ANNEXATION AND LEVYING OF ASSESSMENTS FOR COUNTY LIGHTING
DISTRICTS IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF AZUSA, WEST WHITTIER/
LOS NIETOS, EAST LA MIRADA, ROWLAND HEIGHTS, AND KINNELOA MESA
(SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS 1, 4, AND 5)
(3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

Public Works is seeking Board approval and authorization to (1) annex Petition Nos. 3-117, 72-1016, 117-1118, 79-718 and 19-517 located in the unincorporated areas of Azusa, West Whittier/Los Nietos, East La Mirada, Rowland Heights, and Kinneloa Mesa to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District Landscaping and Lighting Act-1, Unincorporated Zone; formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117; approval of a loan from County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to Improvement Zone 559 to finance the estimated \$16,000 cost of installing a street lighting system; (2) order the levying of assessments for street lighting purposes; and (3) approve the negotiated exchange of property tax revenues among those nonexempt taxing agencies whose service areas are subject to the jurisdictional changes.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

1. Find that the proposed project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act for the reasons stated in this letter and record of the action.

- 2. Approve the Engineer's Reports for Petition Nos. 3-117, 72-1016, 117-1118, 79-718, and 19-517, either as filed or as modified, for the annexation of territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District Landscaping and Lighting Act-1, Unincorporated Zone; formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117; and the levying of assessments within the annexed territories for street lighting purposes. The proposed annexation areas are located in the unincorporated areas of Azusa, West Whittier/Los Nietos, East La Mirada, Rowland Heights, and Kinneloa Mesa.
- 3. Adopt the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District Landscaping and Lighting Act-1, Unincorporated Zone; order formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117; Order the Levying of a Special Assessment in Improvement Zone 559 for Fiscal Year 2022-23; and Order the Levying of Assessments within the Annexed Territories for Fiscal Year 2022-23 whose areas and boundaries are identified on the diagrams included in the resolution.
- 4. Set a date for a public hearing regarding the proposed annexations, formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117, and levying of annual assessments within the annexed territories for street lighting purposes based on the approved Engineer's Reports, which establish assessments for each petition area based on land use type with an annual base assessment rate for a single-family residence of \$5 for the Unincorporated Zone of County Lighting District Landscaping and Lighting Act-1; approval of a loan from County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to Improvement Zone 559 for the cost of installing the streetlights in an amount currently estimated to be \$16,000; and approval and levying of a special annual assessment currently estimated to be \$138.37 per parcel per year for 10 years beginning in Fiscal Year 2022-23 against benefited properties to repay the loan.
- 5. Instruct the Executive Officer of the Board to cause notice of the public hearing by mail at least 45 days prior to the scheduled public hearing date of Tuesday, April 20, 2021, pursuant to Section 53753 of the California Government Code. The mailed notice will include assessment ballots.
- 6. Instruct the Executive Officer of the Board to cause notice of the public hearing to be posted in three conspicuous places within the territories to be annexed and to publish the notice of public hearing once a week for two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation. Such posting and publication to be completed at least 10 days prior to the date of hearing, pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code Section 5838.

AFTER THE PUBLIC HEARING, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

- 1. Find that the annexations and assessments are for the purpose of meeting operating expenses; purchasing supplies, equipment, or materials; meeting financial reserve needs and requirements; and obtaining funds for capital projects, including the installation, operation, and maintenance of streetlights necessary to maintain service within the proposed annexation territories.
- 2. Order changes, if needed, in any matters provided in the Engineer's Reports, including changes in the improvements, the proposed diagrams, and/or proposed assessments.
- 3. Order the tabulation of assessment ballots submitted, and not withdrawn, in support of or in opposition to the proposed assessments.
- 4. Determine whether a majority protest against the proposed annexations or assessments exists.

