SUBJECT: **REPORT BACK ON JUVENILE FIELD POPULATION INFORMATION
(ITEM #4, AGENDA OF APRIL 11, 2016)**

This is in follow-up to the information requested at the April 11, 2016 Probation Oversight Commission Working Group meeting, regarding the Juvenile Field Probation population, specifically related to and including a description of 1) the youth who are on Active Investigation, and 2) the Juvenile WIC 236 (At-Risk) population.

Juvenile Field Probation Population – Active Investigation

Youth reflected under Active Investigation relate to those cases pending disposition/pre-adjudication, not post-adjudication.

Juvenile Welfare and Institutions Code 236 (At-Risk) Population

The juvenile Welfare and Institutions Code 236 (At-Risk) population is in the community. The youth are primarily in schools assigned to a School-Based Deputy Probation Officer (DPO) on a voluntary basis (not on formal or informal probation). The DPO's role is to primarily provide prevention services by assessing risk and protective factors and working collaboratively with youth, family and others, within the youth's ecology, to target those factors which may have the youth in a trajectory to enter the delinquency system. The targeting of risk and protective factors is accomplished by the development of a case plan which includes referring youth to community-based organizations. Information pertaining to these WIC 236 youth is stored separately and is not shared with anyone as participation in this program is voluntary and confidential.
