5	SUP. KATHRYN BARGER, CHAIR: WE WILL START THE BOARD MEETING IN
6	ONE MINUTE. ALL RIGHT. GOOD MORNING, EVERYONE. WE WELCOME YOU
7	TO THE REGULARLY SCHEDULED MEETING OF THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY
8	BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. TODAY IS TUESDAY, JANUARY 28TH, 2020.
9	BEFORE WE START THIS BOARD MEETING, I WOULD LIKE US ALL TO
10	TAKE A MOMENT OF SILENCE TO REMEMBER THOSE THAT PERISHED IN
11	THE CALABASAS HELICOPTER CRASH: MANY FAMILIES, INCLUDING KOBE
12	BRYANT. SO IF WE COULD TAKE A MOMENT OF SILENCE, PLEASE? THANK
13	YOU. I'D JUST LIKE TO MAKE A FEW REMARKS. KOBE BRYANT WAS A
14	WORLD-RENOWNED BASKETBALL SUPERSTAR THAT PLAYED FOR THE LOS
15	ANGELES LAKERS, AND HAD A CAREER THAT SPANNED 20 SEASONS.
16	CONSIDERED ONE OF THE GREATEST TO PLAY THE GAME, HE HELPED
17	LEAD THE LOS ANGELES LAKERS TO FIVE CHAMPIONSHIPS, THE UNITED
18	STATES BASKETBALL TEAM TO TWO GOLD MEDALS, AND WON THE ACADEMY
19	AWARD FOR HIS FILM ON BASKETBALL. KNOWN AS THE "BLACK MAMBA,"
20	KOBE WAS KNOWN FOR HIS FIERCE COMPETITIVENESS AND HIS INFAMOUS
21	MAMBA MENTALITY. HE WAS FLUENT IN ITALIAN AND SPANISH, HAVING
22	GROWN UP IN ITALY, WHERE HIS FATHER PLAYED BASKETBALL. HE
23	SERVED AS AN INSPIRATION TO MILLIONS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY AND
24	ACROSS THE WORLD, WITH ONE OF HIS COUNTLESS LEGACIES EVIDENT
25	IN THE SCORES OF FANS IMITATING HIS JUMP SHOT, YELLING "KOBE"

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- 1 AS THEY TAKE A SHOT. HE IS SURVIVED BY HIS WIFE VANESSA, AND
- 2 DAUGHTERS NATALIA, BIANKA, AND CAPRI. BUT LET US ALSO REMEMBER
- 3 HIS DAUGHTER GIANNA, AS WELL AS THOSE OTHERS THAT PERISHED IN
- 4 THIS HORRIBLE ACCIDENT. THANK YOU, MEMBERS. ALL RIGHT. SO THE
- 5 INNOVATION TODAY WILL BE LED BY HUI CHI, OF GUANG SHAN HSI LAI
- 6 TEMPLE IN THE FIFTH DISTRICT, FOLLOWED BY THE PLEDGE OF
- 7 ALLEGIANCE, LED BY HECTOR ARMANDO SANCHEZ, FORMER CORPORAL IN
- 8 THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS, IN THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES,
- 9 FROM THE SECOND DISTRICT.

- 11 VENERABLE HUI CHI: A VERY GOOD MORNING TO ALL THE MEMBERS OF
- 12 THE L.A. COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AS WELL AS ALL OUR
- 13 COUNCIL MEMBERS. I'M HONORED TO REPRESENT HSI LAI TEMPLE AND
- 14 ABBOT VENERABLE HUI DONG, TO PERFORM THIS INVOCATION. SO I
- 15 WILL CONVEY THE WORDS OF WISDOM WRITTEN BY OUR FOUNDER,
- 16 VENERABLE MASTER HSING YUN, WITH HIS PRAYER FOR OUR PEOPLE OF
- 17 ALL VOCATIONS AND ENDEAVORS. SO, MAY WE ALL JOIN OUR PALMS? O
- 18 GREAT, COMPASSIONATE BUDDHA, WE HAVE ALL DEVOUTLY GATHERED IN
- 19 FRONT OF YOU. SOME OF US SERVE IN ORGANIZATIONS OF INDUSTRY,
- 20 COMMERCE, OR ENTERPRISE. SOME WORK FOR INSTITUTIONS OF
- 21 GOVERNMENT, EDUCATION, MILITARY, OR LAW ENFORCEMENT. SOME ARE
- 22 HOUSEWIVES, SOME ARE RETIRED, LIVING IN WELL-EARNED
- 23 TRANOUILITY. WE OFTEN FEEL IMPERFECTION IN OURSELVES. WE OFTEN
- 24 SENSE THE HARDSHIPS IN OUR LIVES. O BUDDHA, GREAT
- 25 COMPASSIONATE BUDDHA, WE PEOPLE OF ALL VOCATIONS AND ENDEAVORS

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- 1 ARE HERE IN FRONT OF YOU TODAY TO PRAY TO YOU, O GREAT BUDDHA.
- 2 WE DO NOT ASK IN HOPE OF ENLIGHTENMENT NOW. WE PRAY THAT YOU
- 3 WILL ENABLE US TO BECOME KIND PEOPLE. WE DO NOT ASK IN HOPE TO
- 4 ELIMINATE ALL WORRIES. WE PRAY THAT YOU WILL ENABLE US TO HAVE
- 5 FEWER WORRIES. O GREAT, COMPASSIONATE BUDDHA, FOR THE GUIDING
- 6 LIGHT OF YOUR COMPASSION, MAY OUR LABORS FOR DILIGENT EFFORT
- 7 APPLY THEMSELVES TO INCREASE PRODUCTIVITY, TO BESTOW GREAT
- 8 CONTRIBUTIONS UPON OUR NATION. MAY OUR FARMERS STRIVE TO
- 9 PRODUCE BOUNTIFUL HARVEST AND INCREASED VARIETY TO ENSURE THAT
- 10 PEOPLE NEVER LACK THE BASIC NECESSITIES. MAY OUR BUSINESS
- 11 SECTOR FURTHER PROMOTE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT, SEEK
- 12 PROFITABLE RETURNS ON INVESTMENTS, TO PROVIDE NUMEROUS
- 13 CONVENIENCES FOR THE COMMUNITY. MAY TEACHERS GUIDE AND PROTECT
- 14 YOUR PUPILS, FOSTER TALENT THROUGH EDUCATION, TO ELEVATE
- 15 SOCIETY TO BRIGHTER AND WIDER HORIZONS. MAY PARENTS RAISE
- 16 THEIR CHILDREN WITH LOVE, ABIDE HONESTLY BY PRINCIPLES TO
- 17 ESTABLISH FINE MODELS FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS. O GREAT,
- 18 COMPASSIONATE BUDDHA, WE PRAY THAT WE, PEOPLE OF EVERY SOCIAL
- 19 STATUS, FOR THE NURTURE AND PROTECTION OF YOUR IMMEASURABLE
- 20 KINDNESS, MAY WE ALL FOLLOW THE DHARMA FAITHFULLY, UPHOLD THE
- 21 FIVE PRECEPTS, DEVOTE OURSELVES TO ELIMINATE ALL WRONGDOINGS,
- 22 STRIVE TO DO GOOD, AND HAVE THE UNDERSTANDING OF THE LAW AND
- 23 CAUSE AND EFFECT, REPENT OUR KARMIC HINDRANCES, CULTIVATE
- 24 POSITIVE AFFINITIES WITH OTHERS, AND BENEFIT SOCIETY. O GREAT,
- 25 COMPASSIONATE BUDDHA, THROUGH THE GREAT ASSISTANCE OF YOUR

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- 1 WISDOM, WE PRAY THAT WE, PEOPLE OF EVERY VOCATION AND
- 2 ENDEAVOR, MAY CULTIVATE OURSELVES IN SPEECH AND THOUGHTS, SET
- 3 OURSELVES RIGHT, AND HELP OTHERS REFORM. STRENGTHEN THE BONDS
- 4 AMONG RELATIVES AND OTHERS, BRING HARMONY TO OUR FAMILY, AND
- 5 ORDER TO OUR NATION. UNDERSTAND THE PRINCIPLE OF DEPENDENT
- 6 ORIGINATION. REALIZE THE TRUTHS OF INTERDEPENDENCE AND
- 7 COEXISTENCE. CARRY OUT THE TEACHINGS OF THE EIGHTFOLD NOBLE
- 8 PATH, AND TO LIVE A FULFILLING AND NOBLE LIFE. O GREAT,
- 9 COMPASSIONATE BUDDHA, WE SINCERELY REVEAL OUR HEARTS TO YOU.
- 10 WE PRAY THAT YOU AID ALL PEOPLE IN THE WORLD, TO ELIMINATE
- 11 GREED, ANGER, AND IGNORANCE, AND TO DILIGENTLY CULTIVATE
- 12 PRECEPTS, MEDITATION, AND WISDOM. WE PRAY THAT WE ENCOURAGE
- 13 ALL SENTIENT BEINGS IN THE UNIVERSE TO LEARN RESPECT AND
- 14 TOLERANCE, AND TO LIVE IN PERFECT HARMONY WITHOUT DISPUTE. O
- 15 GREAT, COMPASSIONATE BUDDHA, PLEASE HEAR OUR SINCERE AND PIOUS
- 16 PRAYER. O GREAT, COMPASSIONATE BUDDHA, PLEASE HEAR OUR SINCERE
- 17 AND PIOUS PRAYER. THANK YOU.

