### **SUBJECT**

Approval of the Conflict of Interest Codes.

#### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

Approve the Conflict of Interest Codes for the North Los Angeles County Transportation Coalition JPA; Spadra Basin Groundwater Sustainability Agency; Agricultural Commissioner/Weights & Measures; Bassett Unified School District; Downey Unified School District; El Monte Union High School District; Employee Relations Commission; Los Angeles County Employees Retirement Association (LACERA); Lynwood Unified School District; Sulphur Springs Union School District; and Tri-Cities Regional Occupational Program (ROP) to be effective the day following your Board's approval.

#### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, every local government agency must adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code. Agencies are required to amend their Conflict of Interest Codes when necessitated by changed circumstances pursuant to Government Code Section 87306.

In accordance with the Political Reform Act of 1974, the Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body for Los Angeles County. The Board of Supervisors must approve an agency's code before it can take effect.

The proposed Conflict of Interest Codes have been thoroughly reviewed and approved by the code review staff in accordance with the procedures established by your Board.

# **Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals**

Approval of the attached codes broadly supports the County's strategic plan strategy of pursuing Operational Effectiveness, Fiscal Responsibility and Accountability.

#### FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Local governmental agencies must have a Conflict of Interest Code in which individuals in designated positions are required to disclose financial interests at a level appropriate to their decision-making authority.

Adoption of a Conflict of Interest Code deters potential conflicts of interest, thereby averting misuse of public funds.

The recommended action has no effect on budget revenues and expenditures.

### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, the code review staff recommends that your Board approve the Conflict of Interest Codes for the agencies listed below.

### **NEW CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE:**

(North Los Angeles County Transportation Coalition JPA)

- Adopts by reference Regulation 18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, Sections 18730) as its Conflict of Interest Code and will adopt the County's model disclosure categories.
- Designates the following positions as code filers: Board Member; Board Member Alternate; Executive Director; and Consultants/New Positions.

(Spadra Basin Groundwater Sustainability Agency)

- Adopts by reference Regulation 18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, Sections 18730) as its Conflict of Interest Code and will adopt the County's model disclosure categories.
- Designates the following positions as code filers: Executive Committee Member/Alternate;
   Administrative Officer; Implementation Team Member; Legal Counsel; Treasurer; and
   Consultants/New Positions.

#### SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES:

(Agricultural Commissioner/Weights and Measures)

Removes an unnecessary disclosure category.

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- Deletes Chief, Administrative Services from the code due to reorganization.
- Adds Administrative Deputy I to the code.

(Bassett Unified School District)

- Removes an unnecessary disclosure category.
- Changes the titles of two (2) positions.

(Downey Unified School District)

- Removes an unnecessary disclosure category.
- Changes the titles of two (2) positions.

(El Monte Union High School District)

Adds Director of Risk Management Safety to the code.

(Employee Relations Commission)

- Modifies the definition for income within an existing disclosure category.
- · Removes an unnecessary disclosure category.
- In Exhibit "B" the position "Consultant" is now Consultants/New Positions and a footnote has been added with the inclusion of an expanded definition for Consultants/New Positions.

(Los Angeles County Employees Retirement Association (LACERA))

- Changes the titles of two (2) positions.
- Adds Chief Technology Officer, LACERA and Chief Information Security Officer, LACERA to the code.

(Lynwood Unified School District)

- In Exhibit "A", wording is included to clarify Category 1.
- Removes an unnecessary disclosure category.
- Deletes Legal Analyst and Chief Technology Officer from the code due to reorganization.
- Changes the titles of two (2) positions.
- Expands the disclosure of one (1) position.

(Sulphur Springs School District)

Removes an unnecessary disclosure category.

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• Changes the title of one (1) position.

(Tri-Cities Regional Occupational Program (ROP))

- Removes an unnecessary disclosure category.
- Adds Alternative Members, Governing Board to the code.

# **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

Approving the attached Conflict of Interest Codes for these agencies will further the purposes of the Political Reform Act of 1974 by requiring the individuals designated in each agency's code to disclose appropriate economic interests.

The authority shall retain the originals of statements for all other Designated Positions named in the agency's conflict of interest code. All retained statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).
