Los Angeles County Claims Board's recommendation: Authorize settlement of the matter entitled <u>ACLU</u>, et al. v. County of Los Angeles, et al., Los Angeles Superior Court Case No. BS 143 004 in the amount of \$337,500 and instruct the Auditor-Controller to draw a warrant to implement this settlement from the Sheriff's Department's budget.

NATURE OF CASE

This is a recommendation to settle the attorneys'

fees claim associated with the mandamus proceeding pertaining to a California Public Records

Act in the amount of \$337,500. Petitioners
American Civil Liberties Union Foundation of
Southern California and Electronic Frontier

Foundation, allege that the Sheriff's Department improperly refused to release Automated Plate Reader Data. This matter has been litigated through multiple levels of appeal where Petitioners won

access to some of the requested data. Petitioners are entitled to recover attorneys' fees for a

successful mandamus petition. The full and final settlement of the case in the amount of \$337,500 is

recommended.
