Extend the Reward Offer in the Murder of Brian Greene

On Tuesday, January 19, 2021, at approximately 4:10 p.m., 34-year-old Brian Greene, a father of three, and a full-time union carpenter was shot and killed as he entered the driver’s seat of his dark purple Infiniti M37s, which was parked in the Jack’s Liquor Store parking lot at 4700 West Imperial Highway in the city of Hawthorne. A white BMW 320i that had followed Brian Greene from his residence parked next to Brian Greene’s Infiniti while he was inside of Jack’s Liquor. Upon Brian Greene’s return, the rear passenger exited the white BMW 320i and fired several gunshots from a handgun before fleeing westbound on Imperial Highway towards the 405 freeway. Brian Greene was hit multiples times by the gunfire and succumbed to his injuries.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff’s Department Homicide detectives believe there are witnesses in the neighborhood who may know the identities of the suspect(s) and/or the owner of the BMW 320i and that a reward motion by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors (Board) would help in solving the case. The Board established this reward on June 8, 2021. This reward is set to expire on September 5, 2021 and needs to be extended. Any individuals with information about this senseless crime are urged to contact LASD Homicide Bureau or Crime Stoppers.

I THEREFORE MOVE THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

Extend the offer of a reward in the amount of \$10,000 in exchange for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the death of
