AUTHORIZED THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE HOUSING AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO RECEIVE FROM HUD A TOTAL OF \$5,768,891 IN CAPITAL FUND PROGRAM FUNDS FOR RESIDENT PROGRAMS, OPERATING COSTS, AND THE REHABILITATION OF 1,337 HOUSING UNITS AT SIX CONVENTIONAL PUBLIC HOUSING PROGRAM DEVELOPMENTS THROUGHOUT LOS ANGELES COUNTY; AND

6. AUTHORIZED THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE HOUSING AUTHORITY TO INCORPORATE INTO THE AGENCY PLAN ALL PUBLIC COMMENTS RECEIVED AND APPROVED BY THE BOARD FOR INCLUSION IN THE PLAN, AND TO SUBMIT THE AGENCY PLAN TO HUD BY APRIL 17, 2004.
