Dear Supervisor Solis and the Board of Supervisors,

We applaud the thinking of Care First, Jail Last, and their work in supporting changes in the

justice system. We are glad to hear that Homeboy is calling on a partnership with the City for the construction of 148 transitional housing units at Alpine and Alameda St - and the creation of the Restorative Justice Village Master Plan. In response to the Motion on the Restorative Justice Village Master Plan, we urge the Supervisors to continue to prioritize the input of and consultation with members of the Chinatown community.

Homeboy Industries and The Community Endowment continue to be members of the Chinatown community and we are glad to share many of the same values. We were glad to see TCE and Homeboy Industries submit a thorough comment letter for the LA Arterial Transit (the gondola project), sharing many of the same concerns that we did, but we were disheartened to note that they mention the neighborhood of Chinatown, where they are located, only once in their 17-page report, indicating a disconnect with the community in which they are situated.

We support the introduction of the Restorative Justice Village Master Plan, but emphasize the

lack of community consultation and involvement from Chinatown residents in the development

of this master plan from both partners and Supervisor's office. In a community that has been

struggling under increasingly unaffordable rent, and transit-oriented displacement that has been only exacerbated by COVID-19, we are deeply disappointed with the lack of engagement.

Since March, low-income, often elderly Chinatown residents have lived in close guarters during

COVID-19 in single-room occupancy buildings-- some tenants have died, and many are at risk

of eviction (hence why some have gone on rent strike). It is no secret that tenants have been

struggling in the community even before the COVID-19 pandemic. The area median income for Chinatown, prior to the pandemic, was approximately \$20,000. This has been nowhere near sufficient for residents to survive— and that's without even considering current circumstances. Chinatowns have been deeply struggling, as reported by Citylab, Washington Post, NBC News, yet have received few resources and funds.

In the meeting with Supervisor Solis's office and members of the community in late November, we were shown indication of the plan, but have only learned of new information from others in the community— up until we pressed for updates on the Motion and plans. We have been disappointed in the lack of communication we received with regard to the progression of the motion, particularly because the community is in an affordable housing crisis, and on the verge

of massive waves of evictions. We urge you, Supervisor Solis and the Board, to continue to prioritize affordable housing in the Chinatown community and

I was greatly dismayed yesterday to see a number of Supervisors (including my own, Hilda Solis, whose overall leadership I have been impressed with lately) indicate that LA County should unquestioningly follow suit with the Governor's decision to lift the stay-at-home order. You can offer all the cautionary caveats you want to, but people will inevitably take this as a sign they can ease up. They will grow complacent, and we will be in danger of losing whatever modest progress we have made in recent weeks. When hospitals are forced to set up ICU overflow units in their cafeterias, we should not be allowing outdoor dining!

Item 24

I support Supervisor Solis's proposal to move forward with the Vignes Project in a way that is consistent with the spirit of an Alternatives to Incarceration policy vision.

Item 26

I applaud the Board for moving forward with ways to translate the passage of Measure R into actual policy. But I also support advocates pointing out the urgency of providing the COC with the tools (including a full-time consultant and data research team) necessary to complete a comprehensive Public Safety Reinvestment Plan. Having attended COC meetings numerous times, I can attest to the fact that most of the Commissioners are deeply committed but also stretched too thin. Putting this additional (and essential) task on their plate requires that we provide them with all the support they need.

The data analysis is important for numerous reasons, among them the need to assess exactly how much has been saved through reducing the prison population, so those funds can faithfully be reinvested in the community.

Finally, as I have in previous comments, I continue to urge you to take stronger steps to ensure that those who have been most affected by our current system of criminalization and mass incarceration have a seat at the table in the crafting of alternative policies. The standard platforms for public comment are insufficient. Groups in the Justice LA Coalition have deep expertise on these matters—expertise rooted in personal lived experience, and in research and study. The Board should be sure to draw on that expertise to the fullest extent possible.

Item 32

I support a ballot measure that would, if approved, amend the County charter and allow for impeachment and removal of the sheriff. Just like the impeachment of a president, this is obviously an extreme measure, and one to be used only in

extraordinary circumstances. But the current sheriff's behavior is proof that the people of LA County need this option available.

Item 35

Reimagining public safety will only become a reality if: a) there is substantial divestment and demilitarization of local law enforcement; b) if those savings are truly diverted to community reinvestment. If those 'savings' are largely kept within police and sheriff's department budgets, we will not see real change, and people will lose faith in the process. I have seen this happen already with the supposed 'cuts' to the LAPD budget. And advocates are raising real questions as to the same thing happening with AB 109 funds, many of which seem to be staying within LASD and going to things like overtime. It is essential that this reinvestment process to transparent and closely scrutinized.

General Comments

As I have stated in previous comments, I support phasing LASD out of traffic enforcement duties, as well as County hospitals. Involving armed law enforcement officers in these venues invites abuse and unnecessary escalation, as we have seen tragically and all too often.

