SUBJECT

Public Works is seeking Board approval to adopt the Negotiated Property Tax Exchange Joint Resolution associated with the annexation of territory into the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD ACTING AS THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES PUBLIC LIBRARY, THE CONSOLIDATED FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, AND THE WATERWORKS DISTRICT NO. 40, ANTELOPE VALLEY:

- 1. Find that the adoption of the Negotiated Property Tax Exchange Joint Resolution for Annexation 40-151 (04-211) and the resulting share of the ad valorem tax is for the purpose of meeting the operation, maintenance, and capital project expenses of the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley and, therefore, is statutorily exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act.
- 2. Adopt the Joint Resolution approving and accepting the negotiated exchange of property tax revenue resulting from Annexation 40-151 (04-211), Local Agency Formation Commission Designation 2016-02, on behalf of the County of Los Angeles Public Library and the Consolidated

Fire Protection District.

- 3. Adopt the Joint Resolution approving and accepting the negotiated exchange of property tax revenue resulting from Annexation 40-151 (04-211), Local Agency Formation Commission Designation 2016-02, on behalf of the Board of Directors of the County Sanitation District No. 14 of Los Angeles County, which is unable to meet until September 2018, pursuant to Section 99.01 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.
- 4. Adopt the Joint Resolution approving and accepting the negotiated exchange of property tax revenue resulting from Annexation 40-151 (04-211), Local Agency Formation Commission Designation 2018-02, to the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The purpose of the recommended action is to reapportion the ad valorem tax that is shared by the affected taxing entities as a result of pending Annexation 40 151 (04 211) into the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley (Waterworks District). The annexation area is comprised of one parcel that includes approximately 15.20± acres of vacant land located in the vicinity of Avenue I and 32nd Street West within the City of Lancaster.

The parcel is the proposed site of a Homeless Center to be operated by the City of Lancaster. The surrounding areas consist of multi-family apartments to the north, single-family homes to the west, a Veterans home to the east, and vacant land to the south. The recommended actions would allow the Waterworks District to provide water service to the proposed Homeless Center in the annexed area.

Under the Revenue and Taxation Code, in the case of any jurisdictional change that will result in a special district providing one or more services to an area where those services have not previously been provided by any local agency, the special district and each local agency receiving property tax revenue from the area must negotiate an exchange of property tax revenue subject to the jurisdictional change and attributable to those local agencies.

The governing bodies of the respective taxing entities in the affected area have adopted the Joint Resolution based on the negotiated exchange of ad valorem property tax revenue related to the proposed annexation to the Waterworks District, except for the County Sanitation District No. 14 of Los Angeles County. Pursuant to the Revenue and Taxation Code, the Board may determine the exchange of property tax revenue for that entity.

In order for the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) for the County of Los Angeles to proceed with the required hearings on the proposed annexation, the Board, as the governing body of the County of Los Angeles and as the governing body of the County of Los Angeles Special Districts, acting on behalf of the County of Los Angeles Public Library, the Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County, and the Waterworks District, must also adopt the enclosed Joint Resolution. The Joint Resolution will transfer a portion of the annual property tax increment attributable to the proposed annexation area from the County of Los Angeles and other taxing entities to the Waterworks District according to ratios listed in Exhibits A and B. Each of the affected agencies' share of the annual property tax increment will be adjusted accordingly.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The County Strategic Plan directs the provision of Strategy II.2, Support the Wellness of our Communities. The recommended action will respond to public needs by providing the proposed

Homeless Center with a source of clean, reliable drinking water that will contribute to the health of its residents and staff.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The City of Lancaster is requesting the proposed annexation and will pay all required fees associated with this action.