- 20 PLACE YOUR RIGHT HAND OVER YOUR HEART, PLEASE. I PLEDGE

- 22 THE REPUBLIC FOR WHICH IT STANDS: ONE NATION UNDER GOD,

- 2 VENERABLE HUI CHI FOR LEADING US IN THIS MORNING'S INVOCATION.
- 3 VENERABLE CHI WAS BORN IN MALAYSIA. HE MAJORED IN ARCHITECTURE
- 4 AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW SOUTH WALES, SIDNEY, IN 2009. HE WAS
- 5 ORDAINED AS A BUDDHIST MONK AT FO GUANG SHAN MONASTERY IN
- 6 TAIWAN, IN 2011. HE SERVED AT FO GUANG SHAN MONASTERY
- 7 HEADQUARTERS AS THE SECRETARY OF THE DOMESTIC AND OVERSEAS
- 8 EXECUTIVE COUNCIL. HE LATER SERVED AS THE ABBOT'S ASSISTANT AT
- 9 THE THAI KU TEMPLE ING THAILAND. HE CURRENTLY SERVES AT THE
- 10 HSI LAI TEMPLE, WHERE HE ARRIVED IN OCTOBER OF 2019. HE
- 11 OVERSEES OUTREACH PROJECTS, WHERE HE ASSISTS IN ORGANIZING
- 12 COMMUNITY CLASSES, NEIGHBORHOOD GATHERINGS, INTERFAITH
- 13 PRAYERS, AND OTHER PROJECTS. VENERABLE CHI, THANK YOU FOR
- 14 LEADING US IN THE INVOCATION THIS MORNING, AND FOR YOUR
- 15 SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY, AND THOSE INSPIRATIONAL WORDS. THANK
- 16 YOU. [APPLAUSE.]

- 19 CHAIR. I'M PLEASED TO INTRODUCE HECTOR ARMANDO SANCHEZ, WHO
- 20 SERVED IN THE U.S. MARINE CORPS FROM 2008 TO 2012, AND
- 21 ATTAINED THE RANK OF CORPORAL. DURING HIS TIME IN THE MARINE
- 22 CORPS, HE WAS STATIONED AT ITS TWENTYNINE PALMS BASE IN
- 23 CALIFORNIA, AND SERVED WITH THE THIRD LIGHT ARMOR
- 24 RECONNAISSANCE BATTALION HEADQUARTERS' COMPANY SUPPLY UNIT.
- 25 MR. SANCHEZ SAW COMBAT DURING OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM IN IRAQ,

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- AND OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM IN AFGHANISTAN. HE IS THE 1
- RECIPIENT OF SEVERAL DECORATIONS, INCLUDING THE SEA SERVICE 2
- 3 DEPLOYMENT RIBBON, THE NATIONAL DEFENSE SERVICE MEDAL, THE
- AFGHANISTAN CAMPAIGN MEDAL, AND THE GLOBAL WAR ON TERRORISM 4
- 5 SERVICE MEDAL. MR. SANCHEZ ATTENDED THE WEST VALLEY LEADERSHIP
- ACADEMY, FORMERLY IN CANOGA PARK, AND THE UNIVERSITY OF 6
- 7 PHOENIX, WHERE HE EARNED A BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN PSYCHOLOGY IN
- 8 2015. HE IS CURRENTLY PURSUING A MASTER'S DEGREE IN SOCIAL
- 9 WORK, AND IS IN HIS FINAL SEMESTER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF
- SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. MR. SANCHEZ IS CURRENTLY AN INTERMEDIATE 10
- 11 TYPIST CLERK FOR THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN
- AND FAMILY SERVICES, AND HAS BEEN WITH THE DEPARTMENT SINCE 12
- 13 2013. HE ASPIRES TO BECOME A LICENSED SOCIAL WORKER WITH THE
- DEPARTMENT. MR. SANCHEZ HAS BEEN A RESIDENT OF THE SECOND 14
- DISTRICT FOR NOW SEVEN YEARS. AND SO WE WISH TO SAY TO YOU, 15
- 16 MR. SANCHEZ, THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE TO OUR NATION AND YOUR
- SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY, YOUR SERVICE TO THE COUNTY OF LOS 17
- 18 ANGELES, AND FOR LEADING US IN TODAY'S PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

- 2 SUP. SHEILA KUEHL: THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR. HERE ARE MY HEROES
- 3 COMING UP ON THE STAGE NOW. I THINK WE'VE PROBABLY ALL HAD
- 4 MOMENTS WHEN WE WISH WE COULD JUST KIND OF WAVE A MAGIC WAND
- 5 AND SOLVE HOMELESSNESS. BUT ALAS, THAT HAS NOT BEEN THE CASE.
- 6 INSTEAD, IT IS A CRISIS THAT IS GOING TO REQUIRE A GREAT,
- 7 GREAT MANY OF US TO GET INVOLVED, AND ACTUALLY TO REALLY PUT
- 8 SOME SKIN IN THE GAME, AS THEY SAY. HUNDREDS OF PEOPLE, AS YOU
- 9 KNOW, VOLUNTEERED LAST WEEK TO JOIN THE HOMELESS COUNT.
- 10 HOMEOWNERS AROUND THE COUNTY ARE BUILDING GRANNY FLATS IN
- 11 THEIR BACKYARD TO HELP CREATE NEW APARTMENTS WITH THE HELP OF
- 12 THE COUNTY, AND PEOPLE CAN MOVE IN WHO NEED THEM. PROPERTY
- 13 OWNERS ARE JOINING THE COUNTY'S LEASE UP LOS ANGELES PROGRAM,
- 14 AND TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE INCENTIVES THAT WE'RE OFFERING
- 15 LANDLORDS WHO ARE RENTING TO FORMERLY HOMELESS MEN AND WOMEN.
- 16 SO TODAY, I THINK IT'S REALLY APPROPRIATE, AND I'M VERY HAPPY
- 17 TO BE ABLE TO THANK A FEW, JUST A FEW, OF OUR STAR PROPERTY
- 18 OWNERS, AS WELL AS THE FINE PEOPLE AT P.A.T.H., WHO MANAGE
- 19 THIS PROGRAM FOR THE COUNTY. PROPERTY OWNERS THAT WE ARE
- 20 HONORING TODAY HAVE BEEN MEETING REGULARLY OUT OF THEIR OWN
- 21 ACCORD, VOLUNTEERING, SHOWING UP, WITH PEOPLE ASSISTING THE
- 22 HOMELESS P.A.T.H., WITH L.A.H.S.A., WITH THE L.A. COUNTY
- 23 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY AND THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF
- 24 L.A., TO PROVIDE MEANINGFUL FEEDBACK ON OUR HOUSING PROGRAMS,
- 25 BECAUSE WE CAN DO A LOT OF STUFF, BUT WE HAVE TO KNOW, IS IT

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- 1 WORKING? IS IT WHAT YOU NEED TO HELP KEEP PEOPLE IN THEIR
- 2 HOMES? THEY GIVE US FEEDBACK ON OUR SUBSIDIES, ON OUR OWNER
- 3 INCENTIVES, AND WE'RE VERY, VERY GRATEFUL TO EACH AND EVERY
- 4 ONE OF YOU FOR YOUR WORK THAT ALLOWS US TO CONTINUOUSLY
- 5 IMPROVE OUR PROGRAMS, AND FOR ENCOURAGING OTHER PROPERTY
- 6 OWNERS AND SERVING AS A GREAT EXAMPLE, LIKE SAYING, "THE
- 7 WATER'S FINE, COME ON IN," TO IMPROVE OUR PROGRAMS AND HELP US
- 8 REDUCE HOMELESSNESS. SO I WANT TO RECOGNIZE THE PEOPLE WHO
- 9 STAND BEFORE YOU TODAY. AND THOSE OF YOU WHO ARE WATCHING THIS
- 10 IN THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT, I DON'T KNOW WHY, EXACTLY, BUT I
- 11 WANT YOU TO KNOW THEIR NAMES, AS WELL: THE LEASE UP L.A.
- 12 PROGRAM AND P.A.T.H., SPECIFICALLY JENNIFER LEE, JENNIFER
- 13 HARK-DIETZ, CARLY BERKOWITZ, MARISSA BOWMAN, AND LOIS STARR;
- 14 EMILIO SALAS FROM THE L.A.C.D.A., THOMAS WONG FROM L.A.H.S.A.,
- 15 DAN VALDEZ FROM BRILLIANT CORNERS, DANIEL TANNENBAUM FROM THE
- 16 CALIFORNIA APARTMENT ASSOCIATION, PACIFIC CREST REAL ESTATE.
- 17 HE IS A P.H.A. COMMISSIONER AND A HOUSING PARTNER, AND I DON'T
- 18 THINK HE SLEEPS. HE HAS GOT TOO MANY THINGS THAT HE'S DOING.
- 19 JIM PERLY, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF WESTERN AMERICAN PROPERTIES;
- 20 MALCOLM BENNETT, MINORITY APARTMENT OWNERS ASSOCIATION; STEVEN
- 21 GRAY, VICE PRESIDENT OF PROGRAMS AND DEVELOPMENT AT HELPFUL
- 22 HOUSING; C. FIRST AND KAREN KASHANIAN FROM T.D.I. PROPERTIES.
- 23 I'M GOING TO PROBABLY MANGLE THE NAMES OF MANY OF THE BROWNS,
- 24 BUT THEY ARE EXTREMELY IMPORTANT TO US, A FAMILY BUSINESS THAT
- 25 SHOWED UP IN FORCE TODAY, AND WE ARE VERY, VERY GRATEFUL TO