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- 5. Make a finding terminating the annexation, the formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117, levying of assessments, and property tax transfer proceedings in those petition territories where the proposed annexation and levying of assessments have been rejected as a result of a majority protest and refer the matter back to Public Works.
- 6. If there is no majority protest against the proposed annexations or assessments:
- a. Adopt the Resolution Ordering Annexation of Territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District Landscaping and Lighting Act-1, Unincorporated Zone, ordering formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117, Confirming a Diagram and Assessment, and Levying of Assessments within the Annexed Territories for Fiscal Year 2022-23, either as proposed or as modified by the Board. The adoption of the resolution ordering annexation shall constitute the levying of assessments in Fiscal Year 2022-23.
- b. Approve a loan from County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117 for the cost of installing four streetlights on concrete poles in an amount currently estimated to be \$16,000. The actual cost for installation plus interest will be assessed over a 10-year period from Fiscal Year 2022-23 through Fiscal Year 2031-2032 in equal payments of approximately \$138.37 per parcel per year for each of the 12 benefited parcels located therein.
- c. Instruct the Director of Public Works or his designee to proceed with the installation of four streetlights on concrete poles with overhead wiring within Improvement Zone 559.
- d. Adopt the joint resolutions between the Board and other taxing agencies approving and accepting the negotiated exchange of property tax revenues resulting from the annexation of territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 as approved by the nonexempt taxing agencies.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended actions will find that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines and allow the Board to: (1) annex the territories known as Petition Nos. 3-117 (Laxford Road), 72-1016 (Pioneer Boulevard et al.), 117-1118 (Santa Gertrudes Avenue), 79-718 (Valencia Street and Alexdale Lane), and 19-517 (Kinneloa Canyon Road) to County Lighting Maintenance District (CLMD) 1687 and County Lighting District (CLD) Landscaping and Lighting Act-1 (LLA-1), Unincorporated Zone (collectively, County Lighting Districts); (2) form Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117 for the purposes of financing the installation of street lights on concrete poles; (3) levy a special assessment for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 -23 on the benefited parcels within Improvement Zone 559; (4) levy assessments in FY 2022-23 on each lot or parcel lying within the proposed annexed territories based on land use categories that designate usage units on the basis of benefits received; and (5) approve the exchange of property tax revenues between CLMD 1687 and other nonexempt taxing entities whose service areas are subject to the jurisdictional changes.

The installation of streetlights on concrete poles is subject to installation charges. Per the California Streets and Highways Code, the Board can provide for a temporary advance to an improvement fund and direct that the advance be repaid by a special assessment levied and collected in annual installments. The formation of Improvement Zone 559 will provide for the financing of the estimated \$16,000 cost to install four streetlights on concrete poles with overhead wiring within Petition No. 3-117.

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Annexation of territory to the County Lighting Districts is required prior to the installation of new streetlights requested by property owners. The approved petitions are for the installation, operation, and maintenance of new streetlights. There will be levying of annual assessments within the annexed territories for street lighting based on land use type with an annual base assessment rate for a single-family residence of \$5 and proportionately higher rates for other land uses for the Unincorporated Zone.

If the annexations are approved by the Board after the public hearing, Public Works will proceed to complete streetlight design and installations.

<u>Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals</u>

These recommendations support the County Strategic Plan: Strategy II.2, Support the Wellness of our Communities and Strategy III.3, Pursue Operational Effectiveness, Fiscal Responsibility, and Accountability. Annexation of territories to the County Lighting Districts will allow for the installation of streetlights in these communities and provide funding necessary for their operation and maintenance. Maintaining lighting services provides for the convenience and safety of the motoring public, as well as the safety and security of people and property, which improves the quality of life in the County.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The estimated annual costs for the operation and maintenance of the streetlights within the annexed territories is \$11,153 for CLMD 1687 (Fund F46). Sufficient funding will be included in the Fund F46 FY 2022-23 Budget.

Upon the Board's approval, CLMD 1687 will finance streetlight installation in Improvement Zone 559 with a loan of funds to be repaid by a special assessment on the property owners in Improvement Zone 559. The loan is currently estimated to be \$16,000 and will be repaid over a 10-year period beginning in FY 2022-23 and ending in FY 2031-32. Repayment will include interest computed based on the County's pooled surplus investment fund restricted interest rate; the annual payment amount per parcel is shown on the Amortization Schedule attached to the Engineer's Report for Petition No. 3-117 (Improvement Zone 559). The special assessment will be levied by CLD LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, and transferred to CLMD 1687.

In subsequent years, the ongoing operation and maintenance costs of the streetlights within the annexed territories will be funded by the CLMD's share of ad valorem property taxes, supplemented by assessments annually approved by the Board from property owners within these annexed territories. Adoption of the joint resolutions will result in a minimal property tax growth transfer from the affected taxing entities to CLMD 1687, including the following taxing entities governed by the Board: the County General Fund, Los Angeles County Public Library, Road Maintenance Districts 1, 4, and 5, Los Angeles County Flood Control Drainage Improvement Maintenance District, Los Angeles County Flood Control District, and the Consolidated Fire ProtectionDistrict of Los Angeles County.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The Board previously approved and filed Petition Nos. 3-117, 72-1016, 117-1118, 79-718, and 19-517; adopted a resolution initiating proceedings for the annexation of territories to CLMD 1687; formed Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117; and ordered the Director of Public Works to

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prepare and file an Engineer's Report for each petitioned territory. The enclosed Engineer's Reports were prepared in response to that directive (Enclosure A).