The Joint Resolution will transfer to the Waterworks District a portion of the annual property tax increment from the County General Fund and each of the affected County taxing entities, which include the County of Los Angeles Public Library, the Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County, together with the Antelope Valley Cemetery District, the Antelope Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District, the County Sanitation District No. 14 of Los Angeles County, the Antelope Valley Resource Conservation District, the City of Lancaster, and the Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency. The tax-sharing ratios listed in Exhibits A and B were calculated using a formula approved by the County of Los Angeles Auditor-Controller and County Counsel. In this instance, Tax Rate Area No. 05881 and its revenues to the General Fund from the ad valorem property tax on the affected property would be reduced by 0.4136479 percent.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Section 99.01 of the Revenue and Taxation Code requires that prior to the effective date of any jurisdictional change, the governing bodies of all agencies whose service areas or service responsibilities will be altered by such change must negotiate a reallocation of property tax revenue between the affected agencies and approve and accept such reallocation by resolution.

The governing bodies of the respective taxing entities in the affected area have adopted the Joint Resolution in the last three months based on the negotiated exchange of ad valorem property tax revenue related to the proposed annexation to the Waterworks District, except for the County Sanitation District No. 14 of Los Angeles County. The Board of Directors for this entity is not scheduled to meet for an indeterminate time. Section 99.01 (a)(4) of the Revenue and Taxation Code states that if a special district involved in the negotiation fails to adopt the resolution providing for the exchange of property tax revenue, the board of supervisors of the county in the area subject to the jurisdictional change shall determine the exchange of property tax revenue for that special district. Adoption of the Joint Resolution by the Board will allow LAFCO to schedule the required public hearing to consider testimony on the proposed annexation. LAFCO will subsequently take action to approve, approve with changes, or disapprove the proposal. The Joint Resolution has also been approved as to form by County Counsel.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

This action and proposed Joint Resolution is to fund operation and maintenance expenses and capital projects within the existing service area of the Waterworks District, and are therefore, statutorily exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15273(a) of the CEQA Guidelines.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

This action will allow the Waterworks District to provide water service to the proposed Homeless

Center in the annexed area and will not have any negative impact on existing services or other planned projects.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of Sanitation District No. 14 of Los Angeles County will not be meeting for an indeterminate amount of time and is unable to negotiate an exchange of property tax revenue due to Annexation 40-151 (04-211) to Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley, and pursuant to Section 99.01(a) (4) of the Revenue and Taxation Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles is charged with the responsibility of determining the exchange of revenue; and

- 1. The Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley, together with the County of Los Angeles Public Library, the Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County, Antelope Valley Cemetery District, Antelope Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District, County Sanitation District No. 14 of Los Angeles County, Antelope Valley Resource Conservation District, the City of Lancaster; and the Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency have determined that the amount of property tax revenue to be exchanged between their respective agencies as a result of the annexation proposal identified as Annexation 40-151 (04-211) is approved and accepted.
- 2. The exchange of property tax revenue between the County of Los Angeles and the County Sanitation District No. 14 of Los Angeles County as a result of Annexation 40-151 (04-211) to the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley, is determined by the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors, pursuant to Section 99.01 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, to be that amount as set forth below.
- 3. For fiscal years commencing on or after July 1, 2018, or the July 1 after the effective date of this jurisdictional change, whichever is later, the property tax revenue increment generated from the area within Annexation 40-151 (04-211) shall be allocated to the affected agencies as indicated in the enclosed worksheets (Exhibits A and B).
- 4. No transfer of property tax revenues other than those specified in paragraph 2 shall be made as a result of Annexation 40-151 (04-211).
- 5. If at any time after the effective date of this Joint Resolution the calculations used herein to determine initial property tax transfers or the data used to perform those calculations are found to be incorrect, thus producing an improper or inaccurate property tax transfer, the property tax transfer shall be recalculated and the corrected transfer shall be implemented for the next fiscal year.

The foregoing Resolution was adopted on the 3167 day of 5000, 2018, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles as the Governing Body of the County of Los Angeles and as the Governing Body of the County of Los Angeles Public Library, the Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County, and Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley.
