On Sunday, November 13, 2005, at approximately 7:00 p.m. in the 3700 block of Second Avenue near Exposition Boulevard, 14-year old William Cox was shot in the upper torso and died at the scene. Edward Williams, also 14-years old, was critically wounded, but is in stable condition.

William Cox was not a gang member, and it was not immediately determined if the violence was gang related. When he didn't come home from a children's carnival in Jefferson Park, his mother went to look for him, and that is when she learned of the shooting.

According to Lt. John Pasquarillo, the shootings were preceded by some sort of angry confrontation outside the carnival. The gunman fired about five shots before fleeing on foot and disappearing in an unknown direction.

THEREFORE, I MOVE THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS offer a reward in the amount of \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the murder of William Cox and wounding of Edward Williams.