Temporary advances to finance improvements and assessments to repay the advances are authorized by California Streets and Highways Code Sections 22657 and 22660. At the time Petition No. 3-117 (Improvement Zone 559) was initiated, the County's pooled surplus investment fund restricted interest rate was 0.82 percent, which resulted in an estimated annual payment of \$139.42 per parcel for a 10-year period as reflected in Petition No. 3-117. The County's pooled surplus investment fund restricted interest rate is currently computed to be 0.68 percent. Thus, the special assessment is currently estimated to be \$138.37 per parcel per year, collected from the owners of the 12 parcels in Improvement Zone 559, over a 10-year period from FY 2022-23 through FY 2031-32.

Under California Government Code Section 53753, it is necessary to follow the procedures for levying of assessments previously authorized by the Board, including the distribution, receipt, and tabulation of ballots at a public hearing. Ballots will be mailed to each property owner within the annexation territories. The assessment will only be levied if the weighted majority of ballots returned are in favor of the assessment.

The enclosed Resolution of Intention to Annex Territories (Enclosure B) must be adopted to set a date for the required public hearing. The Board, at the close of the public hearing, may delay its determination regarding the annexations and levying of assessments until a later date, continue the public hearing to receive further testimony, or make a determination regarding the annexation and/or assessment. The approval of the enclosed Resolution Ordering Annexation (Enclosure C), the levying of assessments, and the joint resolutions for the exchange of property tax revenues are required to provide the necessary funding for the operation and maintenance of the streetlights in the annexed territories.

The California Revenue and Taxation Code Section 99.01(a)(4) provides that affected agencies must approve and accept the negotiated exchange of property tax revenues by resolution. The joint resolutions approving and accepting the negotiated exchange of property tax revenues have been approved by nonexempt taxing agencies and are enclosed for your consideration (Enclosure D).

The boundaries of the proposed annexations have been reviewed and approved by Public Works and the Assessor in accordance with the requirements of California Government Code Section 58850 et seq. and are on file with Public Works. A copy of the diagram showing the boundaries of each proposed annexation area is included in the Engineer's Report prepared for each petition area.

Following the Board's approval of the resolutions for the annexation, levying of assessments, and exchange of property tax revenues Public Works will file the statement of boundary changes with the State Board of Equalization as required by California Government Code Section 54900 et seq. The resolutions have been approved as to form by County Counsel.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

The proposed action is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA. The project to annex territories to the County Lighting Districts for the purpose of enhancing street lighting is within a class of projects that have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment in that it meets the criteria set forth in Section 15301(c) of CEQA Guidelines and Class 1(x)(27) of the County's Environmental Document Reporting Procedures and Guidelines, Appendix G, that

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specifically include annexations to street lighting districts and installation of streetlights and involves no expansion of use. In addition, there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstance, or other limiting factors that would make the exemption inapplicable based on the project records.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

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The annexation of territories to the County Lighting Districts will result in street lighting for these areas and will have no impact on other services or projects.

LOS ANGELES COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS ENGINEER'S REPORT PETITION NO. 3-117 IMPROVEMENT ZONE 559 (LAXFORD ROAD)

On May 14, 2019, Item 63, the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution initiating proceedings for the annexation of territory to County Lighting Maintenance District (CLMD) 1687 and County Lighting District (CLD) Landscaping and Lighting Act-1 (LLA-1), Unincorporated Zone, and formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117, pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, for the purpose of providing for the cost of installation, operation, and maintenance of four streetlights on new concrete poles with overhead wiring within the territory proposed for annexation, as shown on the diagram, plan, and specifications attached hereto. In addition, Public Works was ordered to prepare and file an Engineer's Report in accordance with Section 22565 et seq. of the California Streets and Highways Code and Article XIII D, Section 4(b) of the California Constitution. This report was prepared in response to that directive.

