To Whom It May Concern,

Below is my public comment in favor of items 3 and 4 on the 8/4/2020 Board of Supervisors meeting agenda. Thank you.

My name is Michelle Parris. I am a program manager in the Vera Institute of Justice's California Office. I am writing to support Agenda Items 3 ("Data Collection to Support Pretrial Reform in Los Angeles County") and 4 ("Creation of a Criminal Justice Data Sharing Initiative in Los Angeles County"). These motions are important steps in realizing the Alternatives to Incarceration (ATI) Work Group vision and improving policymaking around incarceration in Los Angeles County generally.

Open data on who is arrested, incarcerated, and supervised is key to developing effective reforms and equitably distributing resources. In New York City, Vera has used open incarceration data to create a [searchable platform](#) that allows the public and policymakers to see daily snapshots of people in custody, population trends, admission trends, and the length of incarceration. This real-time data helps to shape reforms and counter critics who highlight outlier cases or use anecdotal information to stymie progress. Similarly, open data can help the Board actualize its vision of decreased reliance on incarceration. For example, little is known publicly about the current drivers of incarceration or important metrics like racial disparities. Such data can help the Board craft tailored and informed policy solutions.

Los Angeles County's steps towards transparency come at a critical time and should reflect the urgency of the moment. Since the COVID-19 pandemic hit in March, the average daily population of the Los Angeles County jail system has decreased by over 5,000 people. The COVID-19 pandemic remains a public health threat in and out of jail, and up-to-date, publicly accessible information has never been more important. The timeline for Item 4 (publishing data beginning in 3 months) captures this urgency. Item 3—which allows 270 days for publication of information—should be amended to match the timeline for Item 4, particularly since Item 3 relates to the vulnerable pretrial population.

Items 3 and 4 taken together are a positive step among many the Board has taken recently to decrease the use of incarceration; promote antiracism; and focus on meaningful investments in community-based care. Thank you for these continued important efforts towards a "care first" county.
