



1 RESOLUTION NO. 2006-75

2 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUNTINGTON PARK
3 ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE PERTAINING
4 TO CANDIDATES' STATEMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT A GENERAL
5 MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MARCH 6, 2007

6 RECITALS

7 **WHEREAS**, a General Municipal Election is to be held in the City of Huntington Park,
8 California on Tuesday, March 6, 2007; and

9 **WHEREAS**, Section 13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California provides that the
10 governing body of any local agency may adopt regulations pertaining to the preparation and form of
11 candidate statements for a municipal election, including costs of the candidate's statement.

12 **NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUNTINGTON**
13 **PARK DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

14
15 **SECTION 1: GENERAL PROVISIONS.** That pursuant to Section 13307 of the Elections
16 Code of the State of California, each candidate for elective office to be voted for at an Election to be
17 held in the City of Huntington Park on Tuesday, March 6, 2007, may prepare a candidate's statement
18 on an appropriate form provided by the Elections Official. The statement may include the name, age
19 and occupation of the candidate and a brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's
20 education and qualifications expressed by the candidate himself or herself. The statement shall not
21 include party affiliation of the candidate, nor membership or activity in partisan political
22 organizations. The statement shall be filed in typewritten form in the Office of the City Clerk at the
23 time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The statement may be withdrawn, but not changed,
24 during the period of filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the
25 close of the nomination period.

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1 **SECTION 2:** FOREIGN LANGUAGE POLICY.

- 2 a. Pursuant to State law, the candidate's statement must be translated and printed in
3 Spanish at the candidate's request.
- 4 b. Pursuant to the Voting Rights Act, the City is required to translate candidates'
5 statements into the following language in addition to English: Spanish.
- 6 c. The Elections Official shall:
- 7 1. Have all candidates' statements translated into the language specified in (b)
8 above.
- 9 2. Have all translations made available upon request in the office of the City Clerk.
- 10 3. Print Spanish translations of candidates who request printing and submit the
11 required deposit amount in the voters' pamphlet.

13 **SECTION 3:** PAYMENT.

- 14 1. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's
15 statement in English in the voter's pamphlet.
- 16 2. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's
17 statement in Spanish in the voter's pamphlet.

18 The Elections Official shall estimate the total cost of printing, handling, translating and mailing
19 the candidate's statement filed pursuant to this section, including costs incurred as a result of
20 complying with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 (as amended), and require each candidate filing a
21 statement to pay in advance to the local agency his or her estimated pro rate share as a condition of
22 having his or her statement included in the voters' pamphlet. In the event the estimated payment is
23 required, the estimate is just an approximation of the actual cost that varies from one election to
24 another election and may be significantly more or less than the estimate, depending on the actual
25 number of candidates filing statements. Accordingly, the Elections Official is not bound by the
26 estimate and may, on a pro rata basis, bill the candidate for additional actual expense or refund any
27 excess paid depending on the final actual cost. In the event of underpayment, the Elections Official
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1 shall require the candidate to pay the balance of the cost incurred. In the event of overpayment, the
2 Elections Official shall prorate the excess amount among the candidates and refund the excess amount
3 paid within 30 days of the election.

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5 **SECTION 4:** ADDITIONAL MATERIALS. No candidate will be permitted to include
6 additional materials in the sample ballot package.


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8 **SECTION 5:** The Elections Official shall provide each candidate or the candidate's
9 representative a copy of this Resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.

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11 **SECTION 6:** All previous resolutions adopting Council policy on payment for candidate's
12 statements are repealed.


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14 **SECTION 7:** That this Resolution shall apply only to the election to be held on March 6,

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUNTINGTON PARK
PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL RUNOFF ELECTION FOR ELECTIVE OFFICES IN THE
EVENT OF A TIE VOTE AT THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD
TUESDAY, MARCH 6, 2007**

RECITALS

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election is to be held in the City of Huntington Park, California on Tuesday, March 6, 2007; and

WHEREAS, Section 15651(b) of the Elections Code authorizes the City Council, by a majority vote, to adopt provisions to require the conduct of a Special Runoff Election to resolve a tie vote involving two or more candidates who receive an equal number of votes and the highest number of votes for an elective office.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUNTINGTON PARK DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:


SECTION 1: That pursuant to Section 15651(b) of the Elections Code of State of California, if any two or more persons receive an equal amount of votes, that are the highest number of votes for an elective office within the City, there shall be held within the City a Special Runoff Election to resolve the tie vote. A Special Runoff Election shall be called and held on a Tuesday neither less than 40 nor more than 125 days after the administrative or judicial certification of the election, which resulted in a tie vote.

SECTION 2: That this Resolution shall apply only to the election to be held on Tuesday, March 6, 2007 and shall then be automatically repealed.



4 **SECTION 2:** In the event it appears at a later time that it would be in the best interest of the
5 voters in the City of Huntington Park to conduct these elections concurrently, instead of by
6 consolidation, then only a verbal agreement between the two Elections Officials is required to do so. A
7 concurrent election is when each city conducts its own election separately, but using the same polling
8 places and sharing election workers. Voters will walk in, sign a Roster, and vote a City of Huntington
9 Park ballot, deposit it in the City of Huntington Park ballot box, and then sign a 2nd Roster, vote a City
10 of Los Angeles ballot and deposit in the City of Los Angeles ballot box. The voters will get a sample
11 ballot from each city, and will have to apply to each city for an absentee ballot from the respective
12 city.

14 **SECTION 3:** In the event that the General Municipal Election to be held in the City of
15 Huntington Park should be cancelled due to insufficient candidates, then the City of Los Angeles will
16 be responsible for the conduct of their election within the boundaries of the City of Huntington Park.

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18 **SECTION 4:** That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and
19 conducted as provided by the law for holding municipal elections.



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