Upon formation of Improvement Zone 559, a loan of \$16,000 can be advanced from CLMD 1687 and CLD LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, to finance the installation costs of the street lighting system. The loan, which includes an interest at 0.68 percent based on the County's pooled surplus investment fund, will be repaid by the 12 benefited parcels within Improvement Zone 559, over a 10-year period, from Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 through FY 2031-32, in equal payments currently estimated to be \$138.37 per parcel per year, as shown in the attached Amortization Schedule. This special assessment will be added to the FY 2022-23 tax bill of property owners within Improvement Zone 559. Improvement Zone 559 will automatically terminate provided there are no outstanding obligations payables from special assessments to be levied in said Zone. An annual operation and maintenance assessment of \$5 per parcel will be added to the FY 2022-23 tax bill of property owners within Improvement Zone 559. The Assessor's parcel numbers of the 12 benefited parcels within Improvement Zone 559 are shown in Appendix A.

In addition, the annual operating cost of \$465 for the four 41-watt light emitting diode streetlights will be funded by CLMD 1687 and CLD LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone. An annual assessment for the operation and maintenance of the streetlights of \$5 per parcel for a single-family home, with proportionately higher assessments for other land uses, based on the approved FY 2020-21 Annual Engineer's Report for CLD LLA-1, is proposed to be added to the FY 2022-23 tax bill of property owners whose parcels lie within the boundary of Petition No. 3-117. Each year thereafter, an annual assessment for the operation and maintenance costs of the streetlights, approved by the Board of Supervisors, will be added to the property tax bill.


With the passage of Proposition 218 (the Right to Vote on Taxes Act) by the California voters in November 1996, the levying of an assessment is now subject to certain provisions under Article XIII D of the California Constitution. This report conforms with the applicable provisions of Proposition 218.

CLMD 1687 is an established street lighting district and was fully funded from ad valorem property taxes prior to the passage of Proposition 13 (The People's Initiative to Limit Property Taxation) in 1978, which limited the maximum amount of ad valorem tax on real property. The ad valorem property taxes received under the guidelines established by the State Legislature subsequent to the passage of this amendment are not sufficient to pay the cost of the street lighting in the district. Therefore, CLD LLA-1 was formed under the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 (Section 22585 et seq.) to provide supplemental funding.

The Landscaping and Lighting Act provides for the assessment of street lighting costs against the benefited properties within the lighting district in proportion to the benefits received. A method of distributing the street lighting costs on the basis of land use and land-use data compiled by the Assessor was approved by the Board of Supervisors on May 22, 1979, and amended on July 22, 1997, to include government-owned or -leased parcels. This report showing the approved method and the assessment units to be assessed on the various types of lots and parcels based on land usage is on file in the office of the Board of Supervisors and is made a part hereof by reference. The FY 2020-21 Annual Engineer's Report, which lists the base rate assessment for all zones within CLD LLA-1 and the total assessment amount to be collected from benefited parcels in each zone based on land use, is on file in the office of the Board of Supervisors and is made a part hereof by reference.

The affected parcels of real property are shown in Appendix A, included herein. The parcels are more particularly described in a map prepared in accordance with Section 327 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, which is on file in the office of the Assessor and is made a part hereof by reference.

We believe that it would be in the public interest to form Improvement Zone 559 to finance the installation of streetlights in the designated territory as requested by the signers of Petition No. 3-117 and to provide for their operation and maintenance.

LOS ANGELES COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS ENGINEER'S REPORT PETITION NO. 72-1016 (PIONEER BOULEVARD ET AL.)

On May 14, 2019, Item 63, the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution initiating proceedings for the annexation of territory to County Lighting Maintenance District (CLMD) 1687 and County Lighting District (CLD) Landscaping and Lighting Act-1 (LLA-1), Unincorporated Zone, pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, for the purpose of providing for the cost of installation, operation, and maintenance of 37 streetlights on new and existing wood poles within the territory proposed for annexation, as shown on the diagram, plan, and specifications attached hereto. In addition, Public Works was ordered to prepare and file an Engineer's Report in accordance with Section 22565 et seq. of the California Streets and Highways Code and Article XIII D, Section 4(b) of the California Constitution. This report was prepared in response to that directive.

There will be no cost for the installation of the 37 streetlights on new and existing wood poles. The annual operating cost of \$6,590 for the ten 9,500 lumen and twenty-seven 22,000 lumen high pressure sodium vapor streetlights will be funded by CLMD 1687 and CLD LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone. An annual assessment for the operation and maintenance of the streetlights of \$5 per parcel for a single-family home, with proportionately higher assessments for other land uses, based on the approved Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21 Annual Engineer's Report for CLD LLA-1, is proposed to be added to the FY 2022-23 tax bill of property owners whose parcels lie within the boundary of Petition No. 72-1016. Each year thereafter, an annual assessment for the operation and maintenance costs of the streetlights, approved by the Board of Supervisors, will be added to the property tax bill.