Agenda Item 26: Report on the Comprehensive Public Safety Reinvestment Plan

Supervisors, thank you for supporting and recognizing the priority of honoring the people's mandate of Measure R's Comprehensive Public Safety Reinvestment Plan. The motion passed during November's Board meeting was instrumental in leading us here today. We are also grateful for the incremental steps taken by the Civilian Oversight Commission to advance the drafting of the plan and feasibility study and look forward to Mr. Williams' presentation to the Board at the January 26th meeting.

We can no longer fund a failing program. We must improve what is not working to meet the needs of the people. We do not need military equipment we need medical & mental health services. We do not need more jails we need more treatment centers. These changes will provide a healthy and comprehensive Public Safety Reinvestment Plan.

On March 3, 2020 -- by the will of 73% of LA County voters -- the historic passing of Measure R not only granted subpoena power to the COC, but also established that within 7 months of its passing, the Commission would draft and present to the Board the Comprehensive Public Safety Reinvestment Plan. The plan was to include a feasibility study focused on reducing the county jail population and reinvesting \$3.5 billion previously allocated to support jail expansion into prevention, mental health and additional community-based systems of care. I recognize the COC's inability to meet the 7-month mandate in October was partially due to internal staffing capacity and securing funding to support the drafting of the plan and feasibility study. I strongly recommend that the Board immediately take action to allocate funding to support the Commission in hiring a full-time consultant and data research team so that it may comply with the requirements of the Measure R mandate.

I am grateful for the advancements throughout the county with regards to "Cares First, Jails Last" and recognize the importance of streamlining efforts and resources to continue to support county work around decreasing the jail population and reinvesting in community-based systems of care. I am in full support of the COC becoming better aligned and more intentionally engaged in current county conversations with regards to decreasing the jail population. However, Measure R specifically asks for the assessing of savings and developing a plan for reinvestment of those savings. A task that is currently not being addressed in county conversations led by bodies such as ATI, ODR or

the Jail Population Review Council. I strongly concur that the Commission must play an important role in developing recommendations to reduce the jail population and must act immediately in drafting a plan to assess and reinvest cost-savings to more broadly support community-based public safety initiatives.

While I appreciate the Commission's efforts in convening the Measure R ad hoc committee, a more inclusive process is needed in which the expertise of community stakeholders especially system-impacted community leaders are engaged. I ask that the Commissioners prioritize space for community input - especially system-impacted community leaders invested in the drafting and successful implementation of the plan. Many of our community leaders have been actively engaged in the county's alternatives to incarceration efforts and their expertise should be incorporated to better inform the successful drafting and sustainable implementation of Measure R's plan and feasibility study. I strongly urge that the COC engage community voices and expert leaders in their research and adoption of the plan.

Agenda Item 32: Report Regarding Options for Removing the Sheriff

We appreciate the Board's efforts to hold law enforcement agencies accountable to standards of integrity and community safety. In light of the current sheriff's unwillingness to comply with existing accountability mechanisms, however, we urge the Board to take decisive action to enable voters to exercise democratic accountability. Just as with Measure J, which received overwhelming support from voters, the

Board should put on the ballot an amendment to the LA County charter to allow for the impeachment and removal of the sheriff for specific serious violations of the public trust, including legal violations, obstruction of oversight, and patterns of unconstitutional conduct.I strongly support divesting from the Sheriff and investing in care because we are talking about lives of our citizens. We need a Sheriff we trust to care for citizens, his staff and be accountable and transparent to the Board of Supervisors. We need a Sheriff that will listen to the people. Currently, the Sheriff's actions are unprofessional. I have attended the last two LAC Sheriff Oversight Committee Meeting and I have just be shocked by his indignation to the board & citizens. He never stayed at the meeting to listen to the people. I support the removal of the current Sheriff and ensuring the Board of Supervisors have the power to immediately move any Sheriff the fails to uphold his oath to the citizens, fails to be acceptable and fail to be transparent to Los Angeles citizens.

By adding the power to remove the sheriff for misconduct – including the current sheriff's repeated and deliberate obstruction of oversight – the Board would help ensure sheriffs comply with existing transparency, accountability, and oversight requirements without obstruction or delay. Although sheriffs are elected, California law allows for considerable secrecy of law enforcement records, including investigations of misconduct. In granting voters the power to remove sheriffs who systematically block oversight, this amendment would help ensure that voters have the information necessary to hold sheriffs democratically accountable. Allowing for the removal of a sheriff for serious misconduct ultimately strengthens democratic accountability – not just for the current sheriff, but for future sheriffs to come.

In the event of impeachment and removal, the County should consider limiting the Board's power to appoint whomever it wants as the interim sheriff, especially in cases where a significant portion of the term remains. Instead, consistent with the hiring practices at large police departments, the Board could delegate to the COC the responsibility to hold public hearings and create a list of candidates.

