11	SHORTLY.WE HAVE OUR CHIEF EXECUTIVEOFFICER, OUR COUNTY
12	COUNSEL, THEEXECUTIVE OFFICE AND OURSERGEANT AT ARMS HERE TO
13	ASSIST.AND WE'LL BEGIN THIS MORNINGWITH OUR INVOCATION.IF
14	YOU'RE ABLE, PLEASE RISE.AND THEN STAY STANDING FOR OURPLEDGE
15	AFTER THAT.

17	RABBI DALIA SAMANSKY: GOODMORNING.THIS WEEK, JEWS AROUND THE
18	WORLD WILL READABOUT MIRIAM'S DEATH IN THE DESERT AND THE
19	RESULTING LACK OF WATER IN THEISRAELITE CAMP. THE PEOPLE WILL
20	ONCE AGAINCOMPLAIN, AND MOSES WILL ONCEAGAIN GO TO GOD FOR
21	HELP.GOD WILL INSTRUCT MOSES TOGATHER THE PEOPLE AND SPEAK
22	TOTHE ROCK SO THAT THE ROCK CANSPROUT FORTH WATER.INSTEAD,
23	MOSES WILL GATHER THEPEOPLE, CHASTISE THEM FOR BEINGREBELS,
24	STRIKE THE ROCK, NOTONCE BUT TWICE, AND WATER WILLCOME
25	FORTH PREDICTABLY, GOD IS NOT HAPPY ANDTELLS BOTH MOSES AND

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- 1 AARON THAT THEYWILL NOT BE ALLOWED INTO THEPROMISED LAND FOR
- 2 THEIR ACTIONS.MANY SCHOLARS DEBATE WHETHERMOSES DESERVED SUCH
- 3 A HARSHTREATMENT, YET AARON'SPUNISHMENT SEEMS EVEN
- 4 MORECURIOUS.AFTER ALL, HE DIDN'T DOANYTHING.NOT DOING
- 5 ANYTHING, SAY OURSCHOLARS, WAS HIS DOWNFALL.AARON'S SIN WAS
- 6 STANDINGSILENTLY BY AS MOSESAS MOSES BLATANTLYDISOBEYED
- 7 ORDERS.NOT ONCE DO WE HEAR AARON TRYING TOREMIND MOSES THAT HE
- 8 WAS COMMANDED TO SPEAK TOTHE ROCK, NOT CHASTISE THE
- 9 ISRAELITES. AND AARON AGAIN STANDS SILENTLY BY AS MOSESTAKING
- 10 CREDIT FOR BRINGING THE WATER, RATHER THAN ATTRIBUTING IT TO
- 11 GOD.SO, WHILE AARON HIMSELF DIDN'T DOANYTHING, HIS SILENCE IN
- 12 THEFACE OF WRONGDOING WAS SEEN ASWORTHY OF DIVINE
- 13 PUNISHMENT.IT IS WITH THAT LESSON IN MYHEART THAT I OFFER THIS
- 14 PRAYERTHIS MORNING.OUR WORLD IS BROKEN.MAY WE SEE ITS
- 15 BROKENNESS AND NOTTURN AWAY.AS PARTNERS WITH OUR CREATOR, MAY
- 16 WE ENGAGE IN THE HOLY WORKOF REPAIRING OUR WORLD ANDCREATING
- 17 THE KIND OF COMMUNITY THATWE OURSELVES WISH TO LIVE IN.AS OUR
- 18 SAGES TEACH US, IT IS NOTINCUMBENT UPON US TO FINISH THETASK,
- 19 BUT NEITHER ARE WE FREE TODESIST FROM IT.AS WE GO OUT FROM
- 20 HERE, MAY WEREMEMBER TO SEE IN EACH ANDEVERY PERSON THAT WE
- 21 INTERACTWITH THE SPARK OF DIVINEHOLINESS THAT REMINDS US THAT
- 22 WEARE MORE ALIKE THAN DIFFERENT.MAY WE SEE THE PAIN OF
- 23 OURFELLOW HUMANS REGARDLESS OFINCOME, COLOR, NATIONALITY
- 24 ORSEXUAL ORIENTATION AND RESPONDWITH KINDNESS, JUSTICE
- 25 ANDINTEGRITY.MAY WE SEE THE HOMELESS AMONG USAND RESPOND WITH

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- 1 EMPATHY, NOT BYSHIELDING OUR EYES.MAY WE HEAR THE WOMEN WHO
- 2 AREBRAVE ENOUGH TO SPEAK OUT ANDRESPOND WITH ENCOURAGEMENT,
- 3 NOTDOUBT.AND MAY WE HEAR THE CRIES OF THECHILDREN WHO STAND
- 4 BEFORE USSCARED, ALONE AND HELPLESS ANDMAY WE RESPOND WITH
- 5 COMPASSION, WITH CARE AND WITH HUMANITY. ONLY WHEN WE SEE THE
- 6 SUFFERINGOF OUR FELLOW HUMANS AS OUR OWNAND RESPOND WITH HOLY
- 7 ACTION, NOT SILENCE, CAN WE ONCE AGAINHOPE TO BE THE BEACON OF
- 8 LIGHTUPON THE WORLD.MAY WE HEED THE WORDS OF THEWISE RABBI
- 9 JOACHIM PRINZ, AGERMAN REFUGEE WHO SPOKE ON THESTEPS OF
- 10 WASHINGTON IN 1963DIRECTLY BEFORE REVERENDER. MARTIN LUTHERAN
- 11 KING, JR.DELIVERED HIS "I HAVE A DREAM"SPEECH.IN THOSE MOMENTS
- 12 BEFORE WE WERESO MOVED BY DR. KING'S SPEECH, WE WERE REMINDED
- 13 BY RABBI PRINZ, "WHEN I WAS A RABBI OF THEJEWISH COMMUNITY OF
- 14 BERLIN UNDERTHE HITLER REGIME, I LEARNEDMANY THINGS. THE MOST
- 15 IMPORTANT THING ILEARNED UNDER THOSE TRAGICCIRCUMSTANCES WAS
- 16 THAT BIGOTRYAND HATRED ARE NOT OUR MOSTURGENT PROBLEMS. THE
- 17 MOST URGENT, THE MOSTDISGRACEFUL, THE MOST SHAMEFUL ANDAND THE
- 18 MOST TRAGIC PROBLEM ISSILENCE. "MAY WE INDIVIDUALLY
- 19 ANDCOMMUNALLY HAVE THE MORALFORTITUDE TO SPEAK OUT
- 20 AGAINSTINJUSTICE, WHETHER COMMITTED BYTHE LEADERS OF OUR
- 21 COUNTRY OR BYITS CITIZENS.AS DR. KING TEACHES US, INJUSTICE
- 22 ANYWHERE IS A THREATTO JUSTICE EVERYWHERE.MAY WE BE THE
- 23 BEARERS OF JUSTICEAND LIGHT UPON OUR GREATCOMMUNITY.AMEN.