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- 1 THEM, AS TO OTHERS: NAJIMA BROWN, BASHIR BROWN, YOLANDA BROWN,
- 2 SERDALIR BROWN, FROM BROWN CONGLOMERATES AND HOLDINGS. AND
- 3 AGAIN, APOLOGIES IF I MANGLED THE NAMES, BUT IT DOES NOT CUT
- 4 BACK ON MY GRATITUDE TO YOU AND TO EVERYONE ELSE. AND FINALLY,
- 5 DANIEL YUKELSON AND DANIELLE PERETZ FROM A.G.L.A. SO IF YOU
- 6 WOULD GIVE THEM ALL A MAIN, BIG, HUGE ROUND OF APPLAUSE FOR
- 7 THE WORK THEY'RE DOING AND THE HELP THEY'RE GIVING. AND NOW,
- 8 MAY I ASK JENNIFER, FROM P.A.T.H., TO SPEAK? JEN? THANK YOU.
- 9 WOULD YOU LIKE TO USE MY STEP?

- 11 JENNIFER HARK-DIETZ: I WOULD LIKE TO USE YOUR STEP. THANK YOU.
- 12 GOOD MORNING, EVERYONE, AND THE HONORABLE BOARD OF
- 13 SUPERVISORS. MY NAME IS JENNIFER HARK-DIETZ, AND I'M THE
- 14 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF P.A.T.H. WE ARE GRATEFUL TO BE HERE
- 15 TODAY, AND THANK SUPERVISOR KUEHL FOR HER RECOGNITION OF THE
- 16 CRITICAL ROLE LANDLORDS-- OR, AS WE CALL THEM, HOUSING
- 17 PROVIDERS-- PLAY IN THE SOLUTION TO END HOMELESSNESS. AS A
- 18 SERVICE PROVIDER AND HOUSING DEVELOPER FOCUSED ON ENDING
- 19 HOMELESSNESS, P.A.T.H. CREATED LEASE UP L.A., A LANDLORD
- 20 ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM AND WEB-BASED APPLICATION FOCUSED ON
- 21 INCREASING ACCESS TO AVAILABLE UNITS THROUGHOUT L.A. COUNTY.
- 22 AS PART OF THIS PROGRAM, THE LEASE UP ADVISORY BOARD, AS YOU
- 23 SEE HERE, WAS DEVELOPED, OFFERING VALUABLE FEEDBACK THAT
- 24 POSITIVELY IMPACTS PROGRAM EFFECTIVENESS. THIS GROUP OF
- 25 HOUSING PROVIDERS VOLUNTEERS THEIR TIME, TAKING DIFFICULT

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- 1 HOUSING CHALLENGES IN WHAT WE KNOW IS A VERY TIGHT RENTAL
- 2 MARKET, WITH THE GOAL OF REMOVING BARRIERS AND INCREASING
- 3 ACCESS FOR THOSE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS. TO HAVE A POSITIVE
- 4 IMPACT ON OUR HOMELESS AND HOUSING CRISIS, WE NEED EVERYONE
- 5 FOCUSED ON HELPING PEOPLE MAKE IT HOME. WE ARE GRATEFUL FOR
- 6 THEIR CONTRIBUTION, DEDICATION, AND ONGOING PARTNERSHIP, AND
- 7 WE THANK YOU AGAIN FOR HONORING THEM TODAY. [APPLAUSE.]

- 12 OF RECOGNIZING CANTOR ILAN DAVIDSON FOR HIS 25 YEARS OF

- 20 REINVENTING THE VOTING EXPERIENCE IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY. PART
- 21 OF THAT HAS BEEN, OR THE INCEPTION OF THAT PROJECT, WAS BASED
- 22 ON THE AGE OF OUR EXISTING LEGACY VOTING SYSTEM, THE
- 23 DEFICIENCIES IN THAT SYSTEM TO BE ABLE TO MEET MODERN
- 24 USABILITY FEATURES, ESPECIALLY ON THINGS THAT ARE PARTICULARLY
- 25 IMPORTANT IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY, SUCH AS LANGUAGE ACCESS AND

- 1 ACCESSIBILITY. BUT IN THE COURSE OF DOING THAT PROJECT, WE

- 4 LEGISLATURE, MANDATED THAT, BASED ON A FORMULA THAT OUR LOCAL

- 6 THOSE TO THE EVEN-YEAR CYCLE, THAT INCREASED THE CAPACITY OF

- 17 PHILOSOPHY BEHIND THIS, WHEN WE STARTED IT BACK IN 2009, WAS
- 18 TO ADOPT A HUMAN-CENTERED DESIGN APPROACH, TO LOOK AT THIS
- 19 THROUGH THE LENS OF THE VOTER AND HOW WE COULD IMPROVE THE
- 20 VOTING EXPERIENCE IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY. WE MADE AN EARLY
- 21 DECISION, WITH THE SUPPORT OF THIS BOARD, TO WORK WITH A
- 22 WORLD-RENOWNED DESIGN FIRM, I.D.O., TO APPROACH THIS FROM A
- 23 GRASSROOTS APPROACH: TO DO THE RESEARCH, TO DO THE GROUNDWORK,
- 24 TO TALK TO VOTERS, TO TALK ABOUT POTENTIAL VOTERS, AND TO LOOK
- 25 AT THE WAY IN WHICH PEOPLE INTERACTED WITH THE ELECTORAL

- 6 THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THIS KIND OF CHANGE IN A COUNTY LIKE LOS

- 18 VOTE CENTER PLACEMENT PROJECT MEETINGS, WHERE WE REACHED OUT
- 19 TO THE COMMUNITY, WENT OUT INTO THE COMMUNITY, REALLY MODELED
- 20 AFTER A PROCESS THAT THIS BOARD ENDORSED AFTER THE PARKS BOND
- 21 MEASURE, TO GO INTO THE COMMUNITY AND ASK VOTERS AND MEMBERS
- 22 OF THE COMMUNITIES, "WHERE WOULD YOU ASSOCIATE LOCATIONS WHERE

- 3 US THEIR FEEDBACK, AND THAT ALLOWED US THE OPPORTUNITY BOTH TO
- 4 CHECK OUT OUR CAPACITY FOR SUPPORTING THIS NEW MODEL, BUT ALSO
- 5 TO GET ADDITIONAL FEEDBACK FROM VOTERS TO MAKE FINAL
- 6 REFINEMENTS PRIOR TO OUR IMPLEMENTATION. WE ADOPTED AN
- 7 ELECTION ADMINISTRATION PLAN AND HELD FIVE PUBLIC HEARINGS
- 8 BETWEEN OCTOBER 2019 AND JANUARY OF THIS YEAR, AGAIN GETTING
- 9 PUBLIC FEEDBACK AND SHARING INFORMATION ABOUT THE NEW MODEL.
- 10 WE HELD A PILOT ELECTION IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NOVEMBER
- 11 DISTRICT ELECTIONS IN 2019, WHERE WE, IN A LIVE ELECTION,
- 12 OFFERED THE OPPORTUNITY FOR VOTERS TO CHOOSE TO USE THE NEW
- 13 EQUIPMENT, AND TO GIVE US THEIR FEEDBACK AGAIN, AND TO TEST
- 14 OUR PROCEDURES. THAT WAS A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY THAT I DON'T
- 15 THINK HAS EVER EXISTED IN A VOTING SYSTEM IMPLEMENTATION
- 16 PROJECT, WHERE, IN THAT ONE ELECTION, THE VOTERS WHO
- 17 PARTICIPATED COULD CHOOSE TO VOTE ON THE PRIOR SYSTEM, OUR
- 18 LEGACY SYSTEM, OR THEY COULD CHOOSE TO USE THE NEW SYSTEM, AND
- 19 IT GAVE US THE ABILITY TO COMPARE THAT USER EXPERIENCE AND