Agenda Item 35: Report on the Implementation of the California Public Safety Realignment Act

For nearly a decade, Los Angeles County community members have called for an evaluation of AB109 spending in our county and a reinvestment in community-based alternatives to incarceration. Since 2011, Los Angeles County has received \$2.5 billion dollars in AB109 funding intended to help counties develop and implement alternatives to incarceration such as innovations in re-entry, community-based services, and affordable housing. However, the Sheriff's and Probation Departments have received the vast majority of these funds (77%) and use these dollars as slush funds to pay overtime.

Every day incarcerated people are being denied release or parole because there are no Transitional Housing in the area where they live. Due to COVID-19 several Transitional Houses are not admitting because they do not have funds for the PPE requirements. Its critical that AB109 funds should be used for more Transitional Housing and Rehabilitation Services and not as personal slush funds for the Sheriff and Probation Department.

This Board has put forward several motions to assess how we can reallocate AB109 funding out of the Sheriff's Department and into the

specific Care First recommendations outlined by the Alternatives to Incarceration (ATI) Report.

This most recent implementation report from the County of Los Angeles Probation Department shows that a vast misallocation of funds is still underway in the County. The Report shows that over \$344 million dollars of AB109 funding were allocated to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and Probation Departments combined, whereas only \$22 million of these dollars were allocated to the Office of Diversion and Reentry (ODR). The ODR was created in 2015 to support community members in being diverted out of law enforcement custody or supervision. Given that AB109 dollars are focused on innovations in re-entry, the vast misallocation of these dollars to the Sheriff's Department instead of ODR is a grave mistake, and one that results in serious harm to our communities. As a result, we call for a continued divestment from the Sheriff's Department and Probation and into the Office of Diversion and Reentry; we know that for ODR, people being returned home to our communities is priority.

We call on this Board to be courageous, and to continue to move AB109 funding out of the Sheriff's Department and Probation and into the community-based, non law-enforcement alternatives to incarceration as outlined in the ATI report. We will support you every step of the way.

I support a restorative justice village plan, yet I respectfully urge you to make a motion to amend the existing Restorative Justice Village Master Plan motion by striking out the language referencing Lot 45. An alternative may be to insert language that reserves a percentage of new affordable housing units specifically for low income families and seniors.

For several years, various constituent groups communicated with you to develop a comprehensive vision for the redevelopment of Lot 45 and additional properties. The filed motion proposes a master plan with a scope that does not accommodate needs that many in Chinatown believed, based on communications with you, were among your top priorities for the area under consideration—e.g., some affordable housing units for low income seniors and families. Currently, the plan exclusively involves Homeboy Industries and The California Endowment, with Chinatown merely receiving mention at the end of the motion as a community to outreach with.

It is not too late to implement a more unifying approach. I urge you to reconsider, and to bridge the divides by bringing together the various community groups. I hope to see you leading the way to successful collaborations and partnerships. With your leadership, and with the community behind you, I believe that you can identify common ground and unite your constituents to support a shared, expanded vision that meets a more diverse set of needs while serving a greater number of constituents in the community.

Furthermore, I believe you will find that Chinatown constituents agree that restorative justice is a top priority. In fact many of us, including myself, made public comments at numerous meetings supporting you in the period leading to the final actions resulting in the decision to close the Men's Central County Jail.

Dear Board of Supervisors,

My name is Aileen Louie and I am the Vice President of Development and Communications at Asian Americans Advancing Justice – Los Angeles. First, I want to express my gratitude to Supervisor Solis for her leadership to create a holistic plan that recognizes the urgent need of so many disenfranchised communities. We are appreciative of the inclusive process of the planning and are support of the master plan.

Our organization has worked for 37 years focusing on the advancement of civil rights and social justice through the provision of legal services for the indigent, impact litigation and policy advocacy. Our partners at the Pacific Asian Consortium in Employment (PACE) have been in the community even longer providing services related to workforce & business development, early childhood education and affordable housing.

Within the planning area, we are proposing a joint project to address the plan's need for affordable housing and economic development for the Chinatown community. We are partnering to build a community development campus on Lot 45 (725 N Spring St, Los Angeles, CA) and Vehicle Maintenance Yard(1055 N Alameda, Los Angeles, CA). The project includes affordable housing, a business incubator and job training center, a nonprofit office building, a community cultural center, and a childcare center.

Over the course of our planning, we have been working with Chinatown residents, business owners and stakeholders in order to understand their specific needs and gain their support. On a personal note, my partner's family has deep roots in Chinatown and

his parents live there still. Chinatown is a second home to me and have a deep appreciation of how meaningful this project will be to the community.

We are asking Supervisor Solis and the Board to carefully consider the Community Empowerment Campus project we are planning for Parking Lot 45 and the Vehicle Maintenance Yard on Alameda.
