CONTINUANCE OF THE EMERGENCY DECLARATION TO REPAIR DAMAGED ROADS AND FLOOD CONTROL FACILITIES JANUARY 2005 RAINSTORMS-EMERGENCY CONTRACTS

On January 25, 2005, your Board made a finding that an emergency situation existed that required immediate measures be undertaken to repair damages to County roads and flood control facilities throughout the County to restore access to residents and businesses and to minimize the risk of additional flood damage from future storms.

Although significant progress has been made, the following locations, on the original list of work to be completed through emergency contracting, cannot be simply replaced in-kind and still require a significant effort for design, permits, and right of way.

1. Hillside Drive near Summit Road (\$1.8 million)
2. Las Flores Canyon Road (\$3.7 million)
3. San Francisquito Canyon Road (\$6.6 million)
4. Schueren Road (\$3.6 million)

The damages to these roads have seriously impaired access for many residents and businesses throughout the County and must be repaired as soon as possible. The continuance of this Emergency Declaration will expedite the competitive process for solicitation of bids and also the repair of these critical roadways.

SUBJECT

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We recommend that your Board determine that there is still a need to continue this emergency action and that the Executive Officer continue to place this item on the agenda for Board review every 14 days or less in accordance with the Public Contract Code, Section 22050.