- 17 ALIGNS WITH THE WAY THAT THEY PARTICIPATE IN OTHER ACTIVITIES,
- 18 AND THAT THE SINGLE, RANDOM TUESDAY BETWEEN 7:00 A.M. AND 8:00
- 19 P.M. WAS NOT A MODEL THAT FULLY SUPPORTED THE KIND OF
- 20 PARTICIPATION AND THE REPRESENTATION OF OUR COMMUNITY IN THE
- 21 ELECTIONS PROCESS. SO THAT'S REALLY THE FOUNDATION OF THIS.
- 22 SO, WHAT DOES THAT LOOK LIKE? THE KEY FEATURE, PROBABLY THE
- 23 MOST SIGNIFICANT FEATURE FOR OUR VOTERS LOOKING FORWARD, IS
- 24 THIS IDEA OF A VOTE CENTER. SO, INSTEAD OF A SINGLE POLLING
- 25 PLACE IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD THAT'S OPEN ON A RANDOM TUESDAY

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- 1 BETWEEN 7:00 A.M. AND 8:00 P.M., WE WILL NOW OPEN COMMUNITY
- 2 VOTE CENTERS THROUGHOUT LOS ANGELES COUNTY THAT ARE FULLY
- 3 ACCESSIBLE AND CONVENIENT, AND THAT ANY VOTER IN THE COUNTY
- 4 CAN CHOOSE TO GO TO ANY OF THOSE LOCATIONS, AND THEY CAN DO
- 5 THAT OVER THE COURSE OF AN 11-DAY VOTING PERIOD. SO WE WILL
- 6 BEGIN OPENING THESE VOTE CENTERS TEN DAYS PRIOR TO ELECTION
- 7 DAY. THAT WILL CONTINUE THROUGH TO ELECTION DAY, AND VOTERS
- 8 CAN CHOOSE WHAT DAY, WHAT LOCATION, THAT THEY WANT TO CAST
- 9 THEIR VOTE ON. SO THAT INCLUDES CONVENIENCE, ACCESSIBILITY,
- 10 VOTER'S CHOICE. SOME OF THE TAGLINES THAT WE ARE USING IS IT'S
- 11 "MORE CHOICES AND MORE VOICES." THE IDEA HERE IS THAT THE MORE
- 12 OPTIONS WE GIVE VOTERS, THE HIGHER THE OPPORTUNITY THAT WE
- 13 WILL GET PEOPLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ELECTION; AND "MORE
- 14 DAYS, MORE WAYS," RECOGNIZING THAT, FOR SOME VOTERS, THE
- 15 ABILITY TO GO TO A LOCATION THAT IS CLOSE TO WHERE YOU DROP
- 16 YOUR KIDS OFF AT SCHOOL, OR CLOSE TO YOUR PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT,
- 17 OR CLOSE TO WHERE YOU GO TO THE GYM AFTER WORK, THAT IF WE ARE
- 18 VISIBLE IN THE COMMUNITY AND PEOPLE ARE READY TO CAST THEIR
- 19 VOTE IN THE ELECTION, THAT DURING THAT 11-DAY VOTING PERIOD,
- 20 THE GOAL IS THAT THERE WILL BE A PLACE NEARBY WHERE THEY CAN
- 21 PARTICIPATE IN THAT ACTIVITY. HOW WILL WE LET PEOPLE KNOW
- 22 ABOUT THAT? LAST WEEK, WE LAUNCHED ON OUR WEBSITE OUR VOTE
- 23 CENTER LOOK-UP FEATURE. THIS IS AN ONLINE TOOL THAT ALLOWS
- 24 VOTERS TO LOCATE WHERE VOTE CENTERS ARE IN THE COMMUNITY. THEY

- 9 GOING IN THE MAIL YESTERDAY. THAT'S OUR SAMPLE BALLOT. THAT'S
- 10 THE TRADITIONAL SAMPLE BALLOT THAT VOTERS ARE ACCUSTOMED TO
- 11 GETTING IN EVERY ELECTION. IN THAT SAMPLE BALLOT, IT INCLUDES
- 12 INFORMATION ABOUT THE NEW VOTING MODEL, SO IT EXPLAINS THE
- 13 VOTE CENTER CONCEPT, IT GIVES DIAGRAMS AND INFORMATION ABOUT
- 14 THE NEW VOTING EQUIPMENT, AND IT ALSO INFORMS THEM OF THIS

- 16 VOTING PERIOD, AND GIVES THEM THE WEBSITE TO FIND THOSE
- 17 LOCATIONS. ON FEBRUARY 12TH, WE WILL MAIL TO EVERY POSTAL
- 18 PATRON, SO EVERY HOUSEHOLD IN L.A. COUNTY, WHICH IS 3.5
- 19 MILLION POSTAL PATRONS. WE WILL MAIL A CATALOG THAT LISTS ALL
- 20 OF THE VOTING LOCATIONS IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY. INCLUDED IN
- 21 THAT, AGAIN, WILL BE INFORMATION ABOUT THE NEW VOTING MODEL;
- 22 ALSO, INFORMATION ABOUT THE CENSUS; ALSO, INFORMATION ABOUT
- 23 VOTER REGISTRATION OPTIONS. BECAUSE UNDER THIS NEW MODEL, WE
- 24 CAN NOW SUPPORT CONDITIONAL VOTER REGISTRATION, WHICH MEANS

- 20 IN A PARTICULAR PRECINCT, WE WILL HAVE ELECTRONIC POLL BOOKS
- 21 AT THESE VOTE CENTERS THAT INCLUDE THE ENTIRE DATABASE OF

- 14 THE CANDIDATES WILL FIT ON THE INITIAL VIEW OF THE SCREEN. IN
- 15 SOME RESPECTS, THAT'S NOT NEW. ON THE OLD SYSTEM, WE HAD
- 16 CONTESTS THAT EXTENDED -- I MEAN, IN 2018, WE HAD A U.S. SENATE
- 17 CONTEST AND A GOVERNOR CONTEST IN A PRIMARY THAT HAD 28 AND 32
- 18 CANDIDATES, RESPECTFULLY, AND THEY WENT TO MULTIPLE PAGES. ON
- 19 THAT SYSTEM, WHAT WE KNOW FROM DATA IS A LOT OF PEOPLE
- 20 OVERVOTED ON THOSE RACES, BECAUSE THEY WENT FROM ONE PAGE TO
- 21 THE NEXT, AND THERE WAS NO WAY TO PREVENT THAT. ON THE NEW
- 22 SYSTEM, WE DESIGNED TO ENSURE THAT YOU CAN'T OVERVOTE, AND WE
- 23 ALSO WORKED WITH OUR HUMAN-CENTERED DESIGN PARTNERS TO BUILD

- 4 GREAT EXAMPLE OF THE BENEFIT OF HOLDING THE MOCK ELECTION,
- 5 BECAUSE THAT WAS A CONCERN THAT WAS RAISED IN THE MOCK
- 6 ELECTION, AND YOU HAD SPOKEN TO ME ABOUT THAT, THAT PEOPLE
- 7 RAISED NOT SO MUCH THAT THEY MISSED IT, BUT THAT THEY WERE

- 19 CANDIDATE THAT'S LISTED ON A PARTICULAR SCREEN IS GRAYED OUT,

- 20 DEAN LOGAN: I DON'T HAVE THAT HERE IN THIS ROOM. I DON'T. BUT
- 21 WE CAN PUT THE PRESENTATION THAT WE'VE SHARED WITH YOUR BOARD,
- 22 WE CAN PUT THAT ON OUR WEBSITE, AND IT IS ALSO AVAILABLE ON

- 6 THAT WE'VE DONE. OTHERS ARE THINGS THAT I WOULD SAY, SIMILAR

- 18 WERE SEVERAL CITIES IN MY DISTRICT, THEY ALL SEEMED TO HAVE
- 19 THAT OUTCOME, WHERE NO MATTER WHICH BALLOT THEY CHOSE TO DO,
- 20 THE OUTCOMES WERE SIMILAR. HOWEVER, I DID HEAR SOME CONCERNS.
- 21 I'M SURE WE ALL HAVE, PARTICULARLY ABOUT THE "MORE" BUTTON,

- 13 CONCERNS THAT WERE BROUGHT TO MY ATTENTION, WERE, IF YOU DON'T
- 14 KNOW THAT YOU'RE LOOKING FOR MORE CANDIDATES, YOU MIGHT CAST

