

What's Different Now

Between June-July 2021:

- Case rates in age groups and racial/ethnic groups increased by 3 to 9 times their baseline
- Hospitalization rates doubled
- Largest case rate increases by age group were in young adults

Between November-December 2020:

- Case rates and hospitalization rates increased 4-5 times their baseline
- Largest case rate increases by age group were in 65+




Strategies to Focus Outreach Efforts in Newly Hard-Hit Areas

- Targeted outreach to encourage vaccinations and implementation of safety strategies (masking, infection control); targeted outreach for PEH
- Additional mobile teams at some large apartment complexes and businesses
- Targeted social media urging vaccinations and masking in hardest hit communities



COVID-19 Cases Among LAC Residents 16+ by Month and Vaccination Status February 1 – June 30, 2021






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Case Rate* per 100,000 for Los Angeles County Residents** by Vaccination Status May 1 – July 10, 2021






COVID-19 Hospitalizations Among LAC Residents 16+ by Month and Vaccination Status February 1 – June 30, 2021



COVID-19 Deaths Among LAC Residents 16+ by Vaccination Status January 1 – June 30, 2021






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COVID-19 Deaths Among LAC Residents 16+ by Vaccination Status April 1 – June 30, 2021

Vaccine Effectiveness Against Delta Variant

- In U.K. study¹, Pfizer vaccine effectiveness (VE) was lower against delta variants than against alpha variants
 - After 2 doses, VE was 88% vs. delta and 93.7% vs. alpha
 - After 1 dose, VE was 30.7% vs. delta and 48.7% vs. alpha
- In Israel, Pfizer VE was 93% against hospitalizations and severe illness during high-delta-circulation period (June-July, 2021)
 - VE was 64% against symptomatic infections and infections overall





New State Health Officer Order

- Requires all acute health care and long-term care settings, high-risk congregate settings (jails, homeless shelters, adult and senior care facilities), and other healthcare settings to verify the vaccination status of workers
- For unvaccinated or partially vaccinated workers:
 Facilities must provide respirators upon request
 - Facilities recommend respirator use in patient care areas and patient/resident access areas
 - In all other areas and facilities, workers must wear surgical masks indoors wherever they are working with another person
 - Workers must be tested
 - at least twice weekly (in acute health care, SNFs and ICFs)
 - at least once weekly (in high-risk congregate settings and all other healthcare settings)
