There are an increasing number of encampments on and adjacent to the Alameda Corridor along its 20-mile length. The Alameda Corridor Transportation Authority (ACTA) has been advised of issues concerning the homeless in certain areas such as the Redondo Tower destroyed by fire last May, the removal of abandoned structures north of Firestone Boulevard to discourage occupancy and the continued clean-up of encampments along the Union Pacific Rail Road track next to the Corridor Trench near 92<sup>nd</sup> Street.

The County's Office of Homeless Initiative should develop a strategic partnership with ACTA and other critical stakeholders. This partnership can focus on implementing best practices and utilizing Measure H-funded services along the Alameda Corridor.

I, THEREFORE, MOVE that the Board direct the Chief Executive Officer, along with the Los Angeles Homeless Service Authority and other critical stakeholders, to develop a plan with the Alameda Corridor Transportation Authority to address the encampment issues along the Alameda Corridor and report back to the Board in writing in 60 days. The plan shall identify how the Countywide Outreach System and other strategies funded through Measure H can support outreach and housing efforts for those along the Alameda Corridor. Additionally any unallocated Measure H funds should be used to enhance outreach.
