Report by the Inspector General on Reform and Oversight Efforts

On today's agenda, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors (Board) will consider the Office of Inspector General's Report on Reform and Oversight Efforts: Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department – October to December 2022, which was continued from the Board meeting of February 15, 2022.

On May 31, 2016, the Board ordered all departments to provide regular public safety updates, including the Office of Inspector General's (OIG) quarterly report on reform and oversight efforts with regard to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD). By way of motion on January 9, 2018, the Board granted the OIG an extension and moved the report date to the first Tuesday following the second Sunday of February, May, August, and November.

In recent years the reports have been delayed due to the time needed for the OIG to obtain and review data at the conclusion of the quarter, incorporate the data into the report, provide LASD an opportunity to review and comment on the report, and to allow the OIG to make any changes it deemed appropriate in response to the comments or concerns expressed by LASD. As a result, the presentation of the report has typically been continued.

As an alternative to these repeated continuances, the Board should adjust the report's due date, to reflect a more effective timeframe for completing the report.
