At its meeting held February 21, 2006, the Board took the following action:

Supervisor Antonovich made the following statement:

“On Monday, February 13, 2006, Marcus Fennell Pierce, (aka Anthony Pierce and Kevin Erby) attempted to rape a 12-year-old girl but ended up brutally beating her by punching her in the face and head when she resisted. He then fled the location and is currently at large. Pierce has a lengthy violent criminal history which includes rape and assault with a deadly weapon. He is currently on parole for a narcotics charge.

“Sheriff’s Special Victim’s Bureau is seeking the public’s help with information that could aid in their investigation.”

Therefore, on motion of Supervisor Antonovich, seconded by Supervisor Knabe, unanimously carried (Supervisor Molina being absent), the Board established a \$10,000 reward for any information leading to the arrest and conviction of Marcus Fennell Pierce, also known as Anthony Pierce and Kevin Erby, who attempted to rape a 12-year-old girl but ended up brutally beating her by punching her in the face and head when she resisted, at approximately 5:40 p.m. on Monday, February 13, 2006, in the 1800 block of Anne's Circle in the Canyon Country area.

**NOTICE OF \$10,000 REWARD
OFFERED BY THE
LOS ANGELES COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles is offering a \$10,000 reward for any information leading to the arrest and conviction of Marcus Fennell Pierce, also known as Anthony Pierce and Kevin Erby, who attempted to rape a 12-year-old girl but ended up brutally beating her by punching her in the face and head when she resisted, at approximately 5:40 p.m. on Monday, February 13, 2006, in the 1800 block of Anne's Circle in the Canyon Country area.

Any person having any information related to this crime is requested to call Sergeant Brian Hudson or Detective Charles Ansberry at the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Special Victims Bureau at (562) 946-7901 and refer to Report No. 006-02602-0650-024.

The terms of the reward provide that:

- The information given that leads to the determination of the identity, the apprehension and conviction of any person or persons must be given no later than May 21, 2006. All reward claims must be in writing and shall be received no later than July 20, 2006.
- The total County payment of any and all rewards shall in no event exceed \$10,000 and no claim shall be paid prior to conviction unless the Board of Supervisors makes a finding of impossibility of conviction due to the death or incapacity of the person or persons responsible for the crime or crimes.
- The County reward may be apportioned between various persons and/or paid for the conviction of various persons as the circumstances fairly dictate.

Any claims for the reward funds should be filed no later than July 20, 2006 with the Executive Officer of the Board of Supervisors, 500 West Temple Street, Room 383 Kenneth Hahn Hall of Administration, Los Angeles, California 90012, Attention: Marcus Fennell Pierce Reward Fund.