- 2 TO WEAPONIZE A POSITION, OR TO BROWBEAT THE SHERIFF. BUT, YOU
- 3 KNOW, AS A LAW PROFESSOR AND A TRIAL LAWYER, I DON'T SEE IT
- 4 THAT WAY AT ALL. YOU KNOW, ALL KINDS OF INSTITUTIONS HAVE TO
- 5 INVESTIGATE MATTERS, AND THEY DO IT IN A VARIETY OF WAYS. AND
- 6 YOU START TRYING TO SOLICIT COOPERATION AND BUILD
- 7 RELATIONSHIPS TO GET THE INFORMATION YOU NEED, BECAUSE THAT'S
- 8 IMPORTANT. BUT VERY OFTEN, WHEN THAT DOESN'T WORK, YOU NEED TO
- 9 COMPEL INFORMATION, AND THAT IS WHERE OUR COMMISSION IS REALLY
- 10 LACKING. SUBPOENA POWER IS JUST A COMPONENT OF MEANINGFUL
- 11 OVERSIGHT AND PROFESSIONAL INVESTIGATION THAT THIS COMMISSION
- 12 HAS LACKED FOR OVER THREE YEARS. I THINK ALL OF THE MEMBERS
- 13 REALLY TRY TO BE RESPONSIBLE AND WANT TO ACHIEVE THE GOALS I
- 14 SPOKE ABOUT. AND SO I CAN'T IMAGINE THIS BEING THIS DIVISIVE
- 15 STANDOFF THAT I HEAR ABOUT SO MUCH. I JUST VIEW IT AS A WAY
- 16 FOR US TO CONDUCT PROFESSIONAL, THOROUGH, FAIR INVESTIGATIONS.
- 17 AND WHEN WE CAN'T GET THE INFORMATION THAT WE NEED THROUGH OUR
- 18 RELATIONSHIPS WITH THE SHERIFFS AND OTHER COMMUNITY PARTNERS,
- 19 OR THROUGH NEGOTIATION, THEN WE WOULD HAVE THE POWER TO
- 20 SUBPOENA. AND I HOPE THE BOARD WILL CONSIDER THAT, BECAUSE
- 21 WITHOUT IT, THERE ARE SO MANY TIMES I FEAR THAT OUR ROLE
- 22 DEGENERATES INTO OVERSIGHT THEATER. IT IS NOT MEANINGFUL
- 23 OVERSIGHT. AND WE REALLY WANT TO DO A GOOD JOB, AND REALLY
- 24 WANT TO ACHIEVE THIS GOAL.

- 1 CYN YAMASHIRO: GOOD AFTERNOON, MEMBERS OF THE BOARD AND MADAM
- 2 CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR HAVING ME. MY NAME IS CYN YAMASHIRO. I AM
- 3 THE DIRECTING ATTORNEY FOR THE INDEPENDENT JUVENILE DEFENDER
- 4 PROGRAM. I WAS ALSO A MEMBER OF THE P.R.I.T., AS WELL AS A
- 5 CURRENT PROBATION COMMISSIONER, AND I'M HERE TO SPEAK ON THAT
- 6 PORTION OF TODAY'S MOTION AND THE ORDINANCE THAT PERTAINS TO
- 7 THE PROBATION OVERSIGHT BODY. FIRST, I WANTED TO COMMEND THE
- 8 BOARD, IN PARTICULAR, AND THE LEADERSHIP OF SUPERVISOR RIDLEY-
- 9 THOMAS AND OTHER SIGNATORIES TO ANY NUMBER OF DIFFERENT
- 10 MOTIONS THAT HAVE MOVED THE P.R.I.T. PROCESS FORWARD, AS WELL
- 11 AS THE PROBATION REFORM, AS WELL. I THINK IT IS WORTH NOTING
- 12 THAT IT IS THE FIRST PROBATION OVERSIGHT BODY IN THE COUNTRY.
- 13 IT CAN SERVE AS A NATIONAL MODEL, AND PUTS L.A. COUNTY
- 14 SQUARELY IN THE VANGUARD OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM. THIS IS
- 15 NOT A QUESTION OF JUVENILE ISSUES. IT IS NOT A QUESTION OF
- 16 ADULT ISSUES. IT IS REALLY A OUESTION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE
- 17 REFORM. AND I THINK IT IS LAUDABLE THAT THIS BOARD HAS TAKEN
- 18 SUCH AN IMPORTANT STEP TOWARDS REFORM. THAT SAID, AS IMPORTANT
- 19 AS THIS MOTION IS, IT IS EQUALLY IMPORTANT, I THINK, AS A
- 20 MEMBER AND AS A PRINCIPAL AUTHOR OF THE DESIGN OF THE P.O.C.
- 21 THAT WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD, IT IS EQUALLY IMPORTANT, I
- 22 BELIEVE, TO MAINTAIN SOME BASIC FIDELITY TO THE
- 23 RECOMMENDATIONS THAT WE HAD. AND SO AS YOU CONSIDER THE DESIGN
- 24 OF THE P.O.C., I WOULD ENCOURAGE YOU TO CONSIDER A COUPLE
- 25 THINGS. FIRST, THE STAFFING MODEL, WHICH I SUSPECT IS GOING TO

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- 1 BECOME SOMETHING OF AN ISSUE GOING FORWARD, AS IT ULTIMATELY
- 2 PERTAINS AND AFFECTS THE BUDGET. THE STAFFING MODEL THAT WE
- 3 PROPOSED WAS BASED ON NATIONAL RESEARCH, AND IT WASN'T SIMPLY
- 4 A STAFFING NUMBER THAT WE PULLED OUT OF OUR HATS. IT, IN FACT,
- 5 WAS BASED ON THE RATIO BETWEEN OVERSIGHT PERSONNEL AND THE
- 6 BODY THAT IT IS OVERSEEING, AND WE MODELED IT AFTER A NUMBER
- 7 OF HIGH-FUNCTIONING JURISDICTIONS, SUCH AS THE CITY OF
- 8 OAKLAND, SEATTLE, AND PORTLAND, AS WELL. THE SECOND THING I
- 9 WANTED TO TALK ABOUT ARE THE TWO ELEMENTS THAT ALSO MIGHT
- 10 RECEIVE A LITTLE ATTENTION, AND THE FIRST IS THE COMMUNITY
- 11 ENGAGEMENT, AND THE SECOND IS THE QUESTION OF THE INDEPENDENT
- 12 REVIEW PROCESS. I WOULD JUST POINT OUT THAT BOTH OF THEM SERVE
- 13 AN IMPORTANT FUNCTION, WHICH IS TO SAY THAT THERE ARE ELEMENTS
- 14 OF THE DAY-TO-DAY WORKINGS OF THE PROBATION DEPARTMENT THAT I
- 15 THINK, RIGHTFULLY SO, WOULD NEVER RISE TO THE LEVEL OF
- 16 SOMETHING THAT WOULD BE REFERRED TO THE O.I G. THIS
- 17 CHRISTMASTIME, MY ORGANIZATION AND THE LAWYERS, WE ORGANIZED A
- 18 BLANKET DRIVE FOR THE KIDS IN JUVENILE HALL. WE DID THIS
- 19 BECAUSE WE HAVE LAWYERS ON THE GROUND WHO ARE WORKING WITH
- 20 THIS POPULATION, AND WE KNEW THAT THEY WERE FREEZING AT NIGHT.
- 21 SO WE RAISED-- WE HAD ABOUT 80 BLANKETS DONATED THAT WE
- 22 PROVIDED. THAT'S THE KIND OF THING THAT COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT
- 23 AND ALSO AN INDEPENDENT REVIEW PROCESS HAS THE ABILITY TO
- 24 DISCOVER, BRING TO THE ATTENTION OF THE PROBATION DEPARTMENT,
- 25 NOT RELY ON THE GOODWILL OF CITIZENS, WHO THANKFULLY WERE

- 7 AGAIN, THANK YOU FOR YOUR TIME, AND CONGRATULATIONS. THIS IS A
- 8 GREAT STEP FORWARD.