WHEREAS, the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors previously approved and filed Petition Nos. 72-1016, 117-1118, 79-718, and 19-517 located in the unincorporated area requesting annexation of territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District Landscaping and Lighting Act-1 (LLA-1), Unincorporated Zone, to provide for the installation, operation, and maintenance of streetlights within the annexed territories and assessments for the costs thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors previously approved and filed Petition No. 3-117 requesting the annexation of territory and formation of Improvement Zone 559 in County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District Landscaping and Lighting Act-1 (LLA-1), Unincorporated Zone to finance the installation costs of the street lighting system on Laxford Road from Oakbank Drive easterly to end of cul-de-sac in the Azusa area.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors on ____February 9, 2021 ___, has approved the Engineer's Reports for said territories, which contains descriptions of the improvements, estimated installation and operating costs, diagram of the territories to be annexed, and recommended assessments as required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, that:

SECTION 1. The public interest and convenience require and it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors to order the benefited territories hereinafter described, all of which territory lies in the Los Angeles County, be annexed to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code Section 5837.

SECTION 2. The public interest and convenience require and it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors to order the benefited territories be annexed to County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code Section 22605, and that the area within Petition No. 3-117 be formed to Improvement

Zone 559, in County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code Section 22574.

SECTION 3. The public interest and convenience require and it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors to order the expense necessary for the operation, maintenance, repairs, replacement, electric current, care, supervision, and all other items necessary for the proper operation and maintenance of street lighting systems proposed within the annexed territories shall be assessed in Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 upon each lot or parcel of land lying within the annexed territories in proportion to the estimated benefit received from the proposed street lighting improvements and which should be assessed to pay the expenses of the operation and maintenance of said improvements. An annual Engineer's Report, approved by the Board of Supervisors each fiscal year, establishes the annual base rate assessment for all zones within County Lighting District LLA-1. For FY 2022-23, the annual base rate assessments for the Unincorporated Zone is \$5 for a single-family residence, with proportionately higher assessment rates for other land uses. This annual assessment for the operation and maintenance of streetlights is proposed to be added to the property tax bill of benefited parcels within the boundary of County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, in FY 2022-23. Each year thereafter, an assessment for operation and maintenance costs approved by the Board will be added to the property tax bill.

Formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117 will allow for the financing of the estimated \$16,000 cost for the installation of four streetlights on concrete poles with overhead wiring. The loan from County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to Improvement Zone 559 is necessary to provide funding for the installation costs of these streetlights. The loan will be repaid to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 through an annual special assessment currently estimated to be \$138.37 per parcel per year, collected from property owners of the 12 benefited parcels over a 10-year period from Fiscal Year 2022-2023 through FY 2031-2032.

The Engineer's Report prepared for each petitioned territory contains a full and detailed description of the proposed improvements, a description of the lots or parcels of land to be annexed, the estimated costs of operation and maintenance, a diagram of the territory to be annexed, and the recommended assessment on each lot or parcel of land included therein.

SECTION 4. The boundaries of the territories proposed for annexation and formation of Improvement Zone 559 consists of the areas shown on the attached maps.

SECTION 5. The proposed assessment is subject to majority approval of the property owners. A ballot and public hearing notice will be sent to all property owners within the areas proposed for annexation at least 45 days prior to the date of the public hearing in the form and manner specified by California Government Code Section 53753. The ballots will be weighted by the amount of assessment to be paid by each property owner. The territory will not be annexed, and the proposed assessment will be abandoned if the weighted majority of ballots submitted are opposed to the assessment.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors previously approved and filed Petition No. 3-117 requesting the annexation of territory and formation of Improvement Zone 559 in County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, to finance the installation costs of the proposed street lighting system on Laxford Road from Oakbank Drive easterly to end of cul-de-sac in the Azusa area.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors on ________, has approved the Engineer's Reports, which identifies the diagrams, improvements, assessments, plans and specifications, and other pertinent data for each petitioned territory, and adopted a Resolution of Intention to Annex Territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, Order Formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117, Order the Levying of a Special Assessment in Improvement Zone 559 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023, and Order the Levying of Assessments within the Annexed Territories for Fiscal Year 2022-23; and fixed a time for hearing Petition Nos. 3-117, 72-1016, 117-1118, 79-718 and 19-517, and the protests of interested persons; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer of the Board of Supervisors did cause the notice of public hearing to be mailed to all property owners within the territories subject to the proposed annexation at least 45 days prior to the date set for hearing; and

