Proclaiming National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day

On the morning of December 7, 1941, the United States Naval Base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii was attacked without warning. In recognition of the heroic actions performed on that date, it is fitting that we remember and honor the more than 2,400 Americans killed, the 1,100 wounded, and the courageous veterans of World War II who bravely fought to ensure for us the priceless gifts of peace and freedom.

In observance of the 76th Anniversary of the "date which will live in infamy," we solemnly pause to pay tribute to the valiant men and women at Pearl Harbor, military and civilian, honoring their memories, their service and their sacrifice.

I, THEREFORE, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors,

- Proclaim December 7, 2017, as National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day throughout the County and urge all citizens to participate in ceremonies honoring the Americans who served at Pearl Harbor; and
- 2) That all flags throughout the County shall be flown at half-staff in honor of those Americans who died as a result of the attack on Pearl Harbor.