- 11 THE COMMENT THAT THE FACT THAT PROBATION DIDN'T HAVE BLANKETS

12 SUP. KATHRYN BARGER, CHAIR: EXCUSE ME, MR. SACHS.

- 14 SHERIFF VILLANUEVA: WHEN YOU INHERIT AN ORGANIZATION AS LARGE
- 15 AS OURS, WITH AS MUCH DATA THAT WE GENERATE, AND ALL THE
- 16 ACTIVITIES THAT WE DO, AND A VERY ANTIQUATED I.T. SYSTEM THAT
- 17 WE HAVE, IT IS NOT AS SIMPLE AS SNAP OUR FINGERS, PUSH A
- 18 BUTTON, AND VOILA, EVERYTHING IS GOING TO BE CRANKING OUT. IT
- 19 TAKES A LOT OF ENERGY. SO WE ARE PUTTING THE ENTIRE CONTENTS
- 20 OF THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT ONLINE, ON OUR WEBSITE. AND I SAY
- 21 THE ENTIRE CONTENTS, I MEAN THE ENTIRE CONTENTS. EVERYTHING
- 22 THAT IS NOT LEGALLY RESTRICTED, WE'RE GOING TO PUT ONLINE. SO
- 23 THAT MEANS OUR DEPUTY-INVOLVED SHOOTINGS, WE'RE GOING TO BE
- 24 PUTTING THE DEPUTY'S FIRST REPORT. WE'RE GOING TO PUT THE
- 25 CORONER'S REPORT. WE'RE GOING TO PUT A VIDEO THAT WE HAVE

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- 1 AVAILABLE. AND LATER ON, WHEN WE HAVE THE BODYCAMS DEPLOYED,
- 2 WE'LL HAVE THAT INFORMATION ALSO AVAILABLE. WE WILL HAVE A
- 3 SYNOPSIS OF EACH SHOOTING. AND EVERYTHING THAT COMPLIES WITH
- 4 1421, WE'RE GOING TO PUT IT ONLINE ON EACH SHOOTING. AND WE'VE
- 5 ALREADY STARTED THAT PROCESS FROM THE ONES FROM MY TIME, MY
- 6 ADMINISTRATION, MOVING FORWARD. AND THAT TAKES A LOT OF

- 14 PERSONNEL RECORDS. THEY ARE CONFIDENTIAL. THEY WILL REMAIN
- 15 PRIVATE. AND THAT IS WITH OR WITHOUT SUBPOENA. THEY ARE NOT
- 16 SUBJECT TO DISCLOSURE. THE SAME THING GOES WITH ONGOING
- 17 INVESTIGATIONS, BOTH CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS AND
- 18 ADMINISTRATIVE INVESTIGATIONS. THEY ARE NOT SUBJECT TO
- 19 DISCLOSURE. THEY WILL NOT BE RELEASED UNTIL THE INVESTIGATIONS
- 20 ARE CONCLUDED. THEN WE WILL REPORT ON THE RESULTS. WE ALSO ARE
- 21 NOT GOING TO BE RELEASING ANY INFORMATION ON VICTIMS AND
- 22 WITNESSES OF PARTICULAR CRIMES -- FOR EXAMPLE, SEX-RELATED
- 23 CRIMES, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CRIMES -- BECAUSE THOSE ARE ALSO
- 24 PROTECTED BY LAW. SO THOSE THREE BROAD CATEGORIES WILL REMAIN
- 25 CONFIDENTIAL. AND THAT IS NOT GOING TO CHANGE BY WHATEVER IS

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- ON THE BALLOT, OR WHATEVER IS VOTED ON HERE TODAY. AND AS A
- 2 CUSTODIAN OF THE RECORDS OF THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT, I'M
- 3 BOUND BY LAW TO PROTECT THE CONFIDENTIALITY OF ALL THOSE
- 4 RECORDS. AND SO SUBPOENA POWER DOES NOT GIVE ACCESS TO THOSE
- 5 TYPE OF DOCUMENTS. AND I DON'T SEE ANY FORUM OR ANY JUDICIAL
- 6 REVIEW WILL SOMEHOW CHANGE STATE LAW TO MAKE THAT ACCESSIBLE.
- 7 IT'S JUST NOT. PLUS, IT JUST GOES AGAINST THE GRAIN OF WHAT
- 8 WE'RE HERE FOR. WE NEED TO HAVE WITNESSES. WE NEED TO HAVE
- 9 VICTIMS COOPERATE. THEY CAN'T FEAR THAT THEIR INFORMATION IS
- 10 GOING TO BE DIVULGED PUBLICLY. THE SAME THING WITH APPLICANTS
- 11 TO BE EMPLOYEES OF THE ORGANIZATION. THEY DON'T WANT THEIR
- 12 INFORMATION TO BE DIVULGED PUBLICLY, EITHER, AS A MATTER OF
- 13 PUBLIC RECORD, AND THAT IS WHY THE STATE LEGISLATURE HAS
- 14 WISELY ENSHRINED ALL OF THESE RECORDS AS CONFIDENTIAL, AND I'M
- 15 GOING TO HONOR THAT. THE THIRD POINT IS THE SUBPOENA POWER
- 16 ITSELF, IF IT COMES TO-- IT IS GOING TO INCREASE THE
- 17 LITIGATION COSTS ENORMOUSLY IF THERE'S A SUBJECT DISPUTE. IF
- 18 I'M RELEASING EVERYTHING PUBLICLY THAT I CAN, AND BEING AS

- 24 ALREADY HAVE STARTED THAT PROCESS. IF YOU GO TO OUR WEBSITE,
- 25 YOU CAN SEE SOME OF THOSE. WE'RE PUTTING ALL OF THAT ONLINE,

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- 1 BECAUSE OUR BUSINESS IS NOT THE BUSINESS OF SECRECY, AS SOME
- 2 PEOPLE LIKE TO BELIEVE, ERRONEOUSLY. I WILL SAY THIS: IN THE
- 3 YEAR 2017, THE O.I.G. GENERATED 7 REPORTS FOR THE ENTIRE
- 4 CALENDAR YEAR. IN THE YEAR 2018, THE O.I.G. GENERATED 10
- 5 REPORTS. IN THE YEAR 2019, WHICH IS UNDER MY ADMINISTRATION,
- 6 THE O.I.G. GENERATED 21 REPORTS. THAT'S MORE THAN TWICE THE
- 7 TOTAL OF THE PREVIOUS TWO YEARS. AND I'M PRETTY SURE THEY
- 8 DIDN'T MAKE UP INFORMATION. THEY RELIED ON INFORMATION THAT WE
- 9 PROVIDED. SO WE'RE STARTING TO LOSE THE CONTEXT HERE. WHAT HAS
- 10 THE C.O.C., WHAT HAS THE O.I.G. RECEIVED? TURNS OUT THEY HAVE
- 11 BEEN RECEIVING REAMS AND REAMS OF DATA FROM THE DEPARTMENT. WE
- 12 ARE GIVING THEM ACCESS TO ALL OF THE ASPECTS OF PATROL, OF
- 13 CUSTODY. EVERYWHERE THAT WE HAVE AN OPERATION, WE ARE GIVING
- 14 THEM ALMOST UNLIMITED ACCESS. THE ONLY ACCESS THAT WE ARE

- 18 MASSAGE, HEALTH, AND BEAUTY INDUSTRY. THAT IS WHY, IN ADDITION
- 19 TO THE ORDINANCE ADDING PUBLIC HEALTH INSPECTION, MY MOTION
- 20 INSTRUCTS PUBLIC HEALTH, IN COLLABORATION WITH RELATED COUNTY
- 21 AGENCIES AND COMMUNITY PARTNERS, TO DEVELOP A PLAN FOR THE
- 22 BEST WAYS TO ASSIST MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENT WORKERS, AND LINK
- 23 THEM TO SERVICES LIKE COUNSELING, LEGAL AID, HOUSING. AND I'M
- 24 EAGER TO HEAR BACK ON WHAT WE CAN DO BEYOND THAT FOR THIS

- 19 HAVE A WAYS TO GO. I HOPE, MOVING AHEAD, WE CAN HOPEFULLY

- 4 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT PUBLIC HEALTH, WAGE AND LABOR, AND
- 5 GENERAL PUBLIC SAFETY VIOLATIONS ARE OFTEN AN INTEGRAL PART OF
- 6 HUMAN TRAFFICKING. BUT ON THE OPPOSITE SIDE OF THINGS, WE HAD

- 13 ENHANCING AND PROVIDING COMMUNITIES WITH A LOT OF BUSINESS
- 14 SUPPORT TO CONTINUE TO PROVIDE MASSAGE SERVICES. SO, AS
- 15 SUPERVISOR HAHN CORRECTLY POINTED OUT, AS YOU CAN SEE FROM
- 16 THIS MAP, CURRENTLY WE HAVE 38 LICENSED MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS
- 17 IN ALL OF UNINCORPORATED COUNTY, AND THAT CLEARLY DOES NOT
- 18 REALLY MATCH THE TOTAL NUMBER OF BUSINESSES THAT ARE OFFERING
- 19 MASSAGE SERVICES IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS, WHICH INDICATES
- 20 A REAL NEED BY THE COUNTY TO CONDUCT VERY MASSIVE OUTREACH TO
- 21 BRING BUSINESSES INTO COMPLIANCE. AND I WANT TO MAKE A VERY

- 19 COMPONENT THROUGH T.T.C. AND AS TODAY, WE DON'T HAVE A PUBLIC
- 20 HEALTH REQUIREMENT, SO AS A RESULT OF ADDING THIS TO THE
- 21 ORDINANCE, WE NOW HAVE NEW PUBLIC HEALTH REQUIREMENTS IF THIS
- 22 ORDINANCE WAS TO BE PASSED. AND THOSE REQUIREMENTS INCLUDE
- 23 SOME REALLY CRITICAL THINGS THAT ARE IMPORTANT TO PROTECTING
- 24 PEOPLE. ONE OF THOSE THINGS IS, HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND SLAVERY
- 25 NOTICES MUST BE IN EVERY LOCATION. THE EMPLOYMENT OF MINORS IS