WHEREAS, Public Works has mailed assessment ballots and notices to property owners of identified parcels within the territories proposed for annexation pursuant to California Government Code Section 53753 to indicate support or opposition on the matter of the assessment; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer of the Board of Supervisors did cause the notice of the public hearing to be posted in three conspicuous places within the territories to be annexed and did give notice of the public hearing by publishing once a week for two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation; and

WHEREAS, said Board of Supervisors has heard all testimony and evidence with regard to the annexations, formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117, and levy of assessments and has tabulated all returned assessment ballots concerning the proposed assessments and has found that no majority protest exists.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, that:

SECTION 1. Petition Nos. 3-117, 72-1016, 117-1118, 79-718, and 19-517 for annexation of territories hereinafter described to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, and formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117, hereinafter described to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, were signed by property owners representing 60 percent or more of the areas proposed to be annexed.

SECTION 2. The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the public interest and convenience require the installation, operation, and maintenance of the street lighting improvements within the territories proposed for annexation and hereby grants the petitions.

SECTION 3. The Board of Supervisors hereby orders the annexation of territories listed in Attachment A to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, and formation of Improvement Zone 559 for Petition No. 3-117 with the exception where a majority protest exists.

SECTION 4. The Board of Supervisors hereby determines that the territories identified will benefit by the annexation to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1, Unincorporated Zone, and hereby orders the boundary of said districts be altered to include said benefited territories.

SECTION 5. The Diagrams and Assessments, as set forth in the Engineer's Reports or as modified, are hereby approved, confirmed, and adopted by this Board.

SECTION 6. The Director of Public Works or his designee shall authorize the installation, operation, and maintenance of the street lighting improvements indicated in the Engineer's Reports.

SECTION 7. Improvement Zone 559 shall remain in existence for a 10-year period, from Fiscal Year 2022-23 through Fiscal Year 2031-32, in which a special assessment estimated to be \$138.37 per parcel per year is to be levied against the 12 parcels located therein, for the repayment of a \$16,000 loan to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 for street lighting improvements indicated in the Engineer's Report, and shall thereafter automatically terminate provided there are no outstanding obligation payable from the special assessment to be levied in said zone.

SECTION 8. 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





WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, acting on behalf of the County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, Los Angeles County General Fund, Los Angeles County Public Library, Los Angeles County Road District 4, the Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County, Los Angeles County Flood Control Drainage Improvement Maintenance District, and Los Angeles County Flood Control District; the Board of Trustees of the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District; the Board of Directors of the County Sanitation District No. 21 of Los Angeles County; the Board of Directors of the Three Valleys Municipal Water District - Original Area; the Board of Directors of the Walnut Valley Water District; and the Board of Directors of the Walnut Valley Water Improvement District No. 5 have determined that the amount of property tax revenue to be exchanged between their respective agencies as a result of the annexation proposal identified as Petition No. 79-718 to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 are as shown on the attached Property Tax Transfer Resolution Worksheet.

- 1. The negotiated exchange of property tax revenues between the County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, Los Angeles County General Fund, Los Angeles County Public Library, Los Angeles County Road District 4, the Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County, Los Angeles County Flood Control Drainage Improvement Maintenance District, Los Angeles County Flood Control District, the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District, the County Sanitation District No. 21 of Los Angeles County, the Three Valleys Municipal Water District - Original Area, the Walnut Valley Water District, and the Walnut Valley Water Improvement District No. 5 resulting from the annexation of Petition No. 79-718 to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 is approved and accepted.
- 2. For fiscal years commencing on or after July 1, 2020, or the July 1 after the effective date of this jurisdictional change, whichever is later, the property tax revenue increment generated from the area Petition No. 79-718, Tax Rate Area 08366, shall be allocated to the affected agencies as indicated on the attached Property Tax Transfer Resolution Worksheet.
- 3. No transfer of property tax revenues other than those specified in Paragraph 2 shall be made as a result of the annexation of Petition No. 79-718.
- 4. If at any time after the effective date of this resolution, the calculations used herein to determine initial property tax transfers or the data used to perform those calculations are found to be incorrect, thus producing an improper or inaccurate property tax transfer, the property tax transfer shall be recalculated and the corrected transfer shall be implemented for the next fiscal year.




