agencies;

Direct the Acting Chief Executive Officer to report back to the Board within 60 days with an update regarding whether funding in any or all Measure H-funded Homeless Initiative strategies, beginning in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Measure H Funding Recommendations, should be set aside to address the needs of women experiencing homelessness, specifically unaccompanied women;

Instruct the County's Legislative Advocates in Sacramento to support State legislative and budget proposals that would require a minimum allocation of State homelessness funding, such as the Homeless Emergency Aid Program or the Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention Program, be spent on services that meet the specific needs of unaccompanied women experiencing homelessness; and

Instruct the County's Legislative Advocates in Washington, D.C. to support the prioritization of unaccompanied women as a homeless subpopulation in the United Sates Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Point-In-Time count, through a targeted funding initiative in HUD's next Notice of Funding Availability, and via the designation of unaccompanied women as a subpopulation to achieve the focus and results previously advanced for other populations. #### 10. Ensuring the Long-Term Viability of the Family Assistance Program

Revised recommendation as submitted by Supervisors Ridley-Thomas and Kuehl: Instruct the Inspector General, in consultation with County Counsel, the Director of Mental Health and the Chief Medical Examiner-Coroner, and request the Sheriff, to report back to the Board in writing in 15 days with an assessment of the response to the deaths of Dijon Kizzee and Andres Guardado by all relevant County Departments, as well as the utilization of the Family Assistance Program (FAP), including response times and any resources provided to the families of Mr. Kizzee

and Mr. Guardado; instruct the Director of Public Health and the Acting Chief Executive Officer, in collaboration with County Counsel, the Director of Mental Health, the Chief Medical Examiner-Coroner, the Executive Director of the Civilian Oversight Commission, the Inspector General, community and other relevant stakeholders, and request the Sheriff, to report back to the Board in writing in 30 days with an overall review of the FAP, including outcomes to date and recommendations for improving the FAP, including addressing the tax burden imposed on families by the FAP's dispersal of benefits, identifying the ideal lead Department for the FAP, developing a clear mission statement and outcome measures, strategies for gaining the trust of impacted families to provide them with FAP services, streamlining of any processes to provide services in a timely manner and a long-term funding plan; direct the Acting Chief Executive Officer, in consultation with the Inspector General and County Counsel, to identify funding options to continue the FAP beyond the one-time carryover referenced above, and develop a proposed plan to cover staffing, burial expenses, supplies and other associated costs needed to sustain the FAP and report back to the Board in writing in 30 days.