- 3 HOUSE. THEY CANNOT BE MADE IN A ROOM. AND THERE IS NO
- 4 ALLOWANCE FOR ADVERTISING ILLICIT SERVICES. AND I THINK IT IS
- 5 IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH HAS
- 6 VERY SPECIALIZED PERSONNEL WHO GO OUT TO THESE SITES, AND IN
- 7 ADDITION TO LOOKING FOR THE PUBLIC HEALTH REQUIREMENTS AND
- 8 ENSURING THAT BUSINESSES ARE MEETING THOSE REQUIREMENTS, THEY

- 23 DAYS FROM OUR SECOND READ. FOR MASSAGE TECHNICIANS TO DO
- 24 BUSINESS HERE, YOU MUST OBTAIN EITHER A T.T.C. BUSINESS
- 25 LICENSE, OR MUST BE C.A.M.T.C.-CERTIFIED. AND IF YOU ARE NOT

- 16 MORTALITY INITIATIVE TO REDUCE THE BLACK-WHITE INFANT
- 17 MORTALITY GAP BY 30 PERCENT, AND IMPROVE MATERNAL HEALTH IN
- 18 THE COUNTY BY 2023. I WANT TO URGE MY COLLEAGUES TO SUPPORT
- 19 THIS MOTION, AND ALSO WANT TO THANK THE WOMEN'S POLICY
- 20 INSTITUTE OF LOS ANGELES HEALTH JUSTICE TEAM FOR THEIR EFFORTS
- 21 IN FIGHTING FOR HEALTH EQUITY FOR ALL OF OUR COMMUNITIES.
- 22 HEALTHY PREGNANCIES LEAD TO HEALTHY FAMILIES. I WANT TO AGAIN

- 7 DATA OVER TIME, FROM 2003 TILL 2017, THAT LOOKS AT THE RATE OF
- 8 INFANTS THAT DIED IN THE FIRST YEAR OF LIFE, BECAUSE OF
- 9 ILLNESSES THAT OCCURRED EITHER AT BIRTH, OR SOMETIME DURING
- 10 THE FIRST YEAR. UNFORTUNATELY, WE DON'T HAVE GOOD DATA FOR
- 11 NATIVE AMERICANS AND PACIFIC ISLANDERS AND NATIVE ALASKANS.
- 12 THE DATA THAT WE DO HAVE INDICATES A SIMILAR TRAJECTORY AS YOU
- 13 SEE FOR THE EXPERIENCE OF OUR BLACK BABIES IN L.A. COUNTY. SO
- 14 THE TOP LINE THERE, THE ORANGE LINE, IS THE BIRTH EXPERIENCE
- 15 FOR BLACK BABIES. AND AS YOU CAN SEE, ALTHOUGH WE'VE MADE
- 16 GREAT STRIDES IN L.A. COUNTY, THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE RATE
- 17 OF DEATH FOR BLACK BABIES IS THREE TIMES THE RATE OF DEATH FOR
- 18 WHITE BABIES, ASIAN BABIES, AND LATINO BABIES. SO THIS IS A
- 19 RATE OF DEATH FOR, AS YOU CAN SEE, FOR BLACK BABIES IN 2017.
- 20 THAT'S HIGHER THAN THE RATE OF DEATH WAS FOR ALL OTHER BABIES
- 21 IN 2003. SO WE'VE MADE PROGRESS, BUT NO PROGRESS AT ALL IN
- 22 IMPROVING THE GAP. AND THIS LEADS TO HUNDREDS OF DEATHS FOR
- 23 BLACK BABIES EVERY YEAR, THAT IF THEY WERE HAVING THE SAME
- 24 EXPERIENCE AS OTHER BABIES IN L.A. COUNTY, THEY'D BE HERE
- 25 TODAY AS OUR ARTISTS AND TEACHERS AND ELECTED OFFICIALS. SO

- 3 AROUND MATERNAL MORTALITIES. SO, MATERNAL MORTALITY IS REALLY
- 4 TALKING ABOUT THE NUMBER OF DEATHS THAT ARE ASSOCIATED WITH
- 5 WOMEN, RELATED TO THEIR PREGNANCY, CHILDBIRTH, OR POSTPARTUM
- 6 PERIOD. AND THERE ARE SOME CODES THAT AGAIN IDENTIFY THOSE

- 5 ARE THE FACTORS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO THE INEQUITIES? AND,
- 6 FORTUNATELY FOR US, THERE'S BEEN A LOT OF ATTENTION TO THIS

- 24 STELLA CLINGMON: HELLO. MY NAME IS STELLA CLINGMON. I AM A NEW
- 25 MOTHER OF AN 18-MONTH-OLD. DUE TO INSTITUTIONALIZED RACISM AND

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- 1 CHRONIC STRESS, BLACK WOMEN ARE FOUR TIMES AS LIKELY AS WHITE
- 2 WOMEN TO DIE FROM PREGNANCY-RELATED COMPLICATIONS.
- 3 FORTUNATELY, DOULAS CAN HELP REVERSE THIS TREND. DOULAS ARE
- 4 INDIVIDUALS WHO PROVIDE INFORMATION AND SUPPORT TO PREGNANT
- 5 WOMEN BEFORE, DURING, AND AFTER CHILDBIRTH. HOWEVER, DUE TO
- 6 LIMITED COVERAGE BY MEDI-CAL AND PRIVATE INSURANCE, DOULAS
- 7 WORK MOST OFTEN WITH CLIENTS WHO CAN AFFORD TO PAY OUT OF
- 8 POCKET. EXPANDING MEDI-CAL OR OTHER FUNDING SERVICES TO COVER
- 9 DOULA SERVICES FOR BIRTHING PERSONS IN L.A. COUNTY WILL
- 10 INCREASE ACCESS TO DOULA CARE FOR LOW-INCOME WOMEN, HELPING TO
- 11 REDUCE BLACK MATERNAL/INFANT MORTALITY AND MORBIDITY. EVIDENCE
- 12 SHOWS THAT A DOULA'S CULTURAL HUMILITY, STRONG CLIENT
- 13 RELATIONSHIP, AND PATIENT ADVOCACY INCREASES A WOMAN'S ODDS OF
- 14 RECEIVING PROMPT PRENATAL CARE TO ADDRESS PREGNANCY
- 15 COMPLICATIONS. WE NEED YOUR HELP TO ENSURE BLACK MOTHERS AND
- 16 BABIES HAVE ACCESS TO THIS IMPORTANT CARE. THANK YOU.

- 20 SPEAKER: I WANT TO FIRST THANK THE SUPERVISORS FOR YOUR

- 18 KRISTIN SCHLATER: GOOD AFTERNOON. I'M KRISTIN SCHLATER. I'M
- 19 THE SENIOR HEALTH EDUCATION SPECIALIST FOR HEALTH NET. AND AS
- 20 DR. FERRER STATED EARLIER, HEALTH NET DOES IMPLEMENT A
- 21 COMMUNITY DOULA PROGRAM FOR OUR AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEDI-CAL
- 22 MEMBERS. I'M ALSO HERE TO ADVOCATE FOR THE EXPANSION OF DOULA
- 23 SERVICES. WE'VE BEEN ABLE TO LEARN FROM OUR PRELIMINARY
- 24 FINDINGS THAT THERE ARE POSITIVE OUTCOMES FOR THE WOMEN THAT
- 25 HAVE BEEN PARTICIPATING IN OUR DOULA PROGRAM. WE'VE FOUND

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- 1 REDUCED C-SECTION RATES, REDUCED STRESS LEVELS, REDUCED
- 2 PRETERM BIRTHS, AND INCREASED POSITIVE BIRTH OUTCOMES. WE ALSO
- 3 FEEL THAT THE POTENTIAL OF HAVING EXPANDED DOULA SERVICES CAN
- 4 REDUCE HEALTHCARE COSTS BY HAVING MOTHERS AVOID THE I.C.U.,
- 5 AND BABIES AVOID THE NEONATAL I.C.U. UNIT. THANK YOU.

- 16 ARE HIGHLY ANXIOUS. THERE'S AN ISSUE OF TRUST IN OUR
- 17 COMMUNITY. WE DON'T TRUST OUR DOCTORS. WE DON'T TRUST ANYBODY.
- 18 WE DON'T WANT TO LEAVE THE HOUSE AND GO AND ADMIT THAT WE ARE
- 19 FEELING WEAKER THAN WE THINK WE SHOULD BE, AND THAT'S CAUSING
- 20 PEOPLE NOT TO GO TO THE DOCTOR. SO I AM VERY MUCH AN ADVOCATE
- 21 FOR THIS INITIATIVE. I SEE, AS SOON AS I TOLD MY CLIENTS THAT
- 22 WE OFFER DOULA SERVICES THAT WERE DISCOUNTED, THEY IMMEDIATELY
- 23 SIGNED UP. THEY WERE READY FOR THIS. AND THEY WERE LOOKING FOR
- 24 A FACE THAT WAS FAMILIAR AND COMFORTABLE AND SAFE. AND WE NEED
- 25 TO REALIZE THAT PEOPLE HAVE COMPLEX TRAUMA IN THE BLACK

- 14 IS SPONSORED BY HEALTH NET. AS A DOULA TRAINER AND COORDINATOR
- 15 FOR THE FRONTLINE COMMUNITY DOULAS, I SEE FIRSTHAND THE IMPACT
- 16 OF HAVING WOMEN FROM THE COMMUNITY AS DOULAS TO WOMEN IN THE
- 17 COMMUNITY. I CAN'T SAY, YOU KNOW, HOW VALUABLE IT IS TO BE
- 18 ABLE TO HAVE ACCESS TO A DOULA, WITH ALL OF THE HEALTH
- 19 DISPARITIES THAT HAVE ALREADY BEEN NAMED. AND MANY WOMEN WHO
- 20 HAVE THE FINANCES TO BE ABLE TO DO SO HIRE DOULAS, AND THEY'RE

- 10 MITCHELL. ACCESS TO ADEQUATE HEALTHCARE IS AT RISK, MORE THAN
- 11 EVER. ACCESSING BASIC CARE IS COSTLY AND DIFFICULT TO OBTAIN
- 12 IN CERTAIN GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS. WOMEN OF COLOR FACE MANY
- 13 BARRIERS, WHEN IT COMES TO HEALTHCARE. IN ADDITION TO ALL
- 14 THESE BARRIERS, WOMEN OF COLOR, PARTICULARLY AFRICAN-AMERICAN
- 15 WOMEN, FACE AN INORDINATE AMOUNT OF STRESS DURING THEIR
- 16 PREGNANCY. THE RATE OF MORTALITY AMONG BLACK INFANTS CONTINUES
- 17 TO BE 2 TO 4 TIMES HIGHER RATES THAN OTHER GROUPS, STATEWIDE.
- 18 SENATOR MITCHELL HAS PLAYED AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THIS SPACE.
- 19 IN 2018, SENATOR MITCHELL LED THE INITIATIVE TO ENSURE THAT AN
- 20 ADDITIONAL 8 MILLION WAS PROVIDED TO THE BLACK INFANT HEALTH
- 21 PROGRAM THROUGHOUT THE STATE. THE COUNTY SET UP AN INITIATIVE
- 22 TO REDUCE THE BLACK-WHITE INFANT MORTALITY GAP BY 30 PERCENT,
- 23 AND IMPROVE MATERNAL HEALTH IN THE COUNTY BY 2023. IN THE SAME
- 24 YEAR, THE CALWORKS HOME VISITING PROGRAM WAS PASSED IN THE
- 25 STATE BUDGET, TO HELP NEW MOMS RECEIVE GOOD CARE.

- 14 DR. BARBARA FERRER: SURE. AND THANK YOU SO MUCH, SUPERVISOR
- 15 BARGER, FOR ASKING ME TO PROVIDE THIS UPDATE. I'M BARBARA
- 16 FERRER, AS FOLKS KNOW, THE DIRECTOR OF L.A. COUNTY'S
- 17 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH. ON SUNDAY, AS MANY OF YOU KNOW,
- 18 WE DID CONFIRM THE FIRST CASE OF NOVEL CORONAVIRUS INFECTION.
- 19 IT OCCURRED IN A TRAVELER WHO WAS PASSING THROUGH L.A. THEY
- 20 WERE AT THE L.A. AIRPORT, AND THEY ARE FROM WUHAN CITY. AND
- 21 THEY WERE ON THEIR WAY BACK TO WUHAN CITY. THIS PERSON IS A
- 22 NONRESIDENT, AND THEY'RE CURRENTLY RECEIVING CARE AT A LOCAL
- 23 HOSPITAL THAT'S EQUIPPED TO OBVIOUSLY TREAT ALL KINDS OF
- 24 INFECTIOUS DISEASES. THE INFECTED PERSON DID PRESENT
- 25 THEMSELVES IMMEDIATELY FOR CARE, THE MOMENT THEY EXITED THE

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- 1 PLANE AT L.A.X., SINCE THEY NOTICED THEY WEREN'T FEELING WELL.
- 2 AND THEY HAD INFORMATION THAT INDICATED WHAT THEY WERE TO DO
- 3 AT THE AIRPORT IF THEY WEREN'T FEELING WELL. THE PERSON WAS
- 4 CONFIRMED BY THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL. THEY'VE HAD
- 5 CLOSE CONTACT WITH A VERY SMALL NUMBER OF OTHER PEOPLE, ALL
- 6 WHO ARE IDENTIFIED, AND ALL WHO ARE BEING ACTIVELY MONITORED
- 7 BY OUR STAFF, WHO ARE ADHERING TO THE C.D.C. GUIDANCE ON CLOSE
- 8 CONTACT INVESTIGATION PROTOCOLS. IN ORDER TO ASSURE PATIENT
- 9 CONFIDENTIALITY, WE'RE OBVIOUSLY NOT RELEASING ANY INFORMATION
- 10 ABOUT THE HOSPITAL OR THE PATIENT. WHAT WE CAN SHARE IS THAT
- 11 BECAUSE OUR HEALTHCARE SYSTEM IN L.A. IS AMONG THE BEST IN THE
- 12 WORLD, THE PATIENT IS RECEIVING EXCELLENT AND APPROPRIATE CARE
- 13 BY HIGHLY TRAINED AND SKILLED HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS. I WANT
- 14 TO NOTE THAT THIS CASE POSES NO IMMEDIATE THREAT TO THE
- 15 GENERAL PUBLIC. NO SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS ARE REQUIRED, AND
- 16 PEOPLE SHOULD NOT BE EXCLUDED FROM ACTIVITIES BASED ON THEIR
- 17 RACE, THEIR COUNTRY OF ORIGIN, OR RECENT TRAVEL, IF THEY DO
- 18 NOT HAVE SYMPTOMS OF RESPIRATORY ILLNESS. L.A. COUNTY
- 19 RESIDENTS, STUDENTS, WORKERS, AND VISITORS WHO ARE NOT ILL
- 20 SHOULD CONTINUE TO ENGAGE IN THEIR DAILY ACTIVITIES. AS WITH
- 21 ALL OTHER RESPIRATORY ILLNESSES, THERE ARE STEPS THAT EVERYONE
- 22 OUGHT TO BE TAKING TO REDUCE THE RISK OF GETTING SICK FROM
- 23 CIRCULATING VIRUSES, INCLUDING NOVEL CORONAVIRUS. THIS
- 24 INCLUDES REMAINING HOME WHEN ILL, WASHING HANDS WITH SOAP AND
- 25 WATER FREQUENTLY. AND AT THIS POINT, SINCE THE VIRUS THAT'S

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- 1 CIRCULATING HERE RIGHT NOW IS FLU, PLEASE GET YOUR FLU SHOT.
- 2 30,000 PEOPLE WILL PROBABLY DIE THIS YEAR FROM INFLUENZA IN
- 3 THIS COUNTRY ALONE. THIS IS PREVENTABLE. AGAIN, TAKING
- 4 PRECAUTIONS AND HAVING PEOPLE BE VACCINATED AGAINST THE FLU.
- 5 IF WITHIN 14 DAYS OF HAVING TRAVELED FROM WUHAN OR OTHER PARTS
- 6 OF CHINA WITH CONFIRMED CASES YOU DEVELOP A FEVER OR A
- 7 RESPIRATORY ILLNESS, WE ASK THAT YOU CALL YOUR HEALTHCARE
- 8 PROVIDER. YOUR PROVIDER CAN ADVISE YOU ON NEXT STEPS, AND WILL
- 9 CONTACT US AT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEATH, SHOULD YOU
- 10 REQUIRE ADDITIONAL SCREENING OR TESTING. SO SOME PEOPLE CAN BE
- 11 SICK AND PICKED UP AT SCREENING AT THE AIRPORT. OTHER PEOPLE
- 12 ARE IN THE COMMUNITY, AND MAY HAVE HAD AN EXPOSURE TO SOMEBODY

- 23 WORKING WITH OUR FEDERAL AND STATE AND OUR HEALTHCARE PARTNERS
- 24 HERE TO MAKE SURE WE ARE PREPARED, SHOULD WE SEE MORE CASES.
- 25 SO I DON'T WANT ANYBODY TO THINK THAT, SHOULD ALL OF A SUDDEN
